PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1. **Security Requirement**

There is no security requirement associated with the requirement.

2. **Requirement**

2. Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

3. Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than seven (7) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the questions or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered with copies to all bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all bidders may not be answered by Canada.

4. Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the bidders.

PART 3 - BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

1. Bid Preparation Instructions

Canada requests that bidders provide their bid in separately bound sections as follows:

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

Canada requests that bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their bid:

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

1.2 Payment of Invoices by Credit Card

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

1.1 Technical Evaluation

All bids must be completed in full and provide all of the information requested in the bid solicitation to enable full and complete evaluation.

1.1.1 Mandatory Technical Criteria

The following factors will be taken into consideration in the evaluation of each bid.

Bidders are to indicate compliance, by checking Yes or No, for each mandatory criterion listed below.

1.2 Evaluation of Price

The price of bids will be evaluated in Canadian dollars, the Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) excluded, DDP Destination Incoterms 2000 for Goods, Customs duties and Excise taxes included.

1.3 Unit Pricing for Liquid Nitrogen

1.3.1 Applicable to Supply Period A

A firm unit price per Liter is required with the Bidder's proposal.

A separate display of the following unit operating costs is required to assist in determining the subsequent supply period price adjustment: Transportation, Electricity, and Direct Labour. These operating costs are expenses which would be incurred by the Contractor to produce and deliver the Liquid Nitrogen to Destination.

Bidders may be requested to submit documented evidence / support for the aforementioned operating costs.

Bidders must include in their Financial Bid (see Annex "B") the portion (in percentage (%)) of Transportation, Electricity and Direct Labour factors included in and contributing to their bid price.

No other cost or factors will be considered by Her Majesty for this evaluation and during the period of any resulting contract. Total operating costs must amount to 100%.

1.3.2 Proposed Pricing for Subsequent Supply Periods

Canada will establish firm prices for Supply Periods B and C using the formula set out hereunder.

Price for liquid nitrogen for a supply period will be determined by adjusting the unit price in effect in the preceding supply period to reflect changes in the following factors:

- (i) Increases or decreases in Transportation and other costs identified in the bidder's proposal related to the movement of the liquid nitrogen will be adjusted to reflect the change in the Statistics Canada Catalogue, Consumer Price Index (CPI) (URL <http://www.statcan.gc.ca/tables-tableaux/sum-som/l01/cst01/cpis12d-eng.htm>), applicable to the province of Ontario. CPI's Chronological Index will allow for optimum retrieval of the past data (URL <http://www5.statcan.gc.ca/bsolc/olc-cel/olc-cel?catno=62-001-X&chroprg=1&lang=eng>);
- (ii) Increases or decreases for Electricity costs identified in the bidder's proposal shall be adjusted to reflect the change in the Statistics Canada, Industry Price Indexes (IPI) (URL <http://www.statcan.gc.ca/pub/62-011-x/2012004/t039-eng.htm>), applicable to the province of Ontario. Actual reference is Table 5-2, Electric Power Selling Price Indexes, for Non-residential Customers - under 5000kW, for the month of the current supply period (e.g. July) and the month prior to the current supply period (e.g. July). IPI's Chronological Index will allow for optimum retrieval of the past data (URL <http://www5.statcan.gc.ca/bsolc/olc-cel/olc-cel?catno=62-011-X&chroprg=1&lang=eng>);
- (iii) Increases or decreases for Direct Labour costs identified in the bidder's proposal shall be adjusted to reflect the average change in the Statistics Canada, Employment, Earnings and Hours (URL <http://www.statcan.gc.ca/pub/72-002-x/2012004/t134-eng.htm>). Actual reference is Table 4-7, Estimates of employment and average weekly earnings for all employees, by industry — Ontario, under Chemical manufacturing - 325. Data to be considered are the Average Weekly Earnings (including overtime), for the quarter of the current supply period as well as the quarter prior to the current supply period. Chronological Index will allow for optimum retrieval of the past data (URL <http://www5.statcan.gc.ca/bsolc/olc-cel/olc-cel?catno=72-002-X&chroprg=1&lang=eng>).

2. Basis of Selection

A bid must comply with all requirements of the bid solicitation to be declared responsive. The responsive bid will be recommended for award of a contract, based on the lowest evaluated aggregate unit pricing applicable to Supply Period A (see 1.4.1 below), spanning from Day 1 of Contract to June 30, 2013.

PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS

Bidders must provide the required certifications to be awarded a contract. Canada will declare a bid non-responsive if the required certifications are not completed and submitted as requested.

Compliance with the certifications bidders provide to Canada is subject to verification by Canada during the bid evaluation period (before award of a contract) and after award of a contract. The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify bidders' compliance with the certifications before award of a contract. The bid will be declared non-responsive if any certification made by the Bidder is untrue, whether made knowingly or unknowingly. Failure to comply with the certifications or to comply with the request of the Contracting Authority for additional information will also render the bid non-responsive.

1. Certifications Precedent to Contract Award

The certifications listed below should be completed and submitted with the bid, but may be submitted afterwards. If any of these required certifications is not completed and submitted as requested, the Contracting Authority will so inform the Bidder and provide the Bidder with a time frame within which to meet the requirement. Failure to comply with the request of the Contracting Authority and meet the requirement within that time period will render the bid non-responsive.

