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## **PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION**

### **1. Security Requirement**

There is no security requirement associated with this requirement.

### **2. Requirement**

Canada is seeking proposals to procure:

- 2.1 Two (2) **DUMP TRAILER, END, 30 CUBIC YARD, CONFIGURATION A** and related items as described in Annex "A" - Pricing and in accordance with Annex "C" - Purchase Description Dump Trailers dated 01 March 2012; and

One (1) **DUMP TRAILER, CROSS GATE BELLY, 26 CUBIC YARD, CONFIGURATION B** and related items as described in Annex "B" - Pricing and in accordance with Annex "C" - Purchase Description Dump Trailers dated 01 March 2012.

- 2.2 Irrevocable options identified in Annex "A" and Annex "B" - Pricing.

2.2.1 The options may only be exercised by the Contracting Authority and will be evidenced, for administrative purposes only, through a contract amendment.

2.2.2 The options may be exercised in whole or in part and on more than one occasion at the sole discretion of Canada, up to the maximum quantity identified in Annex "A" and Annex "B" - Pricing.

2.2.3 The options may be exercised within **twelve (12) months** after contract award.

### **3. Debriefings**

After contract award, bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days of receipt of notification that their bid was unsuccessful. The debriefing may be provided in writing, by telephone or in person.

### **4. Interpretation**

The mandatory requirements stated in this Request for Proposal use the words "shall" or "must" or "mandatory". Proposals not meeting all of the mandatory requirements will be given no further consideration.

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## PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

### 1. Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions (<http://ccua-sacc.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/pub/acho-eng.jsp>) Manual issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The **2003 (2012-07-11) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements**, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

The text under Subsection 4 of Section 01 - Code of Conduct and Certifications - Bid of 2003 referenced above is replaced by:

Bidders should provide, with their bid or promptly thereafter, a complete list of names of all individuals who are currently directors of the Bidder. If such a list has not been received by the time the evaluation of bids is completed, Canada will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to provide such a list within the required time frame will render the bid non-responsive. Bidders must always submit the list of directors before contract award.

Canada may, at any time, request that a Bidder provide properly completed and Signed Consent Forms (Consent to a Criminal Record Verification form - PWGSC-TPSGC 229) (<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/app-acq/forms/formulaire-forms-eng.html>) for any or all individuals named in the aforementioned list within a specified delay. Failure to provide such Consent Forms within the delay will result in the bid being declared non-responsive.

The text under Subsection 5 of Section 01 - Code of Conduct and Certifications - Bid of 2003 referenced above is replaced by:

The Bidder must diligently maintain the list up-to-date by informing Canada in writing of any change occurring during the validity period of the bid, and must also provide Canada, when requested, with the corresponding Consent Forms. The Bidder will also be required to diligently maintain the list and when requested, provide Consent Forms during the period of any contract arising from this bid solicitation.

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Subsection **5.4 of 2003, Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements**, is amended as follows:

**Delete:** sixty (60) days

**Insert:** ninety (90) days

## **2. Submission of Bids**

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

## **3. Enquiries - Bid Solicitation**

All enquiries must be submitted to the Contracting Authority no later than **seven (7) calendar days** before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a "proprietary" nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as proprietary will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the questions or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered with copies to all bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all bidders may not be answered by Canada.

## **4. Applicable Laws**

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in *Ontario*.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the bidders.

## **5. Improvement of Requirement During Solicitation Period**

Should bidders consider that the specifications, Statement of Work or Purchase Description contained in the bid solicitation could be improved technically or technologically, bidders are invited to make suggestions, in writing, to the Contracting Authority named in the bid solicitation. Bidders must clearly outline the suggested improvement as well as the reason for the

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suggestion. Suggestions that do not restrict the level of competition nor favour a particular bidder will be given consideration provided they are submitted to the Contracting Authority at least **seven (7) days** before the bid closing date. Canada will have the right to accept or reject any or all suggestions.

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## **PART 3 - BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS**

### **1. Bid Preparation Instructions**

Canada requests that bidders provide their bid in separately bound sections as follows:

Section I: Technical Bid (2 hard copies);

Section II: Financial Bid (1 hard copy);

Section III: Certifications and Additional Information (2 hard copies).

