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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Introduction

The Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) is divided into six parts plus attachments and annexes, as follows:

- Part 1 General Information: provides a general description of the requirement;
- Part 2 Offeror Instructions: provides the instructions applicable to the clauses and conditions of the RFSO;
- Part 3 Offer Preparation Instructions: provides offerors with instructions on how to prepare their offer to address the evaluation criteria specified;
- Part 4 Evaluation Procedures and Basis of Selection: indicates how the evaluation will be conducted, the evaluation criteria which must be addressed in the offer and the basis of selection;
- Part 5 Certifications: includes the certifications to be provided;
- Part 6 6A, Standing Offer, and 6B, Resulting Contract Clauses:

6A, includes the Standing Offer containing the offer from the Offeror and the applicable clauses and conditions;

6B, includes the clauses and conditions which will apply to any contract resulting from a call-up made pursuant to the Standing Offer.

The Annexes include the Requirement, the Basis of Payment and any other Annexes.

2. Summary

(i) Requirement

The Contractor must provide for rental / lease 5 Ton Cargo Trucks, 5 Ton Cargo Trucks with hydraulic gate, 5 Ton Reefers, Highway Tractors with Day Cab, Highway Tractors with Sleeper Cab, 53 Foot Van Trailers, 53 Foot Refrigeration Trailers and 3 Ton Multistop Cubevan with Hydraulic Gate, excluding driver.

(ii) Clients

The Federal Government Departments and Agencies within Ontario Region, at various locations, on an "as and when requested" basis, during the period of this Standing Offer.

The Ontario Region encompasses the province of Ontario, excluding the National Capital Area.

(iii) Period

The period of the Standing Offer is from 1 January 2013 to 31 December 2013 with two additional one year periods.

(iv) Estimated Expenditure and Historical Volumes

The estimated expenditure for the services during the initial period is approximately \$250,000.00 to \$300,000.00. The estimated expenditure for the services during the extended period is approximately the same for each period.

The historical volumes are specified at Annex B, Basis of Payment in the table titled Estimated Usage. This information is only an estimate which is made in good faith and does not represent an agreement by Canada for the estimated or any quantity.

(v) Pursuant to section 01 of Standard Instructions 2006

Offerors must submit a complete list of names of all individuals who are currently directors of the Offeror. Furthermore, as determined by the Special Investigations Directorate, Departmental Oversight Branch, each individual named on the list may be requested to complete a Consent to a Criminal Record Verification form

(vi) Trade Agreement

The provisions is subject to the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT).

(vii) Canadian Content

The requirement is subject to a preference for Canadian goods and/or services.

3. Debriefings

After issuance of a standing offer, offerors may request a debriefing on the results of the request for standing offers process. Offerors should make the request to the Standing Offer Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the request for standing offers process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

PART 2 - OFFEROR INSTRUCTIONS

1. Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) by number, date and title are set out in the *Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual* (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual> issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Offerors who submit an offer agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the RFSO and accept the clauses and conditions of the Standing Offer and resulting contract(s).

The 2006 (2012-07-11) Standard Instructions - Request for Standing Offers - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the RFSO.

The text under Subsection 4 of Section 01 - Code of Conduct and Certifications - Offer of 2006 referenced above is replaced by:

Offerors should provide, with their offer or promptly thereafter, a complete list of names of all individuals who are currently directors of the Offeror. If such a list has not been received by the time the evaluation of offers is completed, Canada will inform the Offeror of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to provide such a list within the required time frame will render the offer non-responsive. Offerors must always submit the list of directors before issuance of a standing offer.

Canada may, at any time, request that an Offeror provide properly completed and Signed Consent Forms (Consent to a Criminal Record Verification form - PWGSC-TPSGC 229) (<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/app-acq/forms/formulaire-forms-eng.html>) for any or all individuals named in the aforementioned list within a specified delay. Failure to provide such Consent Forms within the delay will result in the offer being declared non-responsive.

The Offeror must diligently maintain the list up-to-date by informing Canada in writing of any change occurring during the validity period of the Offer, and must also provide Canada, when requested, with the corresponding Consent Forms. The Offeror will also be required to diligently maintain the list and when requested, provide Consent Forms during the period of any standing offer arising from this Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) and any call-ups made against the Standing Offer.

