#### 1.2 Technical Documentation

### 2. Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

### 3. Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than ten (10) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by bidders to explain each question in sufficient

detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the questions or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered with copies to all bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all bidders may not be answered by Canada.

#### **4. Applicable Laws**

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the bidders.

## PART 3 - BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

### 1. Bid Preparation Instructions

Canada requests that bidders provide their bid in separately bound sections as follows:

Section III: Certifications (1 hard copy)

If there is a discrepancy between the wording of the soft copy and the hard copy, the wording of the hard copy will have priority over the wording of the soft copy.

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

Canada requests that bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their bid:

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

In April 2006, Canada issued a policy directing federal departments and agencies to take the necessary steps to incorporate environmental considerations into the procurement process [Policy on Green Procurement](#)

- 1) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper containing fibre certified as originating from a sustainably-managed forest and containing minimum 30% recycled content; and
- 2) use an environmentally-preferable format including black and white printing instead of colour printing, printing double sided/duplex, using staples or clips instead of cerlox, duotangs or binders.

#### Section I: Technical Bid

In their technical bid, bidders should explain and demonstrate how they propose to meet the requirements and how they will carry out the Work. Bidders must include detailed drawings of the proposal accommodating the required amount of weapons and aisle restrictions.

**Section II: Financial Bid**

Bidders must submit their financial bid in accordance with the Basis of Payment and Annex "B". The total amount of Goods and Services Tax (GST) or Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) must be shown separately, if applicable.

**1.1. Exchange Rate Fluctuation**

The requirement does not provide for exchange rate fluctuation protection. Any request for exchange rate fluctuation protection will not be considered and will render the bid non-responsive.

**1.2 Pricing Basis**

The bidder must quote firm lot prices in Canadian dollars, DDP Delivered Duty Paid (destination), the Goods and Services Tax (GST) and/or the Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) extra, as applicable. Freight charges to destination and all applicable Custom duties and Excise taxes must be included.

## PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

### 1. Evaluation Procedures

Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria. An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

#### Evaluation Criteria

*All bids must be completed in full and provide all of the information requested in the bid solicitation to enable full and complete evaluation.*

#### 1.1 Mandatory Technical Criteria

The following **Mandatory** factors will be taken into consideration in the evaluation of each bid:

- Mandatory Certifications Required Precedent to Contract Award as specified in Part 5;
- Technical compliance (description of items in Annex "A");
- **Simply stating a compliancy to a criteria is insufficient. Bidders must present a clearly organized, printed (i.e., not handwritten) proposal that includes all necessary technical and descriptive literature, in order to clearly demonstrate their compliancy to all items presented in Annex "A".**
- Must submit detailed drawings of the proposal accommodating the required amount of weapons and aisle restrictions.
- Acceptance of terms and conditions as mentioned in the bid solicitation;
- Completion of the proposal;

#### 1.2 Financial Evaluation

The following **Mandatory** factors will be taken into consideration in the evaluation of each bid:

- Compliance with Pricing Basis;

The Bid price will be determined by processing items as follows:

- Sum of all items total price (unit price x qty.);

#### 1.3 Conditions/Certifications Precedent to Contract

- Federal Contractors Program as specified in Part 5;
- Financial Capability as specified at Part 2, para 1.1.;

### 2. Basis of Selection

A bid must comply with the requirements of the bid solicitation and meet all mandatory technical evaluation criteria to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price on an aggregate basis will be recommended for award of a contract.

## **PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS**

Bidders must provide the required certifications and related documentation to be awarded a contract. Canada will declare a bid non-responsive if the required certifications and related documentation are not completed and submitted as requested.

Compliance with the certifications bidders provide to Canada is subject to verification by Canada during the bid evaluation period (before award of a contract) and after award of a contract. The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify bidders' compliance with the certifications before award of a contract. The bid will be declared non-responsive if any certification made by the Bidder is untrue, whether made knowingly or unknowingly. Failure to comply with the certifications, to provide the related documentation or to comply with the request of the Contracting Authority for additional information will also render the bid non-responsive.