Canada requests that bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their bid:

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation;

In April 2006, Canada issued a policy directing federal departments and agencies to take the necessary steps to incorporate environmental considerations into the procurement process Policy on Green Procurement

(<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html>). To assist Canada in reaching its objectives, bidders are encouraged to:

- 1) use paper containing fibre certified as originating from a sustainably-managed forest and/or containing minimum 30% recycled content; and
- 2) use an environmentally-preferable format including black and white printing instead of colour printing, printing double sided/duplex, using staples or clips instead of cerlox, duotangs or binders.

### **2. Section I: Technical Bid**

In their technical bid, bidders should explain and demonstrate how they propose to meet the requirements and how they will carry out the Work.

Bidders must complete and submit by the bid closing date and time the following;

- 1) Appendix "1" - Technical Information Questionnaire dated 01 March 2012.



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## 2.1 Substitutes and Alternatives

Bidders may propose substitutes and alternatives where "**shall<sup>(E)</sup>**" is indicated in the technical requirement description (Purchase Description/Statement of Requirement/Statement of Work).

2.1.1 Substitutes and alternatives that are equivalent in form, fit, function and performance will be considered for acceptance by the Technical Authority where the Bidder:

- (a) Clearly identifies a substitute and/or an alternative;
- (b) Designates the brand name, model and/or part number of the substitute and/or of the product, where applicable;
- (c) States that the substitute product is fully interchangeable with the item specified in the technical requirement description;
- (d) Provides complete specifications and brochures, where applicable;
- (e) Provides compliance statements that include technical details showing the substitute and/or the alternative meet all technical requirements specified in the technical requirement description; and
- (f) Clearly identifies those areas in the technical requirement description and in the brochures that support the substitute and/or the alternative compliance with the technical requirements.

2.1.2 Substitutes and alternatives offered as equivalent in form, fit, function and performance will not be considered for acceptance by the Technical Authority if:

- (a) The bid fails to provide all of the information requested to allow the Technical Authority to fully evaluate the evaluate the equivalency; or
- (b) The substitute and/or the alternative fail to meet or fail to exceed the technical requirements specified in the technical requirement description.

2.1.3 In conducting the evaluation of bids, Canada may, but will have no obligation to request the bidder offering a substitute and/or an alternative, to provide a copy of the alternative standard and to demonstrate, at the bidder's sole cost, that it is equivalent to the technical requirement.

### 3. Section II: Financial Bid

Bidders must submit their prices in Annex “A” and Annex “B” - Pricing in accordance with the Basis of Payment described in **Part 6 - RESULTING CONTRACT CLAUSES**, at **Clause 6.1 Basis of Payment**.

Bidders must submit firm prices for one **or** multiple groups of items. However, bidders must submit firm prices for all items, except for optional extended warranty, listed in the group(s) of items for which they submit prices. The groups of Items are as follows:

Group A (End Dump Trailer): All items listed in Annex “A”.

Group B (Cross Gate Belly Dump Trailer): All items listed in Annex “B”.

#### 3.1 Exchange Rate Fluctuation

3.1.1 Unless otherwise specified in the bid solicitation, **bids must be in Canadian currency.**

3.1.2 Bidders may request Canada to assume the risk for exchange rate fluctuation. This request must be specifically made at time of bidding.

3.1.3 The foreign currency component is defined as the element of the price that will be directly affected by exchange rate fluctuations. It could include the net price FOB foreign manufacturer's plant, costs associated with applicable duty, excise tax, Goods and Services Tax or Harmonized Sales Tax, if applicable, entry fees, transportation costs or delivery charges payable in a foreign currency, and any other charges associated with being the importer of record if they originated from and are required to be paid in a foreign currency.

3.1.4 The foreign value of the foreign currency component of the bid or negotiated price must be provided before contract award. Form PWGSC-TPSGC 9411, Claim for Exchange Rate Adjustments, may be used for this purpose. If milestone payments are proposed, it is recommended to indicate on the above form the foreign currency component associated with each milestone event.

3.1.5 All bids are evaluated in Canadian currency. Therefore, for evaluation purposes, the noon rate quoted by the Bank of Canada as being in effect on date of bid closing, or such other date as may be specified in the bid solicitation, will be applied as the initial conversion factor for the specified currency. (Column 3 of the above form will be completed by the Contracting Authority.)

