Electrical/Lighting: Matrix included with Medium sized cases only: Lighting: Upper lighting element with low museum level UV and heat emitting lighting element that allow for installation of multi-level Lux lamps or bulbs.

Any electrical and LED components MUST BE in accordance with CSA requirement and Manitoba Electrical Code. Further: Lighting element required for Medium size cases only.
