**REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL
TRAWL-MOUNTED CAMERAS AND ASSOCIATED COMPONENTS**

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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Security Requirement

There is no security requirement associated with the requirement.

2. Requirement

The Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO) has a requirement for the supply and delivery of two (2) Trawl -Mounted Cameras and associated components to be delivered to Winnipeg, Manitoba.

A complete list of the mandatory performance specifications is detailed in Annex A - Requirement and Annex C - Compliance Matrix.

3. Debriefings

After contract award, bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

1. Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions (<http://ccua-sacc.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/pub/acho-eng.jsp>) Manual issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The 2003 (2012-03-02) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

2. Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

All enquiries concerning this solicitation are to be directed to the Contracting Authority named on the front page of this document.

4. Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in **Manitoba**.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the bidders.

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

1. Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

1.1 Technical Evaluation

- (a) Provision of meeting the mandatory performance specifications as detailed in Annex C, Compliance Matrix.
- (b) Bidders are requested to provide documentation to demonstrate compliance to each mandatory criterion listed in Annex C - Compliance Matrix - Mandatory Performance Specifications. Technical documentation such as specification sheets, technical brochures, and photographs or illustrations should provide adequate detail to substantiate that the instrument offered meets the technical requirements. It is the Bidders responsibility to ensure that the submitted documentation provides adequate detail to prove that the proposed product meets the requirements of the performance specifications. If specific published technical documentation is not available, the bidder should prepare a written narrative complete with a detailed explanation of how its bid demonstrates technical compliance.
- (c) Bidders are requested to demonstrate that they are an Authorized Distributor for the Original Equipment Manufacturer of the instrument they are offering.

2. Basis of Selection

A bid must comply with the requirements of the bid solicitation and meet all mandatory technical evaluation criteria to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for award of a contract.

PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS

Bidders must provide the required certifications to be awarded a contract. Canada will declare a bid non-responsive if the required certifications are not completed and submitted as requested.

Compliance with the certifications bidders provide to Canada is subject to verification by Canada during the bid evaluation period (before award of a contract) and after award of a contract. The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify bidders' compliance with the certifications before award of a contract. The bid will be declared non-responsive if any certification made by the Bidder is untrue, whether made knowingly or unknowingly. Failure to comply with the certifications or to comply with the request of the Contracting Authority for additional information will also render the bid non-responsive.
