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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION**1. Security Requirement**

There is no security requirement associated with the requirement.

2. Statement of Requirement

409 Tactical Fighter Squadron (TFS) will deploy to Marine Corps Air Station Miramar , San Diego, California (CA) from 22 January to 26 February 2013 in order to meet squadron Force Generation (FG) training requirements and provide support to the CF-18 Fighter Weapons Instructor Course (FWIC).

The requirement is for a fleet of fifty (50) rental vehicles for CF personnel starting 22 January 2013 to 26 February 2013.

The Bidder must be able to deliver vehicles at Marine Corps Air Station Miramar, Miramar Way at Altair Ave, San Diego, CA 92145 and vehicles will be returned at the same location.

Due to the nature of the deployment, actual numbers of personnel may fluctuate. As well, the end date for the deployment is dependent on the ability for all personnel and equipment to leave at the end of training. Therefore, provider shall be flexible to changes in dates and personnel with a minimum of 48 hours notice.

The current unit requirements to date are for fifty (50) vehicles for 22 January to 26 February 2013 but are subject to change based on conditions beyond our control.

3. Debriefings

After contract award, bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be provided in writing, by telephone or in person.

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS**1. Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions**

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the *Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual* (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The 2003 (2012-11-19) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

2. Submission of Bids

3. Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority **no later than 21 December 2012 at 10:00 AM EST**. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the questions or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered with copies to all bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all bidders may not be answered by Canada.

4. Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Quebec.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the bidders.

1.1 Technical Evaluation

M.2 The fleet vehicles rental must include all services required at Annex A - Statement of Requirement

1.2 Financial Evaluation

Responsive bids will be evaluated in US dollars based on prices submitted in Annex C - Basis of Payment, all taxes excluded, if applicable.

2. Basis of Selection

A bid must comply with all requirements of the bid solicitation to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for award of a contract.

PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS

Bidders must provide the required certifications and related documentation to be awarded a contract. Canada will declare a bid non-responsive if the required certifications and related documentation are not completed and submitted as requested.

Compliance with the certifications bidders provide to Canada is subject to verification by Canada during the bid evaluation period (before award of a contract) and after award of a contract. The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify bidders' compliance with the certifications before award of a contract. The bid will be declared non-responsive if any certification made by the Bidder is untrue, whether made knowingly or unknowingly. Failure to comply with the certifications, to provide the related documentation or to comply with the request of the Contracting Authority for additional information will also render the bid non-responsive.

1. Mandatory Certifications Required Precedent to Contract Award

1.1 Code of Conduct and Certifications - Related documentation

- 1.1.1 By submitting a bid, the Bidder certifies, for himself and his affiliates, to be in compliance with the Code of Conduct and Certifications clause of the Standard instructions. The related documentation hereinafter mentioned will help Canada in confirming that the certifications are true. By submitting a bid, the Bidder certifies that it is aware, and that its affiliates are aware, that Canada may request additional information, certifications, consent forms and other evidentiary elements proving identity or eligibility. Canada may also verify the information provided by the Bidder, including the information relating to the acts or convictions specified herein, through independent research, use of any government resources or by contacting third parties. Canada will declare non-responsive any bid in respect of which the information requested is missing or inaccurate, or in respect of which the information contained in the certifications is found to be untrue, in any respect, by Canada. The Bidder and any of the Bidder's affiliates, will also be required to remain free and clear of any acts or convictions specified herein during the period of any contract arising from this bid solicitation.

Bidders who are incorporated, including those bidding as a joint venture, must provide with their bid or promptly thereafter a complete list of names of all individuals who are currently directors of the Bidder. Bidders bidding as sole proprietorship, including those bidding as a joint venture, must provide the name of the owner with their bid or promptly thereafter. Bidders bidding as societies, firms, partnerships or associations of persons do not need to provide lists of names. If the required names have not been received by the time the evaluation of bids is completed, Canada will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to comply will render the bid non-responsive. Providing the required names is a mandatory requirement for contract award.

Canada will not pay the Contractor for any design changes, modifications or interpretations of the Work, unless they have been approved, in writing, by the Contracting Authority before their incorporation into the Work.

6.2 Taxes - Foreign-based Contractor

Unless specified otherwise in the Contract, the price includes no amount for any federal excise tax, state or local sales or use tax, or any other tax of a similar nature, or any Canadian tax whatsoever. The price, however, includes all other taxes.

If the Work is normally subject to federal excise tax, Canada will, upon request, provide the Contractor a certificate of exemption from such federal excise tax in the form prescribed by the federal regulations.

6.3.1 Credit Card Imprint

Upon arrival at the car rental facilities, the Contractor may request the imprint of a credit card. For all types of rental, under no circumstances can the Contractor charge an advanced payment or request a deposit.

Once the vehicle has been returned and inspected, an invoice must be submitted to Canada. If Canada has been charged with a rate that is not in accordance with the Contract, the Contractor must promptly refund any payment to Canada made in excess of the rates, as specified in Annex C, Basis of Payment.

3. Requirement

3.1 The Contractor will provide fifty (50) rental vehicles to CF personnel starting 22 January 2013 to 26 February 2013.

3.2 Location

The Contractor must be able to deliver vehicles at Marine Corps Air Station Miramar, Miramar Way at Altair Ave, San Diego, CA 92145 and vehicles will be returned at the same location.

3.3 Required Services - FLEET VEHICLES RENTAL

The Contractor will provide CF personnel with the following services:

- a. Two (2) Heavy Duty Crew cab pick up truck
- b. Twenty-six (16) midsize sedan car with a minimum capacity for 5 passengers
- c. Twenty-two (22) minivan or equivalent with a minimum capacity for 7 passengers and maximum 8 passengers
- d. Vehicles must be in good repair, not older than year 2011 and 40,000 miles

4. Constraints

Due to the nature of the deployment, actual numbers of personnel may fluctuate. As well, the end date for the deployment is dependent on the ability for all personnel and equipment to leave at the end of training. Therefore, provider shall be flexible to changes in dates and personnel with a minimum of 48 hours notice.

The current unit requirements to date are for fifty (50) vehicles for 22 January to 26 February 2013 but are subject to change based on conditions beyond our control.

5. Liability Insurance

All vehicles must include supplemental liability coverage insurance up to \$1,000,000 and this insurance must remain the insurance of first instance.

6. Collision Damage Waiver (CDW) Insurance

Optional CDW insurance must be offered separately. The CDW rate must provide coverage that fully insures Canada and CF Personnel with nil-deductible, against collision, loss, damage, fire, theft, vandalism, tire, glass damage and loss of use, except in cases in which CF Personnel has been charged and convicted of an indictable offense while using the rental vehicle.

The CDW rate must provide coverage when the vehicle is used on unpaved roads, as long as these roads are maintained by some level of government (federal, state, municipal or local).

CF Personnel may elect to pay for vehicle rentals using premium credit cards that provide CDW coverage, such as Government of Canada Travel Card (American Express). In such instances, they are not required to purchase the CDW separately when renting certain categories of vehicles.

7. CF Personnel below 21 Years Old

CF personnel under 21 years will not be allowed to drive rental vehicles. For CF personnel between 21 and 24 years old, a surcharge will be allowed as shown in Annex C - Basis of Payment.

8. Mechanical Breakdown

In the event that a rental vehicle mechanically breaks down, it must be replaced promptly with a similar vehicle. If it cannot be replaced promptly with a similar vehicle, the Contractor will upgrade, at the same rate as the broken rental vehicle, to the next available category; or provide a similar vehicle from another rental agency at the same rate as that of the broken rental vehicle.