**3.1.6 Rates proposed by bidders will not be accepted for the purposes of this exchange rate adjustment provision.**

3.1.7 If there are two (2) identical bids, and provided that the bid selected would still be considered the most advantageous to Canada, preference will be given to the Bidder who assumes all or part of the exchange rate adjustment risk over a bidder who does not assume any of this risk. Furthermore, preference will be given to the Bidder who assumes all of the exchange rate adjustment risk over a bidder who assumes only part of this risk.

3.1.8 Canada will pay the exchange rate adjustment amount in Canadian currency using the prevailing noon rate on the date of payment by Canada or, as applicable, in accordance with clause C3015C.

**4. Section III: Certifications and Additional Information**

Bidders must submit the certifications required under **PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS**.

**4.1 Additional Information**

Canada requests that bidders submit the following information:

**4.1.1 Delivery**

**4.1.1.1 Firm Quantity**

While delivery of the trailers is requested by 15 February 2013, the best delivery that can be offered is as follows:

Item 001 – Qty 2, **DUMP TRAILER, END, 30 CUBIC YARD, CONFIGURATION A** and related items will be delivered within \_\_\_\_\_ calendar days from the effective date of the contract; and/or

Item 005 – Qty 1, **DUMP TRAILER, CROSS GATE BELLY, 26 CUBIC YARD, CONFIGURATION B** and related items will be delivered within \_\_\_\_\_ calendar days from the effective date of the contract.

#### 4.1.1.2 Optional Quantity

If an option is exercised, the best delivery that can be offered is as follows:

Item 002 – Up to 2, **DUMP TRAILER, END, 30 CUBIC YARD, CONFIGURATION A** and related items will be delivered within \_\_\_\_\_ calendar days after an option is exercised; and/or

Item 006 – Up to 2, **DUMP TRAILER, CROSS GATE BELLY, 26 CUBIC YARD, CONFIGURATION B** and related items will be delivered within \_\_\_\_\_ calendar days after an option is exercised.

#### 4.1.2 Manufacturer's Standard Warranty Period

Canada requests that the Bidder provide details of the manufacturer's standard warranty period for the trailer/equipment and its component that exceeds the minimum warranty period of **twelve (12) months**.

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## PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

### 1. Evaluation Procedures

- 1.1 Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- 1.2 An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

### 2. Technical Evaluation

- 2.1 The purpose of the technical evaluation is to determine if the goods and/or services offered meet all mandatory technical requirements outlined in the documents enumerated hereafter and as required in **Section I - Technical Bid of Part 3 -BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS:**

- Annex “C” - Purchase Description - Dump Trailers dated 01 March 2012; and
- Appendix 1 - Technical Information Questionnaire dated 01 March 2012.

### 3. Financial Evaluation

- 3.1 The purpose of the financial evaluation is to determine the aggregate price, per group, based on the information submitted in Annex “A” and Annex “B” - Pricing.
- 3.2 Aggregate Price Calculation

Bids will be evaluated on an aggregate price, per group, basis for the firm quantity and the optional quantity.
- 3.3 Any **Extended Warranty Period** offered will not be included in the financial evaluation and further negotiations may be required.

### 4. Basis of Selection

- 4.1 A bid must comply with the requirements of the bid solicitation and meet all mandatory requirements to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated aggregate price, per group, will be recommended for award of a contract.

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## PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS

Bidders must provide the required certifications to be awarded a contract. Canada will declare a bid non-responsive if the required certifications are not completed and submitted as requested.

Compliance with the certifications bidders provide to Canada is subject to verification by Canada during the bid evaluation period (before award of a contract) and after award of a contract. The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify bidders' compliance with the certifications before award of a contract. The bid will be declared non-responsive if any certification made by the Bidder is untrue, whether made knowingly or unknowingly. Failure to comply with the certifications or to comply with the request of the Contracting Authority for additional information will also render the bid non-responsive.

### 1. Code of Conduct Certifications - Certifications Required Precedent to Contract Award

- 1.1 Bidders should provide, with their bids or promptly thereafter, a complete list of names of all individuals who are currently directors of the Bidder. If such a list has not been received by the time the evaluation of bids is completed, the Contracting Authority will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Bidders must submit the list of directors before contract award, failure to provide such a list within the required time frame will render the bid non-responsive.