Subsection 5.4 of 2006, Standard Instructions - Request for Standing Offers - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, is amended as follows:

Insert: one hundred eighty (180) days

2. Submission of Offers

Offers must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the Request for Standing Offers.

3. Enquiries - Request for Standing Offers

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Standing Offer Authority no later than five (5) calendar days before the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Offerors should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the RFSO to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by offerors to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the questions or may request that offerors do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered with copies to all offerors. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all offerors may not be answered by Canada.

4. Applicable Laws

The Standing Offer and any contract resulting from the Standing Offer must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Offerors may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their offer, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the offerors.

PART 3 - OFFER PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

1. Offer Preparation Instructions

Canada requests that offerors provide their offer in separately bound sections as follows:

Section I: Technical Offer (1 hard copy)
 Section II: Financial Offer (1 hard copy)
 Section III: Certifications (1 hard copy)

If there is a discrepancy between the wording of the soft copy and the hard copy, the wording of the hard copy will have priority over the wording of the soft copy.

Prices must appear in the financial offer only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the offer.

Canada requests that offerors follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their offer.

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to that of the Request for Standing Offers.

In April 2006, Canada issued a policy directing federal departments and agencies to take the necessary steps to incorporate environmental considerations into the procurement process (<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html>). To assist Canada in reaching its objectives, offerors are encouraged to:

Section I: Technical Offer

In their technical offer, offerors should explain and demonstrate how they propose to meet the requirements and how they will carry out the Work.

Section II.1: Financial Offer

Offerors must submit their financial offer in accordance with Annex "B", Basis of Payment. The total amount of Goods and Services Tax or Harmonized Sales Tax must be shown separately, if applicable.

Canada requests that offerors complete one of the following:

- (b) Government of Canada Acquisition Cards (credit cards) will not be accepted for payment of call-ups against the standing offer.

The Offeror is not obligated to accept payment by credit card.

Acceptance of credit cards for payment of call-ups will not be considered as an evaluation criterion.

Offerors must submit the certifications required under Part 5.

PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

1. Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Offers will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the Request for Standing Offers including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the offers.
- (c) The evaluation team will determine first if there are three (3) or more offers with a valid Canadian Content certification. In that event, the evaluation process will be limited to the offers with the certification; otherwise, all offers will be evaluated. If some of the offers with a valid certification are declared non-responsive, or are withdrawn, and less than three responsive offers with a valid certification remain, the evaluation will continue among those offers with a valid certification. If all offers with a valid certification are subsequently declared non-responsive, or are withdrawn, then all the other offers received will be evaluated.

1.1 Technical Evaluation

1.1.1 Mandatory Technical Criteria

1- It is mandatory that offerors provide a list of designated dealers authorized to rent / lease and service vehicles in Ontario Region, which must include Northern, Central, Eastern and Southwestern Ontario. Failure to provide a list of designated dealers with the offer will render the offer non-responsive.

2- It is mandatory that offerors submit firm prices for each item in the Pricing Bases. A partially completed pricing basis will be given no further consideration.

3- It is mandatory that all prices be provided as per the unit of issue stated in the solicitation document and that the pricing basis not to be alerted in any way.

1.2 Financial Evaluation

1.2.1 Firm Price and/or Rates

The Offeror is required to submit firm prices, rates or both that will apply for the entire period of the Standing Offer, including the extension periods.

1.2.2 Prices - Items

Offerors must submit firm prices for all items listed in Annex B, Basis of Payment.

1.2.3 Evaluation of Price - Aggregate

The aggregate of all prices for all items, for one year and two additional one year periods, detailed in Annex B, Basis of Payment will be evaluated.

1.2.4 Evaluation of Price

The price of the offer will be evaluated in Canadian dollars, the Goods and Services Tax or the Harmonized Sales Tax excluded, FOB destination, Canadian customs duties and excise taxes included.

2. Basis of Selection

2.1 Basis of Selection - Mandatory Technical Criteria Only

- 1. An offer must comply with the requirements of the Request for Standing Offers and meet all mandatory technical evaluation criteria to be declared responsive.

