3) GI01 Code of Conduct and Certifications

1. Bidders must comply with the Code of Conduct for Procurement. Furthermore, in addition to the Code of Conduct for Procurement, bidders must respond to bid solicitations in an honest, fair and comprehensive manner, accurately reflect their capacity to satisfy the requirements stipulated in the bid solicitation and resulting contract, submit bids and enter into contracts only if they will fulfill all obligations of the Contract. To ensure fairness, openness and transparency in the procurement process, the following activities are prohibited:

- (a) payment of a contingency fee to a person to whom the Lobbying Act (1985, c. 44 (4th Supp.)) applies;
- (b) corruption, collusion, bid-rigging or any other anti-competitive activity in the procurement process.

2. By submitting a bid, the Bidder certifies that except for those offences where a criminal pardon has been obtained or leniency granted, neither the Bidder nor any of the Bidder's parent, subsidiaries or other affiliates has ever been convicted of a criminal offence in respect of the activities stated in (a) or (b) above or is the subject of outstanding criminal charges in respect of such activities filed subsequent to September 1, 2010.

3. Bidders further understand that the commission of certain offences will render them ineligible to be awarded a contract. By submitting a bid, the Bidder certifies that except for those offences where a criminal pardon has been obtained, neither the Bidder nor any of the Bidder's parent, subsidiaries or other affiliates has ever been convicted or is the subject of outstanding criminal charges in respect of an offence under any of the following provisions:

section 121 (*Frauds on the government and Contractor subscribing to election fund*), section 124 (*Selling or Purchasing Office*), section 380 (*Fraud committed against Her Majesty*) or section 418 (*Selling defective stores to Her Majesty*) of the Criminal Code of Canada, or under paragraph 80(1)(d) (*False entry*,

*certificate or return), subsection 80(2) (Fraud against Her Majesty) or section 154.01 (Fraud against Her Majesty) of the Financial Administration Act.*

4. For the purpose of this section, business concerns, organizations or individuals are Bidder's affiliates if, directly or indirectly, 1) either one controls or has the power to control the other, or 2) a third party has the power to control both. Indicia of control, include, but are not limited to, interlocking management or ownership, identity of interests among family members, shared facilities and equipment, common use of employees, or a business entity created following the charges or convictions contemplated in this section which has the same or similar management, ownership, or principal employees as the Bidder that is charged or convicted, as the case may be.

5. The Contracting Authority will declare non-responsive any bid in respect of which the information contained in the certifications contemplated above is determined to be untrue in any respect by the Contracting Authority.

6. In circumstances where a bidder or any of the Bidder's parent, subsidiaries or other affiliates has pled guilty of an offence contemplated in subsections 1 and 3, the Bidder must provide with its bid, a certified copy of confirming documentation from the Competition Bureau of Canada indicating that leniency has been granted, or a certified copy of confirming documentation from the National Parole Board indicating that a criminal pardon has been obtained, in relation to such offences.

7. The Bidder or any of the Bidder's parent, subsidiaries or other affiliates must remain free and clear of any charges or convictions contemplated in subsections 1 and 3 during the period of any resulting contract arising from this bid solicitation.

#### 4) GI12 Rejection of Bid

1. Canada may reject a bid where any of the following circumstances is present:

- (a) the Bidder is subject to a Vendor Performance Corrective Measure, under the Vendor Performance Corrective Measure Policy, which renders the Bidder ineligible to bid on the requirement;
- (b) an employee, or subcontractor included as part of the bid, is subject to a Vendor Performance Corrective Measure, under the Vendor Performance Corrective Measure Policy, which would render that employee or subcontractor ineligible to bid on the requirement, or the portion of the requirement the employee or subcontractor is to perform;
- (c) the Bidder is bankrupt or where, for whatever reason, its activities are rendered inoperable for an extended period;
- (d) evidence, satisfactory to Canada, of fraud, bribery, fraudulent misrepresentation or failure to comply with any law protecting individuals against any manner of discrimination, has been received with respect to the Bidder, any of its employees or any subcontractor included as part of the bid;
- (e) evidence satisfactory to Canada that based on past conduct or behavior, the Bidder, a sub-contractor or a person who is to perform the Work is unsuitable or has conducted himself/herself improperly;
- (f) with respect to current or prior transactions with the Government of Canada:

- (i) Canada has exercised its contractual remedies of suspension or termination for default with respect to a contract with the Bidder, any of its employees or any subcontractor included as part of the bid;
- (ii) Canada determines that the Bidder's performance on other contracts, including the efficiency and workmanship as well as the extent to which the Bidder performed the Work in accordance with contractual clauses and conditions, is sufficiently poor to jeopardize the successful completion of the requirement being bid on.