### **1. Mandatory Certifications Required Precedent to Contract Award**

#### **Code of Conduct and Certifications - Related documentation**

By submitting a bid, the Bidder certifies, for himself and his affiliates, to be in compliance with the Code of Conduct and Certifications clause of the Standard instructions. The related documentation hereinafter mentioned will help Canada in confirming that the certifications are true. By submitting a bid, the Bidder certifies that it is aware, and that its affiliates are aware, that Canada may request additional information, certifications, consent forms and other evidentiary elements proving identity or eligibility. Canada may also verify the information provided by the Bidder, including the information relating to the acts or convictions specified herein, through independent research, use of any government resources or by contacting third parties. Canada will declare non-responsive any bid in respect of which the information requested is missing or inaccurate, or in respect of which the information contained in the certifications is found to be untrue, in any respect, by Canada. The Bidder and any of the Bidder's affiliates, will also be required to remain free and clear of any acts or convictions specified herein during the period of any contract arising from this bid solicitation.

Bidders who are incorporated, including those bidding as a joint venture, must provide with their bid or promptly thereafter a complete list of names of all individuals who are currently directors of the Bidder. Bidders bidding as sole proprietorship, including those bidding as a joint venture, must provide the name of the owner with their bid or promptly thereafter. Bidders bidding as societies, firms, partnerships or associations of persons do not need to provide lists of names. If the required names have not been received by the time the evaluation of bids is completed, Canada will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to comply will render the bid non-responsive. Providing the required names is a mandatory requirement for contract award.

Canada may, at any time, request that a Bidder provide properly completed and Signed Consent Forms ([Consent to a Criminal Record Verification Form](#) - PWGSC-TPSGC 229)

## 2. Additional Certifications Precedent to Contract Award

### Federal Contractors Program - Certification - over \$25,000 and below \$200,000

Suppliers who are subject to the Federal Contractors Program (FCP) and have been declared ineligible contractors by Human Resources and Skills Development Canada (HRSDC) are no longer eligible to receive federal government contracts over the threshold for solicitation of bids as set out in the Government Contracts Regulations. Suppliers may be declared ineligible contractors either as a result of a finding of non-compliance by HRSDC, or following their voluntary withdrawal from the FCP for a reason other than the reduction of their workforce to less than 100 employees. Any bids from ineligible contractors, including a bid from a joint venture that has a member who is an ineligible contractor, will be declared non-responsive.

### 12.1 NATO Commercial and Government Entity Code (NCAGE) Traceability

Material supplied for the items specified in this contract is subject to investigation by Canada. Material which can neither be demonstrated by the contractor as having originated directly from the NCAGE specified for the item in this contract, nor as supplied with the specific written permission of this specified NCAGE, are subject to the following action by Canada.

Canada may either:

- (b) retain the item, and demand and receive from the Contractor (who shall forthwith so pay) the difference between the Contractor's costs relating to the item, as determined by Canada, and the costs which, in Canada's opinion, the Contractor would have incurred had it obtained and supplied an item which did not differ in any way from that specifically required under the contract.

## ANNEX "A" - Requirement

### Weapons storage cabinets

The Cabinet requirements are as follows:

- 1) A quantity of (39) **cabinets** is required to store 700 weapons/accuracy barrels.
- 2) A quantity of (8) **cabinets**; approximately 60" wide X 28" deep X 59" high are required for the left isle. (Tolerance of +/- 2")
- 3) A quantity of (18) **cabinets**; approximately 45" wide X 28" deep X 45" high is required for the right isle. (Tolerance of +/- 2")
- 4) A quantity of (3) **cabinets** without drawers but with a central shelf; approximately 45" wide X 28" deep X 45" high are required for the right isle. (Tolerance of +/- 2")
- 5) A quantity of (10) **cabinets**; approximately 45" wide X 28" deep X 59" high is required for the mezzanine part. (Tolerance of +/- 2")
- 6) A quantity of (8) **lockers**; approximately 60" wide X 28" deep X 24" high is required for the left isle. (Tolerance of +/- 2") A shelf is required in the center of the locker and the doors must be equipped with a key lock.
- 7) The mezzanine must have a permanent staircase with guardrail. It must be equipped with a rubber carpet to prevent damage to the cabinet tops.
- 8) The cabinet housings must be of welded steel construction.
- 9) The cabinet housing must be able to be fixed to ground or wall at four mounting points.
- 10) The cabinet housing must provide a pallet base to allow fastening of the cabinets to the floor and for ease of mobility for installation.
- 11) Each cabinet must contain 2 hinged locking bars. Hardware must resistant to tampering. Fasteners must be a minimum 3/8" diameter.
- 12) Each cabinet must be capable of being locked with an approved ABLOY PADLOCK, no integral locking mechanisms.
- 13) Drawer capacity must be minimum of 400lbs.