The Contracting Authority may, at any time, request that a Bidder provide properly completed and Signed Consent Forms (Consent to a Criminal Record Verification form - PWGSC-TPSGC 229)

(<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/app-acq/forms/formulaire-forms-eng.html>) for any or all individuals named in the aforementioned list within a specified delay. Failure to provide such Consent Forms within the delay will result in the bid being declared non-responsive.

### 2. Certifications Precedent to Contract Award

The certifications listed below should be submitted with the bid, but may be completed and submitted afterwards. If any of these required certifications is not completed or submitted as requested, the Contracting Authority will so inform the Bidder and provide the Bidder with a time frame within which to meet the requirement. Failure to comply with the request of the Contracting Authority and meet the requirement within that time period will render the bid non-responsive.

## 2.1 Federal Contractors Program - \$200,000 or more

1. The Federal Contractors Program (FCP) requires that some suppliers, including a supplier who is a member of a joint venture, bidding for federal government contracts, valued at \$200,000 or more (including all applicable taxes), make a formal commitment to implement employment equity. This is a condition precedent to contract award. If the Bidder, or, if the Bidder is a joint venture and if any member of the joint venture, is subject to the FCP, evidence of its commitment must be provided before the award of the Contract.

Suppliers who have been declared ineligible contractors by Human Resources and Skills Development Canada (HRSDC) are no longer eligible to receive government contracts over the threshold for solicitation of bids as set out in the Government Contracts Regulations. Suppliers may be declared ineligible contractors either as a result of a finding of non-compliance by HRSDC, or following their voluntary withdrawal from the FCP for a reason other than the reduction of their workforce to less than 100 employees. Any bids from ineligible contractors, including a bid from a joint venture that has a member who is an ineligible contractor, will be declared non-responsive.

2. If the Bidder does not fall within the exceptions enumerated in 3.(a) or (b) below, or does not have a valid certificate number confirming its adherence to the FCP, the Bidder must fax (819-953-8768) a copy of the signed form LAB 1168, Certificate of Commitment to Implement Employment Equity, to the Labour Branch of HRSDC.
3. The Bidder, or, if the Bidder is a joint venture the member of the joint venture, certifies its status with the FCP, as follows:

The Bidder or the member of the joint venture

- (a) ( ) is not subject to the FCP, having a workforce of less than 100 full-time or part-time permanent employees, and/or temporary employees having worked 12 weeks or more in Canada;
- (b) ( ) is not subject to the FCP, being a regulated employer under the Employment Equity Act, S.C. 1995, c. 44;
- (c) ( ) is subject to the requirements of the FCP, having a workforce of 100 or more full-time or part-time permanent employees, and/or temporary employees having worked 12 weeks or more in Canada, but has not previously obtained a certificate number from HRSDC (having not bid

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on requirements of \$200,000 or more), in which case a duly signed certificate of commitment is attached;

- (d) ( ) is subject to the FCP, and has a valid certificate number as follows:

### 1. Security Requirement

There is no security requirement associated with this requirement.

### 2. Requirement

- 2.1 The Contractor must deliver two (2) **DUMP TRAILER, END, 30 CUBIC YARD, CONFIGURATION A** and related items as described in Annex "A" - Pricing and Annex "C" Purchase Description Dump Trailers dated 01 March 2012; and/or

The Contractor must deliver one (1) **DUMP TRAILER, CROSS GATE BELLY, 26 CUBIC YARD, CONFIGURATION B** and related items as described in Annex "B" - Pricing and Annex "C" Purchase Description Dump Trailers dated 01 March 2012.

- 2.2 The Contractor grants to Canada irrevocable options identified in Annex "A"- Pricing and/or Annex "B" - Pricing:

2.2.1 The options may only be exercised by the Contracting Authority and will be evidenced, for administrative purposes only, through a contract amendment.

2.2.2 The options may be exercised in whole or in part and on more than one occasion at the sole discretion of Canada, up to the maximum quantity identified in Annex "A" - Pricing and/or Annex "B" Pricing.

2.2.3 The options may be exercised within **twelve (12) months** after contract award.

- 2.3 Optional Extended Warranty Period (**if applicable**)

The Contractor grants to Canada the irrevocable option to extend the warranty period for an additional (to be inserted by PWGSC at time of contract award) months, under the same terms and conditions and at the price stated in the Contract at Annex "A" - Pricing and/or Annex "B" - Pricing. The option may only be exercised by the Contracting Authority and will be evidenced, for administrative purposes only, through a contract amendment.