2. Where Canada intends to reject a bid pursuant to a provision of subsection 1. (f), the Contracting Authority will so inform the Bidder and provide the Bidder ten (10) days within which to make representations, before making a final decision on the bid rejection.

3. Canada reserves the right to apply additional scrutiny, in particular, when multiple bids are received in response to a bid solicitation from a single bidder or a joint venture. Canada reserves the right to:

- (i) reject any or all of the bids submitted by a single bidder or joint venture if their inclusion in the evaluation has the effect of prejudicing the integrity and fairness of the process, or;
- (ii) reject any or all of the bids submitted by a single bidder or joint venture if their inclusion in the procurement process would distort the solicitation evaluation, and would cause a result that would not reasonably have been expected under prevailing market conditions and/or would not provide good value to Canada.

**SI02 ENQUIRIES DURING THE SOLICITATION PERIOD**

- 1) Enquiries regarding this bid must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Officer named on the Invitation to Tender - Page 1 as early as possible within the solicitation period. Except for the approval of alternative materials as described in GI16 of R2710T "General Instructions to Bidders", enquiries should be received no later than five (5) calendar days prior to the date set for solicitation closing to allow sufficient time to provide a response. Enquiries received after that time may not result in an answer being provided.
- 2) To ensure consistency and quality of the information provided to Bidders, the Contracting Officer shall examine the content of the enquiry and shall decide whether or not to issue an amendment.
- 3) All enquiries and other communications related to this bid sent throughout the solicitation period are to be directed **ONLY** to the Contracting Officer named on the Invitation to Tender - Page 1. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in the bid being declared non-responsive.

**SI03 SITE VISIT**

A site visit will be held on **May 30, 2012 at 11:00h**. Attendees must report to the Moon Lake District Warden Station located at the North Boundary of Riding Mountain National Park on PTH No. 10. Bidders who, for any reason, cannot



attend at the specified date and time will not be given an alternative appointment to view the site. No exceptions will be made.

#### **SI04 REVISION OF BID**

A bid may be revised by letter or facsimile in accordance with G111 of R2710T "General Instructions to Bidders". The facsimile number for receipt of revisions is (204) 983-0338.

#### **SI05 BID RESULTS**

- 1) A public bid opening will be held in the office designated on the Front Page "Invitation to Tender" for the receipt of bids shortly after the time set for solicitation closing.
- 2) Following solicitation closing, bid results may be obtained by calling the bid receiving office at Telephone No. (204) 983-3774.

#### **SI06 INSUFFICIENT FUNDING**

In the event that the lowest compliant bid exceeds the amount of funding allocated for the Work, Canada in its sole discretion may

- a) cancel the solicitation; or
- b) obtain additional funding and award the Contract to the Bidder submitting the lowest compliant bid; and/or
- c) negotiate a reduction in the bid price and/or scope of work of not more than 15% with the Bidder submitting the lowest compliant bid. Should an agreement satisfactory to Canada not be reached, Canada shall exercise option (a) or (b).

#### **SI07 BID VALIDITY PERIOD**

- 1) Canada reserves the right to seek an extension to the bid validity period prescribed in BA04 of the Bid and Acceptance Form. Upon notification in writing from Canada, Bidders shall have the option to either accept or reject the proposed extension.
- 2) If the extension referred to in paragraph 1) of SI07 is accepted, in writing, by all those who submitted bids, then Canada shall continue immediately with the evaluation of the bids and its approvals processes.
- 3) If the extension referred to in paragraph 1) of SI07 is not accepted in writing by all those who submitted bids then Canada shall, at its sole discretion, either
  - (a) continue to evaluate the bids of those who have accepted the proposed extension and seek the necessary approvals; or
  - (b) cancel the invitation to tender.
- 4) The provisions expressed herein do not in any manner limit Canada's rights in law or under SI01 4) of Special Instructions to Bidders

**SI08 CONSTRUCTION DOCUMENTS**

The successful contractor will be provided with one paper copy of the sealed and signed drawings, the specifications and the amendments upon acceptance of the offer. Additional copies, up to a maximum of (5), will be provided free of charge upon request by the contractor. Obtaining more copies shall be the responsibility of the contractor including costs.

