### 2. Summary

This Regional Individual Standing Offer (RISO) is for the supply, delivery and off-loading of **Dairy, Egg and Cheese products** required by the Correctional Service Canada, Bowden and Drumheller Institutions located at Bowden and Innisfail, Alberta. All products required must be alcohol free. No glass containers will be accepted.

The items and estimated quantities required are listed in Annex B, Working Documents - Lists of Products.

**Note: Offerors are required to submit offer(s) for at least one (1) of the Dairy, Egg and Cheese Product Lists, but are not required to submit offers for ALL three. Offerors must provide pricing for a minimum of ninety-five (95) percent of the items listed on the Product List(s) they submit an offer for.**

**Up to three (3) Standing Offers may be awarded, but only one (1) Standing Offer will be awarded per Product List .**

**Period of Standing Offer:**

Date of Standing Offer award to 30 June 2013.

**3. Debriefings**

After issuance of a standing offer, offerors may request a debriefing on the results of the request for standing offers process. Offerors should make the request to the Standing Offer Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the request for standing offers process. The debriefing may be provided in writing, by telephone or in person.

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## 2. Submission of Offers

Offers must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on the Schedule of Tender Closing Dates included in the Working Documents (Annex B).

You must submit your offer (**by mail or facsimile**) prior to the closing time and date.

## 3. Enquiries - Request for Standing Offers

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Standing Offer Authority no later than five (5) calendar days before the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Offerors should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the RFSO to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by offerors to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the questions or may request that offerors do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered with copies to all offerors. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all offerors may not be answered by Canada.

## 4. Applicable Laws

The Standing Offer and any contract resulting from the Standing Offer must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Alberta.

### 2. Basis of Selection

#### 2.1 Basis of Selection

An offer must comply with the requirements of the Request for Standing Offers to be declared responsive. The responsive offer with the lowest total evaluated aggregate price will be recommended for issuance of a standing offer.

The lowest total evaluated aggregate price for each offer is calculated by multiplying the unit price for each item by its associated estimated quantity and summing the values.

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## PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS

## **7.1 Inspection and Acceptance**

The Project Authority is the Inspection Authority. All reports, deliverable items, documents, goods and all services rendered under the Contract are subject to inspection by the Inspection Authority or representative.