The Contracting Authority may exercise the option within ninety (90) calendar days after contract award and/or the exercising of an option by sending a written notice to the Contractor.

### 3. Standard Clauses and Conditions

All clauses and conditions identified in the Contract by number, date and title are set out in the Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual (<http://sacc.pwgsc.gc.ca/sacc/index-e.jsp>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

#### 3.1 General Conditions

**2010A (2012-07-16) General Conditions - Goods (Medium Complexity)**, apply to and form part of the contract.

The text under Subsection 4 of Section 29 - Code of Conduct and Certifications - Contract of 2010A (2012-07-16) referenced above is replaced by:

During the entire period of the Contract, the Contractor must diligently update, by written notice to the Contracting Authority, the list of names of all individuals who are directors of the Contractor whenever there is a change. As well, whenever requested by Canada, the Contractor must provide the corresponding Consent Forms.

Section 09 entitled Warranty of general conditions 2010A is amended by deleting subsection 2 in its entirety and replacing it with the following:

The Contractor must pay the transportation cost associated with returning the Work or any part of the Work to the Contractor's plant for replacement, repair or making good. The Contractor must also pay the transportation cost associated with forwarding the replacement or returning the Work or part of the Work when rectified to the delivery point specified in the Contract or to another location as directed by Canada. If, in the opinion of Canada, it is not expedient to remove the Work from its location, the Contractor must carry out any necessary repair or making good of the Work at that location. In such cases, the Contractor will be responsible for all Costs (including travel and living expenses) incurred in so doing, Canada will not reimburse these Costs.

If action to effect repairs under warranty cannot be initiated within **two (2)** working days and completed within a reasonable length of time or if the Contractor has no repair facilities in the immediate vicinity (**within 100 kilometres**) of the specified delivery destinations (consignees), the Department of National Defence reserves the right to make such repairs and be reimbursed by the Contractor at the rate of **\$103.91** per hour for labour and the cost for replaced parts."

All other provisions of the warranty section remain in effect.

## 12. Inspection and Acceptance

The Technical Authority is the Inspection Authority. All reports, deliverable items, documents, goods and all services rendered under the Contract are subject to inspection by the Inspection Authority or representative. Should any report, document, good or service not be in accordance

with the requirements of the Statement of Work and to the satisfaction of the Inspection Authority, as submitted, the Inspection Authority will have the right to reject it or require its correction at the sole expense of the Contractor before recommending payment.

### **13. Preparation for Delivery**

1.1 Scope - This document describes the requirement for the following:

Configuration A: 22.9 cubic metres (30 cubic yard) end dump trailer; and

Configuration B: 19.9 cubic metres (26 cubic yard) cross gate belly dump trailer.

1.2 Instructions - The following instructions shall be applied to this Purchase Description:

- (a) Requirements, which are identified by the word "shall", are mandatory. Deviations will not be permitted;
- (b) Requirements identified by "shall<sup>(E)</sup>", are mandatory. However, the Technical Authority will consider alternatives for acceptance as a Technical Authority Approved Equivalent. "Technical Authority Approved Equivalent" is defined as an alternative standard, design, feature, or component that is evaluated by the Technical Authority and determined to meet the specified requirements for equivalent standard, form, fit, function and performance as applicable;
- (c) Requirements identified with a "will" define actions to be performed by the Crown and require no action/obligation on the Contractor's part;
- (d) Where "shall", "shall<sup>(E)</sup>", or "will" are not used, the information provided is for guidance only;
- (e) In this document "provided" shall mean, "provided and installed";

### **3. REQUIREMENTS**

#### **3.1 Standard Design - The Trailer shall:**

- (a) Be the manufacturer's latest model having demonstrated industry acceptability by having been manufactured and sold commercially for at least 2 years, or, shall be manufactured by a company that has at least 5 years experience in design and manufacturing of a comparable type of equipment of equivalent or greater complexity;
- (b) Have engineering certification available, upon demand, for this application from the original manufacturers of major equipment systems and assemblies;
- (c) Conform to all applicable laws, regulations and industrial standards governing manufacture, safety, noise levels and pollution in effect in Canada at the time of manufacture; and
- (d) Have system and component capacities not greater than their published ratings (i.e. product or component brochures).