14) Weapons must be stored in cradles where direct contact points are not steel on steel to prevent corrosion. Contact points must be a non-corrosive plastic type material.

15) Cradles must be easily interchangeable to accommodate the constant changes in design of weapons. Cradles must not be specific to each housing.

16) The cabinet manufacturer must offer a lifetime warranty, on all components of the cabinet.

17) The approved contractor shall provide notice of conformance to Chapter 28, Article 28.47 of the National Security Policy.

### **UNIT STORAGE--GENERAL**

28.47 The following paragraphs prescribe the minimum safeguards and procedures for the security of SA and ammunition and explosives when held by Regular Force, Reserve Force, Cadet units or other DND organizations:

- a. **PREPARATION OF WEAPONS** - prior to placing separable SA in secure storage, each SA is to be rendered inoperable by removing one or more essential operating components.
- b. **SA AND AMMUNITION** - all ammunition or explosives, SA and inseparable weapons or weapons systems are to be stored in weapons rooms constructed and protected to the standards contained at Annex B. Ammunition held in SAA rooms must be stored in approved containers.
- c. **SECURING OF WEAPONS WITHIN WEAPONS ROOMS** - All SA are to be secured within weapons rooms to the following standards:
  - (1) revolvers and pistol bodies are to be placed in:
    - (a) a dial lock safe,
    - (b) a strong metal cabinet with an approved S2/83 rated keyed padlock, or
    - (c) a metal cabinet, fitted with one or more locking bars, secured by approved S2/83 rated keyed padlocks affixed to prevent doors from being forcibly sprung open.
  - (2) rifles, shotguns, sub-machine-guns and automatic rifles are to be secured in racks fitted with chains, steel cable or steel locking bars which can be passed over or through a part of the weapon in such a manner as to prevent removal. Most military pattern weapons can be secured in racks - NSN 1095-21-902-8216 (five weapons) and NSN 1095-21-902-8215 (15 weapons).
  - (3) crew served weapons such as mortars, recoilless rifles and machine guns are to be secured in metal containers, (Cabinet Storage NSN 7125-21-841- 0191), fitted with two horizontally placed locking bars fitted with S2/83 keyed padlocks. Locally designed and manufactured racks, securely fastened to the walls or floor, fitted with chains, cables or locking bars which prevent removal of the weapon from the rack are also acceptable.
  - (4) SA which are non-separable or are self-contained weapons or weapons systems which cannot be stored in racks are to be stored inside strong metal cabinets, fitted with one or more locking bars and secured by S2/83 rated keyed padlocks affixed to prevent drawers or doors from being forcibly sprung open, and

(5) drill purpose weapons are to be secured in racks unless the weapon and all operating components of the weapon are rendered inoperable in such a manner as to make it permanently incapable of being restored to operating condition. Totally inoperable weapons may be stored in a locked room.

d. COMPONENTS - Once removed from a separable weapon, SA components are to be stored:

(1) within the weapons room, if the weapons room is protected by an intrusion alarm.

e. AMMUNITION AND EXPLOSIVES - except for ready-use lock-ups, ammunition or explosives are not to be stored in the same room in which SA are stored. Ammunition and SA components may be stored in the same room (apart from the SA), but in separate containers.