**SI09 WCB AND SAFETY PROGRAM****MANDATORY HEALTH AND SAFETY - for Work in the Province of Manitoba**

- 1) The recommended Bidder shall provide to the Contracting Authority, prior to Contract award:
  - 1.1 a Workers Compensation Board *Experience and Industry Rating Statement - Manitoba*, or equivalent documentation from another jurisdiction;
  - 1.2 a Workers Compensation Board letter of good standing, also listing covered Directors, Principals, Proprietor(s) or Partners who will be or who are anticipated to be present on the work site(s), or equivalent documentation from another jurisdiction; and
  - 1.3 a Certificate of Recognition (COR) or Registered Safety Plan (RSP). A health and safety policy and program, as required by other provincial/territorial Occupational Health and Safety Acts, will be acceptable in lieu of a COR or RSP.
- 2) The recommended Bidder shall deliver all of the above documents to the Contracting Authority on or before the date stated (usually 3-5 days after notification) by the Contracting Authority. Failure to comply with the request may result in the bid being declared non-compliant.

Exemption to Generic Safety Programs (*Manitoba only*) - Contractors having five (5) or less employees do not require a written program. However, evidence of a system to manage health and safety remains a requirement.

## SUPPLEMENTARY CONDITIONS (SC)

### SC01 INSURANCE TERMS

#### Contract Documents

Insurance Terms R2910D (2008-12-12): Delete clause IT3 "Builder's Risk / Installation Floater".

### SC02 ASPHALT CEMENT PRICE ADJUSTMENT

- 1) The price of asphalt cement incorporated into hot mix asphalt shall be adjusted for each month in which paving occurs when the price index for that month differs by more than 5% from the price index for the month prior to bid closing. The price adjustment shall be calculated in accordance with the applicable price adjustment formula of paragraph 2).
- 2) Price Adjustment formulae:
  - (a) When the price index, for the month in which paving occurs, is higher than 105% of the price index for the month prior to bid closing, Canada shall pay the Contractor a compensation of:  
(Example based on a 5% increase)  
 $PA = (IM - 1.05 IB) \times \text{quantity of asphalt cement in tonnes}$
  - (b) When the price index, for the month in which paving occurs, is less than 95% of the price index for the month prior to bid closing, Canada shall deduct an amount from the monthly payment to the Contractor of:  
(Example based on a 5% decrease)  
 $PA = (.95IB - IM) \times \text{quantity of asphalt cement in tonnes}$

PA = payment adjustment for asphalt cement, in dollars

IB = asphalt cement price index for the month prior to bid closing

IM = asphalt cement price index for the month in which paving occurs

The price index shall be the Asphalt Cement Price Index published monthly by the Ontario Ministry of Transportation (MTO) in the Contract Bulletin displayed on the MTO Web site [www.raqs.mto.gov.on.ca](http://www.raqs.mto.gov.on.ca). This price index shall be used to calculate the adjustment per tonne of all grades of asphalt cement accepted into the Work.

- 3) For each month in which a payment adjustment is made, Canada shall use the fixed asphalt cement content of the final job mix formula to determine the asphalt cement quantity that is used.
- 4) The payment adjustments shall be made on the monthly Request for Progress Payment form for the months in which hot mix paving occurs.

### SC03 Workplace Safety and Health

#### 1) EMPLOYER/PRIME CONTRACTOR

- 1.1 The Contractor shall, for the purposes of the Workplace Safety and Health Act and Regulations, Manitoba, and for the duration of the Work:

- 1.1.1 act as the Employer, where there is only one employer on the work site, in accordance with the Authority Having Jurisdiction;
- 1.1.2 assume the role of Prime Contractor, where there are two or more employers involved in work at the same time and space at the work site, in accordance with the Authority Having Jurisdiction; and

- 
- 1.1.3 agree, in the event of two or more Contractors working at the same time and space at the work site, without limiting the General Conditions, to Canada's order \* to:
- 1.1.3.1 assume, as the Prime Contractor, the responsibility for Canada's other Contractor(s); or
- 1.1.3.2 accept that Canada's other Contractor is Prime Contractor and conform to that Contractor's Site Specific Health and Safety Plan.

\* "order" definition: after contract award, Contractor is ordered by a Change Order

- 2.1.1 prior to the pre-construction meeting, a transmittal and copy of a completed Notice of Project form PWGSC - TPSGC 458 (form will be provided to the proposed contractor prior to award), as sent to the Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ); and
- 2.1.2 prior to commencement of work and without limiting the terms of the General Conditions:
- 2.1.2.1 copies of all other necessary permits, notifications and related documents as called for in the scope of work/specifications and/or by the AHJ; and
- 2.1.2.2 a site specific Health and Safety Plan as requested.

*NOTE: Please do not include any forms that include personal 3rd party information such as the names of the contractor's employees and their related claims information.*

If the Contractor or any of the Contractor's parent, subsidiaries or other affiliates does not remain free and clear of any charges or convictions mentioned at subsections 2 and 3 during the period of the Contract, Canada reserves the right, pursuant to the default provision of the Contract, to terminate the Contract for default.