#### **3.2 Operating Conditions**

**3.2.1 Weather** - The Trailer shall operate in temperatures ranging from -40 to 37° C (40 to 99° F).

**3.2.2 Terrain** - The Trailer shall be capable of being operated on highways, secondary roads, gravel roads, and off-road (e.g. construction sites, open fields and dirt tracks).

#### **3.3 Safety Standards**

**3.3.1 Safety Regulations** - The Trailer shall meet the provisions of the Canada Motor Vehicle Safety Act in effect on the date of manufacture of the Trailer. The Trailer shall carry the National Safety Mark.

**3.3.2 Human Engineering and Safety** - The Trailer, all systems and components shall:

- (a) Be safe and easy to use by a 95<sup>th</sup> percentile male or 5<sup>th</sup> percentile female under all operating conditions;
- (b) Have all entry and exit points equipped with handles and steps suitably positioned, to accommodate a 95<sup>th</sup> percentile male or a 5<sup>th</sup> percentile female under all operating conditions; and
- (c) Be equipped, where required for operator safety, with safety features such as warning and instruction plates, non-slip walking surfaces and heat shields.

**3.4 Performance Criteria** - The Trailer with all specified equipment installed shall:

- (a) Have a maximum forward speed of at least 90 km/h (56 mph), fully loaded; and
- (b) Be road legal.

**3.5 Chassis** - The Trailer chassis shall be the manufacturer's standard type appropriate to support the required water tank capacity, for the specified Trailer performance within the stated operating conditions, where:

- (a) Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (GVWR) - The GVWR of the trailer shall be at least equal to the curb weight of the completed trailer with the fully loaded trailer, as published in the manufacturer's literature and engineering data; and
- (b) Gross Axle Weight Rating (GAWR) - The GAWR for each axle shall be sufficient to support the total load imposed on the axle when the trailer is fully loaded.

**3.6 Configuration A - END DUMP SEMI-TRAILER** - An end dump semi-trailer shall be provided. The trailer shall have the following minimum requirements:

- (a) Struck capacity, water level - 22.9 cubic metres (30 cubic yard); and
- (b) Rated net payload - 27,216 kg (60,000 lbs).

**3.6.1 Trailer Dimensions** - The trailer shall<sup>(E)</sup> have the following nominal dimensions:

- (a) Overall Length - 9.7 metres (32 feet) nominal;
- (b) Sides - 122 cm (48 inches); and
- (c) Tailgate Height - 137 cm (54 inches).

**3.6.2 Trailer Construction** - The trailer shall<sup>(E)</sup> be constructed as follows:

- (a) U shaped, unibody construction with breakformed side panel for added rigidity;
- (b) Two reinforced belts, 6 inches wide, located in mid section and front of dump box;
- (c) Sides, floor, front panel and tailgate - Made of 47 mm (3/16 inch) abrasion resistant material, AR 450 high tensile steel and 100,000 psi yield strength;
- (d) 30 cm (12 inches) high boxed type longmembers for maximum floor support;
- (e) 193 cm (76 inches) wide floor section to allow material to be unloaded with excavator ditch bucket;
- (f) Main stabilizer totally free from supporting any weight and protected between longmembers;
- (g) Two heavy duty rubber springs installed at front of body for a smooth ride;
- (h) Free hanging stabilizer protected from loading impacts;
- (i) Front Telescopic Hoist - 5 sections, 90,000 lbs (45 tons) capacity;
- (j) Tailgate system - Fully adjustable tailgate latch system operated with 20 cm (8 inches) ram air cylinder and spreader chains;



- (k) Front and rear mounted ladders;
- (l) Replaceable metal alloy bushings for minimum lubrication;
- (m) Two speed Landing gear, equipped with sand shoes and a curb side crank;
- (n) Tarpaulin with manual roll-up system; and
- (o) Quick attach material apron.

**3.7 Configuration B - CROSS GATE BELLY DUMP TRAILER** - The trailer shall have the following minimum requirements:

- (a) Struck capacity, water level - 19.9 cubic metres (26 cubic yard); and
- (b) Rated net payload - 27,216 kg (60,000 lbs).

