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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Introduction

The Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) is divided into six parts plus attachments and annexes, as follows:

2. Summary

This requirement is for JCB Fastrac OEM parts. The identified user of this RISO is the Department of National Defence, Canadian Forces Base (CFB) Trenton.

This Standing Offer is for a period of three (3) years.

Pursuant to section 01 of Standard Instructions 2006 and 2007, Offerors must submit a complete list of names of all individuals who are currently directors of the Offeror. Furthermore, as determined by the Special Investigations Directorate, Departmental Oversight Branch, each individual named on the list may be requested to complete a Consent to a Criminal Record Verification form.

The requirement is subject to the provisions of the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT) and the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA).

3. Debriefings

After issuance of a standing offer, offerors may request a debriefing on the results of the request for standing offers process. Offerors should make the request to the Standing Offer Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the request for standing offers process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

PART 2 - OFFEROR INSTRUCTIONS

1. Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) by number, date and title are set out in the *Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual* (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Offerors who submit an offer agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the RFSO and accept the clauses and conditions of the Standing Offer and resulting contract(s).

The 2006 (2012-07-11) Standard Instructions - Request for Standing Offers - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the RFSO.

The Offeror must diligently maintain the list up-to-date by informing Canada in writing of any change occurring during the validity period of the Offer, and must also provide Canada, when requested, with the corresponding Consent Forms. The Offeror will also be required to diligently maintain the list and when requested, provide Consent Forms during the period of any standing offer arising from this Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) and any call-ups made against the Standing Offer.

2. Submission of Offers

Offers must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the Request for Standing Offers.

2.1 Basis of Selection

An offer must comply with the requirements of the Request for Standing Offers and meet all mandatory technical evaluation criteria to be declared responsive. The responsive offer with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for issuance of a standing offer.

3. Enquiries - Request for Standing Offers

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Standing Offer Authority no later than ten (10) calendar days before the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Offerors should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the RFSO to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by offerors to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the questions or may request that offerors do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered with copies to all offerors. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all offerors may not be answered by Canada.

4. Applicable Laws

The Standing Offer and any contract resulting from the Standing Offer must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Offerors may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their offer, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the offerors.

PART 3 - OFFER PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

1. Offer Preparation Instructions

Canada requests that bidders provide their bid in separately bound sections as follows:

Prices must appear in the financial offer only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the offer.

Canada requests that offerors follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their offer.

- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to that of the Request for Standing Offers.

PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

1. Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Offers will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the Request for Standing Offers including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the offers.

1.1 Technical Evaluation

1.1.1 Mandatory Technical Criteria

Each offer received will be examined to determine that it meets the Requirement as listed under Annex "A". Offers which fail to meet any of the Requirements will be considered non-responsive and will be given no further consideration. The offers that meet the Requirement will proceed to the Financial Evaluation.

- A) Bidders must provide pricing for all items as listed in Annex "A", Requirement and Basis of Payment.

B) Offers must be submitted on the Basis of Payment form located in Annex "A". A price (or percentage when applicable) must be provided for every item and pricing period in the Basis of Payment. Pricing must be firm in Canadian currency and must not be indexed or tied to an escalation factor.

C) Offers must not contain any alteration to the preprinted or pre-typed sections of the Basis of Payment form, or any condition or qualification placed upon the offer.

1.2 Financial Evaluation

The price of the bid will be evaluated in Canadian dollars, the Harmonized Sales Tax excluded, Delivered Duty Paid (DDP) Incoterms 2000, CFB Trenton, Canadian customs duties and excise taxes included.

The Estimated Annual Usage (see Annex A) is provided for evaluation purposes only and does not represent a commitment to purchase these estimated quantities. Payment will be based on actual usage.

The price of the bid will be calculated as follows:

I. The extended price will be the firm unit price for each year identified in Annex "A", Requirement and Basis of Payment, Pricing Basis A, multiplied by the estimated annual usage for each item. The sum of the extended price for each of the years will equal the total extended price for all years.

II. The discounted extended price of other items in Annex A, Requirement and Basis of Payment, Pricing Basis B, will be calculated by multiplying the estimated expenditure before discount (\$15,000) by the discount offered by the Offeror, and subtracting the result from the estimated expenditure to arrive at the discounted extended price.

III. The evaluated price of the bid will be calculated by adding the total extended price for all years under Pricing Basis A plus the discounted extended price under Pricing Basis B.

2. Basis of Selection

2.1 An offer must comply with the requirements of the Request for Standing Offers to be declared responsive. The responsive offer with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for issuance of a standing offer.

PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS

Offerors must provide the required certifications to be issued a standing offer. Canada will declare an offer non-responsive if the required certifications are not completed and submitted as requested.

Compliance with the certifications offerors provide to Canada is subject to verification by Canada during the offer evaluation period (before issuance of a standing offer) and after issuance of a standing offer. The Standing Offer Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify offerors' compliance with the certifications before issuance of a standing offer. The offer will be declared non-responsive if any certification made by the Offeror is untrue, whether made knowingly or unknowingly. Failure to comply with the certifications or to comply with the request of the Standing Offer Authority for additional information will also render the offer non-responsive.

1.1 Offerors should provide, with their offer or promptly thereafter, a complete list of names of all individuals who are currently directors of the Offeror. 2. Certifications Precedent to Issuance of a Standing Offer

The certifications listed below should be completed and submitted with the offer, but may be submitted afterwards. Failure to comply with the request of the Standing Offer Authority and meet the requirement within that time period will render the offer non-responsive.

2.1 Federal Contractors Program - Certification

Suppliers who are subject to the Federal Contractors Program (FCP) and have been declared ineligible contractors by Human Resources and Skills Development Canada (HRSDC) are no longer eligible to receive federal government contracts over the threshold for solicitation of bids as set out in the Government Contracts Regulations. Suppliers may be declared ineligible contractors either as a result of a finding of non-compliance by HRSDC, or following their voluntary withdrawal from the FCP for a reason other than a reduction of their workforce to less than 100 employees. Any offers from ineligible contractors, including an offer from a joint venture that has a member who is an ineligible contractor, will be declared non-responsive.