2. The two responsive offers with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for issuance of a Standing Offer. The Standing Offer will be issued on a proportional basis such that;

Offers meeting requirements of responsiveness as defined above, will be ranked in order of merit of the lowest priced aggregate offer being ranked number one, the second lowest priced aggregate offer being ranked number two and so on.

The number one ranked offer will be recommended for issuance of a Standing Offer in the amount of \$226,000.00; and the number two ranked offer will be recommended for issuance of a Standing Offer in the amount of \$113,000.00.

PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS

Offerors must provide the required certifications to be issued a standing offer. Canada will declare an offer non-responsive if the required certifications are not completed and submitted as requested.

Compliance with the certifications offerors provide to Canada is subject to verification by Canada during the offer evaluation period (before issuance of a standing offer) and after issuance of a standing offer. The Standing Offer Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify offerors' compliance with the certifications before issuance of a standing offer. The offer will be declared non-responsive if any certification made by the Offeror is untrue, whether made knowingly or unknowingly. Failure to comply with the certifications or to comply with the request of the Standing Offer Authority for additional information will also render the offer non-responsive.

1. Code of Conduct Certifications - Certifications Precedent to Issuance of a Standing Offer.

1.1 Offerors should provide, with their offer or promptly thereafter, a complete list of names of all individuals who are currently directors of the Offeror. If such a list has not been received by the time the evaluation of offers is completed, the Standing Offer Authority will inform the Offeror of a time frame within which to provide the information. Offerors must submit the list of directors before issuance of a standing offer, failure to provide such a list within the required time frame will render the offer non-responsive.

2. Certifications Precedent to Issuance of Standing Offer

The certifications listed below should be completed and submitted with the offer but may be submitted afterwards. If any of these required certifications is not completed and submitted as requested, the Standing Offer Authority will so inform the Offeror and provide the Offeror with a time frame within which to meet the requirement. Failure to comply with the request of the Standing Offer Authority and meet the requirements within that time period will render the offer non-responsive.

2.1 Federal Contractors Program - Certification

Federal Contractors Program - \$200,000 or more

1. The Federal Contractors Program (FCP) requires that some suppliers, including a supplier who is a member of a joint venture, bidding for federal government contracts, valued at \$200,000 or more (including all applicable taxes), make a formal commitment to implement employment equity. This is a condition precedent to contract award. If the Bidder, or, if the Bidder is a joint venture and if any member of the joint venture, is subject to the FCP, evidence of its commitment must be provided before the award of the Contract.

Suppliers who have been declared ineligible contractors by Human Resources and Skills Development Canada (HRSDC) are no longer eligible to receive government contracts over the threshold for solicitation of bids as set out in the Government Contracts Regulations. Suppliers may be declared ineligible contractors either as a result of a finding of non-compliance by HRSDC, or following their voluntary withdrawal from the FCP for a reason other than the reduction of their workforce to less than 100 employees. Any bids from ineligible contractors, including a bid from a joint venture that has a member who is an ineligible contractor, will be declared non-responsive.

2. If the Bidder does not fall within the exceptions enumerated in 3.(a) or (b) below, or does not have a valid certificate number confirming its adherence to the FCP, the Bidder must fax (819-953-8768) a copy of the signed form LAB 1168, Certificate of Commitment to Implement employment Equity, to the Labour Branch of HRSDC.

3. The Bidder, or, if the Bidder is a joint venture the member of the joint venture, certifies its status with the FCP, as follows:

The Bidder or the member of the joint venture

- (a) () is not subject to the FCP, having a workforce of less than 100 full-time or part-time permanent employees, and/or temporary employees having worked 12 weeks or more in Canada;
- (b) () is not subject to the FCP, being a regulated employer under the Employment Equity Act, S.C. 1995, c. 44;
- (c) () is subject to the requirements of the FCP, having a workforce of 100 or more full-time or part-time permanent employees, and/or temporary employees having worked 12 weeks or more in Canada, but has not previously obtained a certificate number from HRSDC (having not bid on requirements of \$200,000 or more), in which case a duly signed certificate of commitment is attached;
- (d) () is subject to the FCP, and has a valid certificate number as follows: _____ (e.g. has not been declared an ineligible contractor by HRSDC.)
Further information on the FCP is available on the HRSDC Web site.