**3.7.1 Trailer Dimensions** - The trailer shall<sup>(E)</sup> have the following nominal dimensions:

**3.7.2 Trailer Construction** - The trailer shall<sup>(E)</sup> be constructed as follows:

- (a) Body of all welded fabrication, utilizing high tensile steel having a minimum yield point of 50,000 psi for all plated and reinforcing;
- (b) Top rail - 47 mm (3/16 inch) AR 450 steel with continual arch;
- (c) Main rail - 47 mm (3/16 inch) AR 450 steel;
- (d) Hopper sheets - Abrasion resistant hopper sheeting, 10 Gauge AR 450;
- (e) Telescopic Legs - Multi position telescopic legs;
- (f) Gates - Large gate opening to minimize material hang up. Adjustable gate stops for controlled spread. Have replaceable pivot bearings, multiple positions gate limiter, and chain stop holes provided in gate ends;
- (g) Gate Cylinders - 20 cm (8 inches) diameter air operated one on each end of gate with chromed tube and rod, and quick release valves on each air line at air cylinders;
- (h) Mechanical method to block open gates to prevent injury;
- (i) Gate Air Supply - Certified steel, rubber mounted with easy access air drain - with air/water separator and oiler - for uninterrupted use of gates without jeopardizing trailer operation;

- (j) Gate Controls - 12 volt Solenoid operated include air operated hand valve; and
- (k) Tarp - Cable mesh tarp of durable material with manual roll-up system.

3.8 **Miscellaneous Equipment** - The trailer **shall** be equipped with:

- (a) Systems and components properly located and/or protected from road hazards such as water, mud and gravel;
- (b) A 51-mm (2-inch) kingpin, compatible with 48-inches fifth wheel. If removable kingpin(s) are provided they **shall**<sup>(E)</sup> be equipped with a lifting handle to facilitate handling;
- (c) Heavy duty rock shield in front of suspension;
- (d) Integrated front and rear fenders with mud flaps;
- (e) Towing/Tie-down Points - Two rear towing points positioned and of sufficient strength to permit the loaded trailer being recovered;
- (f) Railway tie-down points positioned and of sufficient strength to permit the securing and transportation of the loaded trailer on a railroad car;
- (g) A licence plate holder on the rear of the trailer;
- (h) Registration holder; and
- (i) A spare tire carrier with tire.

3.9 **Brakes** The trailer **shall** be equipped with an air brake system. The brake system **shall**<sup>(E)</sup> be equipped as follows:

- (a) An anti-lock braking system (ABS);
- (b) S-Cam type air brakes;
- (c) All trailer axles equipped with long stroke, spring actuated brake chambers;
- (d) Automatic slack adjusters;
- (e) Brake housing dust shields;
- (f) Air tanks equipped with remote cable operated drain valves and heated moisture expelling valve;
- (g) Colour coded visual brake stroke indicators. The indicators **shall**<sup>(TA)</sup> be Safe-T-Brake; and
- (h) Colour coded glad hand couplers with dummy glad hand couplers equipped with a safety chain provided for each glad hand.

3.10 **Axles** Tridem axle, equipped with dual tires **shall** be provided. The axle capacity **shall** be at least 11,340-kg (25,000-lbs) each.

3.11 **Suspension** The suspension capacity **shall** be at least 11,340-kg (25,000-lbs) each. The suspension **shall**<sup>(E)</sup> be equipped with the following:

- (a) Automatic height control valve;
- (b) Manual suspension air dump valve;
- (c) Shock absorbers on all axles;
- (d) An air gauge to assist the operator in evenly distributing the load between the trailer and the tractor adapter; and
- (e) Suspension travel limiters. These are devices that prevent suspension over-travel while slinging or lifting the trailer for decking or sea transport. The devices shall<sup>(E)</sup> be cables or chains fastened to the suspension beam or axle and the under frame at a length approximately equal to or less than the shock absorber extended stroke. The use of shock absorbers as travel limiters is not acceptable.

**3.12 Tires and Wheels** The tires and wheels shall:

- (a) Have Tire manufacturer certification that tires and rims provided are suitable and adequately sized for this application. Tire size and ply ratings shall<sup>(E)</sup> comply with Tire and Rim Association Standards;
- (b) Have sufficient tire load capacity so the trailer loaded to rated capacity and equipped with all options does not exceed the full speed capacity of the tires. Tire pressures shall be marked near the tire location; and
- (c) A hubodometer reading in kilometres.

**3.13 Controls** - Controls shall be the manufacturer's standard and be permanently marked to identify and show the function of each control lever or switch.