1.1 Federal Contractors Program - over \$25,000 and below \$200,000

Suppliers who are subject to the Federal Contractors Program (FCP) and have been declared ineligible contractors by Human Resources and Skills Development Canada (HRSDC) are no longer eligible to receive federal government contracts over the threshold for solicitation of bids as set out in the Government Contracts Regulations. Suppliers may be declared ineligible contractors either as a result of a finding of non-compliance by HRSDC, or following their voluntary withdrawal from the FCP for a reason other than the reduction of their workforce to less than 100 employees. The Contractor must supply and fill liquid nitrogen into 230-liter dewars owned by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA), as the litrage may vary weekly, in accordance with the Requirement at Annex "A".

3. Standard Clauses and Conditions

All clauses and conditions identified in the Contract by number, date and title are set out in the Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual (<http://ccua-sacc.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/pub/acho-eng.jsp>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

3.1 General Conditions

2010A (2012-07-16), General Conditions - Goods (Medium Complexity), apply to and form part of the Contract.

4. Term of Contract

4.1 Periods of the Contract

The fulfillment of the Requirement is required for the following continuous periods:

Supply Period "A" - from Day 1 of Contract to June 30, 2013

Supply Period "B" - from July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014

Supply Period "C" - from July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015

4.2 Option to Extend the Contract

The Contractor grants to Canada the irrevocable option to extend the term of the Contract by up to an extra six-month period under the same conditions. The Contractor agrees that, during the extended period of the Contract, it will be paid in accordance with the applicable provisions as set out in the Basis of Payment, along with the latest data from Statistics Canada (cf. Appendix "A" References).

Canada may exercise this option at any time by sending a written notice to the Contractor at least 30 calendar days before the expiry date of the Contract. The option may only be exercised by the Contracting Authority, and will be evidenced for administrative purposes only, through a contract amendment.

4.3 Delivery time

Deliveries pursuant to the Requirement (cf. Annex "A") must occur every Thursday, between 10:00 and 13:30 (Eastern Time).

It is understood that in case of any non business occurrence, such as a statutory holiday or any unforeseen closing of the premises, the Supplier is responsible for ensuring timely delivery. The Supplier and the End user shall therefore agree on an appointed time schedule. Proper correspondence thereof shall be kept in writing for any discretionary audit purposes.

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4.4 Adherence to Delivery Schedule

The contractor will promptly give notice to the Department of Public Works and Government Services of its inability to meet the contract delivery schedule and will request therein an extension of time stating its proposed revised delivery schedule and offering consideration for such revisions. Until such notice is received and the revised delivery schedule agreed to by the Department of Public Works and Government Services, the Minister may, pursuant to the General Conditions, on the business day following the due date of delivery of any outstanding materials, **terminate the whole or part of the contract for default.**

6.1 Basis of Payment - Firm Unit Price

In consideration of the Contractor satisfactorily completing all of its obligations under the Contract, the Contractor will be paid a firm unit price, as specified in Annex "B" for a cost of \$ _____ per Liter. Customs duties are included, and Harmonized Sales Tax is extra.

The Contractor must not perform any work or provide any service that would result in Canada's total liability being exceeded before obtaining the written approval of the Contracting Authority. The Contractor must notify the Contracting Authority in writing as to the adequacy of this sum:
 - (a) when it is 75 percent committed, or
 - (b) four (4) months before the supply period's expiry date, or
 - (c) as soon as the Contractor considers that the contract funds provided are inadequate for the completion of the Work,
 whichever comes first.
3. If the notification is for inadequate contract funds, the Contractor must provide to the Contracting Authority a written estimate for the additional funds required. Provision of such information by the Contractor does not increase Canada's liability.

1. Abstract

To supply and fill liquid nitrogen (i.e. the Requirement) into 230-liter dewars owned by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA).

2. Provisions of the Requirement

The following forms part of the Requirement:

- 1) Liquid Nitrogen must be industrial grade, in accordance with the Compressed Gas Association (CGA) Standard G-10-1, 99.998% minimum purity at all times for on-site filling;
- 2) CFIA-owned dewars currently use the ORCA delivery system manufactured by Chart Industries; the supplier must guarantee no filling issues by ensuring compatibility with the ORCA delivery system;
- 3) Supplier must fulfill the Requirement by using low saturation pressure (below 10 psig) to minimize venting;
- 4) Supplier must fulfill the Requirement via a cryogenic pump. No pressure filling will be accepted;
- 5) Supplier must inspect all dewars upon each fill;
- 6) Supplier must report to the CFIA any required dewar maintenance, on site the same day as the fill;
- 7) Tank trucks, if utilized, must be equipped with meters which produce delivery slips;

- 9) No charges or extra fees such as Dangerous Goods, Hazardous Materials, Fuel Surcharge, Environmental Compliance shall be applied;
- 10) Loss of liquid nitrogen due to failure of supplier equipment shall be at the contractor's expense;
- 11) Supplier must provide a Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHMIS) sheet upon initial delivery, and keep it up to date upon any subsequent visit.

3. Total Estimated Consumption

Expected number of dewars on the site: eight (8). Total required liquid nitrogen is estimated 1,000 Liters per week.