2.2 Canadian Content Certification

This procurement is conditionally limited to Canadian goods and Canadian services.

Subject to the evaluation procedures contained in the request for standing offer, offerors acknowledge that only offers with a certification that the goods and services offered are Canadian goods and Canadian services, as defined in clause A3050T, may be considered.

Failure to provide this certification completed with the offer will result in the goods and services offered being treated as non-Canadian goods and non-Canadian services.

The Offeror certifies that:

- () a minimum of 80 percent of the total price for the offer consist of Canadian goods and Canadian services as defined in paragraph 5 of clause A3050T.

PART 6 - STANDING OFFER AND RESULTING CONTRACT CLAUSES

A. STANDING OFFER

1. Offer

- 1.1 The Offeror offers to fulfill the requirement in accordance with the Requirement at Annex "A".

2. Standard Clauses and Conditions

All clauses and conditions identified in the Standing Offer and resulting contract(s) by number, date and title are set out in the Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual

(<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

2.1 General Conditions

2005 (2012-07-16) General Conditions - Standing Offers - Goods or Services, apply to and form part of the Standing Offer.

The text under Subsection 4 of Section 11 - Code of Conduct and Certifications - Standing Offer of 2005 referenced above is replaced by:

During the entire period of the Standing Offer and any call-ups made against the Standing Offer, the Offeror must diligently update, by written notice to the Standing Offer Authority, the list of names of all individuals who are directors of the Offeror whenever there is a change. As well, whenever requested by Canada, the Offeror must provide the corresponding Consent Forms.

2.2 Standing Offers Reporting

The Offeror must compile and maintain records on its provision of goods, services or both to the federal government under contracts resulting from the Standing Offer. This data must include all purchases paid for by a Government of Canada Acquisition Card.

The Offeror must provide this data in accordance with the reporting requirements detailed in Annex "A" . If some data is not available, the reason must be indicated. If no goods or services are provided during a given period, the Offeror must still provide a "NIL" report.

The data must be submitted on a yearly basis to the Standing Offer Authority.

The data must be submitted to the Standing Offer Authority no later than 90 days before the completion of each year.

3. Term of Standing Offer

3.1 Period of the Standing Offer

The period for making call-ups against is from 1 January 2013 to 31 December 2013.

3.2 Extension of the Standing Offer

If the Standing Offer is authorized for use beyond the initial period, the Offeror offers to extend its offer for two additional one year periods under the same conditions and at the rates or prices specified in the Standing Offer, or at the rates or prices calculated in accordance with the formula specified in the Standing Offer. The Offeror will be advised of the decision to authorize the use of the Standing Offer for an extended period by the Standing Offer Authority 15 days before the expiry date of the Standing Offer. A revision to the Standing Offer will be issued by the Standing Offer Authority.

The Project Authority is the representative of the department or agency for whom the Work will be carried out pursuant to a call-up against the Standing Offer and is responsible for all the technical content of the Work under the resulting Contract.

4.3 Offeror's Representative (The information will be inserted by Canada at time of issuance of the Standing Offer).

3. In the event the primary supplier is unable to fulfill the requirement (either all or in part) at time of Call-up, the consignee will utilize the next lowest priced Offer to fulfill the requirement.

7. Call-up Instrument

The Work will be authorized or confirmed by the Identified User(s) using form PWGSC-TPSGC 942, Call-up Against a Standing Offer or an electronic version.

8. Limitation of Call-ups

Individual call-ups against the Standing Offer must not exceed \$25,000.00 (Goods and Services Tax or Harmonized Sales Tax included).

9. Financial Limitation

The total cost to Canada resulting from call ups against the Standing Offer must not exceed the sum of \$ (The information will be inserted by Canada at time of issuance of the Standing Offer) (Goods and Services Tax or Harmonized Sales Tax excluded) unless otherwise authorized in writing by the Standing Offer Authority. The Offeror must not perform any work or services or supply any articles in response to call ups which would cause the total cost to Canada to exceed the said sum, unless an increase is so authorized.

The Offeror must notify the Standing Offer Authority as to the adequacy of this sum when 75 percent of this amount has been committed, or (3) months before the expiry date of the Standing Offer, whichever comes first.