**3.14 Instruments** - Instruments shall be the manufacturer's standard. The instruments shall<sup>(E)</sup> includes:

- (a) An odometer, which displays accumulated distance travelled by the trailer.

**3.15 Lighting** The trailer lighting shall be the manufacturer's standard conforming to Canadian Motor Vehicle Safety Standards (CMVSS), incorporating LED's, as commercially available.

- (c) **Protected Wiring** - The wiring shall be protected by design and positioning to prevent damage and contact with spilled hydrocarbon fuels. This shall meet the minimum requirements of NFPA 407 (paragraph referring to Vehicle Lighting and Electrical Equipment). This shall include as a minimum electrical wiring used for the connection to the tractor vehicle designed for heavy-duty use, with positive engaging connectors, which are mounted securely to the trailer; and
- (d) Coloured wiring schematics for the 12-volt LED wiring system.

**3.16 Electrical System** - The electrical system shall be the manufacturer's standard.

- (a) Wiring shall:

- i. Be adequately sized for the maximum loads of the respective circuits;
  - ii. Be full-length from component to component without any splicing;
  - iii. Be protected by grommets, where passing through metal; and
- (b) The trailer shall be equipped with:
- i. An ABS receptacle; and
  - ii. Glad hands. The glad hands shall<sup>(E)</sup> be below the centreline of the front head.

**3.17 Hydraulic System** - As applicable, hydraulic system shall be complete with all required components for the operation of the installed hydraulic equipment and shall include pump, motors, actuator, cylinders, and reservoir, filters and control valves. The reservoir, as applicable, shall<sup>(E)</sup> be labelled with approved hydraulic fluid and reservoir capacity. The trailer shall have wet kit connection mounted on the centreline of the front head.

**3.18 Lubricants** - The Trailer shall be delivered with the manufacturer's standard lubricants and fluids, as required. The lubricants and fluids shall be consistent with the delivery location and season. The Trailer systems shall<sup>(E)</sup> not require the use of manufacturer's special lubricants and fluids following the break-in period.

### **3.19 Paint and Markings**

**3.19.1 Paint** The following applies:

- (a) Stainless steel components shall not be painted;
- (b) All mild steel components shall be painted black;
- (c) All paint shall be applied in accordance with the technical data provided by the product manufacturer. As a minimum, the coating process must yield a durable finish with a smooth appearance free of runs, sags, and orange peel;
- (d) The trailer shall<sup>(E)</sup> be marked with a conspicuity treatment, conforming to Canadian Motor Vehicle Safety Standards (CMVSS); and
- (e) Trailer shall be painted Grey.

### **3.19.2 Corrosion Protection**

- (a) Dissimilar metals shall be protected against galvanic corrosion; and
- (b) A rust prevention coating shall be applied to the chassis, including the underside of fenders, enclosed and boxed-in sections, seams, mouldings, crevices, weld points, underbody and exposed exterior brackets. The product applied shall<sup>(E)</sup> be a commercial product such as Krown Rust Control T-40, or Rust Check. A decal and warranty papers shall<sup>(E)</sup> accompany the Trailer.

**3.19.3 Identification** - A stamped plate shall<sup>(E)</sup> be installed on the body that permanently indicates the following information: Manufacturer, Date of Manufacture, Serial Number, Dump Body Capacity, and Vehicle Tare Weight.

**3.19.4 Warning and Instruction Plates** - International symbols and/or bilingual markings shall be provided for all identification, instructional, and warning labels. The following items shall<sup>(E)</sup> be provided:

- (a) Operating Instructions; and
- (b) Engraved metal plates labelling all gauges, controls.

**3.20 Deliverable Information** - The Contractor shall provide the Deliverable Information in accordance with the terms of the contract/call-up:

- (a) **Equipment Manuals** - The following manuals shall be provided:
  - i. **Operator's/Owner's Manuals** - Operator's manuals shall be furnished in a bilingual format or as 2 manuals in a single binder (one English, one French). A hard copy of the Operator's manual shall be delivered with each vehicle;
  - ii. **Parts Manuals** - The Parts Manuals shall be in English (French translation is desirable);
  - iii. **Maintenance (Shop Repair) Manuals** - The Maintenance (Shop Repair) Manual shall be in English (French translation is desirable);
