PART 1- GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Introduction

The bid solicitation is divided into seven parts plus attachments and annexes, as follows:

- Part 1 General Information: provides a general description of the requirement;
- Part 2 Bidder Instructions: provides the instructions, clauses and conditions applicable to the bid solicitation;
- Part 3 Bid Preparation Instructions: provides Bidders with instructions on how to prepare their bid;
- Part 4 Evaluation Procedures and Basis of Selection: indicates how the evaluation will be conducted, the evaluation criteria that must be addressed in the bid, if applicable, and the basis of selection;
- Part 5 Certifications: includes the certifications to be provided; and
- Part 6 Resulting Contract Clauses: includes the clauses and conditions that will apply to any resulting contract.

The annexes include the Basis of Payment, the Statement of Work, and the Evaluation Criteria. The attachments include the Bid Submission Form.

1.2 Summary

- (a) This bid solicitation is being issued to satisfy the requirement of Public Works and Government Services Canada (the "**Client**") for the provisions of Data Conversion.
- (b) It is intended to result in the award of a contract for one year.
- (c) The requirement is subject to the provisions of the World Trade Organization Agreement on Government Procurement (WTO-AGP), the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT), the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), the Canada-Chile Free Trade Agreement (CCFTA), the Canada-Peru Free Trade Agreement (CPFTA), the Canada-Colombia Free Trade Agreement (CColFTA), the Canada-Panama Free Trade Agreement (CPanFTA).

1.3 Debriefings

After contract award, Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be provided in writing, by telephone or in person.

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

- (a) All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.
- (b) Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.
- (c) The 2003 (2012-11-19) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation. If there is a conflict between the provisions of 2003 and this document, this document prevails.

The text under Subsection 4 of Section 01 – Code of Conduct and Certifications of 2003 referenced above is replaced by:

Bidders should provide, with their bid or promptly thereafter, a complete list of names of all individuals who are currently directors of the Bidder. If such a list has not been received by the time the evaluation of bids is completed, Canada will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to provide such a list within the required time frame will render the bid non-responsive. Bidders must always submit the list of directors before contract award.

Canada may, at any time, request that a Bidder provide properly completed and Signed Consent Forms (*Consent to a Criminal Record Verification form - PWGSC-TPSGC 229*) for any or all individuals named in the aforementioned list within a specified delay. Failure to provide such Consent Forms within the delay will result in the bid being declared non-responsive.

The text under Subsection 5 of Section 01 – Code of Conduct and Certifications of 2003 referenced above is replaced by:

The Bidder must diligently maintain the list up-to-date by informing Canada in writing of any change occurring during the validity period of the bid, and must also provide Canada, when requested, with the corresponding Consent Forms. The Bidder will also be required to diligently maintain the list and when requested, provide Consent Forms during the period of any contract arising from this bid solicitation.

- (d) Subsection 5(4) of 2003, Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements is amended as follows:
 - (i) Delete: sixty (60) days
 - (ii) Insert: one hundred and eight (180) days

2.2 Submission of Bids

- (a) Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.
- (b) Due to the nature of the bid solicitation, bids transmitted by facsimile to Public Works and Government Services Canada will not be accepted.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

- (a) All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than ten (10) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.
- (b) Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a "proprietary" nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as proprietary will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the questions or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered with copies to all bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Note to Bidders: *A bidder may, at its discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of its bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of its choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidder. Bidders are requested to indicate the Canadian province or territory they wish to apply to any resulting contract in their Bid Submission Form.*

2.5 Improvement of Requirement During Solicitation Period

If bidders consider that the specifications or Statement of Work contained in the bid solicitation could be improved technically or technologically, bidders are invited to make suggestions, in writing, to the Contracting Authority named in the bid solicitation. Bidders must clearly outline the suggested improvement as well as the reasons for the suggestion. Suggestions that do not restrict the level of competition nor favour a particular bidder will be given consideration provided they are submitted to the Contracting Authority in accordance with the article entitled "Enquiries - Bid Solicitation". Canada will have the right to accept or reject any or all suggestions.

2.6 Basis for Canada's Ownership of Intellectual Property

Canada has determined that any intellectual property rights arising from the performance of the Work under the resulting contract will belong to Canada, on the following grounds:

- (i) Section 6: "Exceptions to Contractor Ownership" of the Treasury Board Secretariat - 6.4.1 the main purpose of the contract, or of the deliverables contracted for, is to generate knowledge and information for public dissemination.

2.7 Volumetric Data

The bibliographic data in non-Machine Readable Cataloging (MARC) 21 format has been provided to Bidders to assist them in preparing their bids. The inclusion of this data in this bid solicitation does not represent a commitment by Canada that Canada's future usage of data conversion will be consistent with this data. It is provided purely for information purposes.

PART 3 - BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Bid Preparation Instructions

- (a) **Copies of Bid:** Canada requests that bidders provide their bid in separately bound sections as follows:
- (i) Section I: Technical Bid (3 hard copies)
 - (ii) Section II: Financial Bid (1 hard copy)
 - (iii) Section III: Certifications (1 hard copy)
- Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.
- (b) **Format for Bid:** Canada requests that bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their bid:
- (i) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
 - (ii) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation;
 - (iii) include a title page at the front of each volume of the bid that includes the title, date, bid solicitation number, Bidder's name and address and contact information of its representative; and
 - (iv) include a table of contents.
- (c) **Canada's Policy on Green Procurement:** In April 2006, Canada issued a policy directing federal departments and agencies to take the necessary steps to incorporate environmental considerations into the procurement process. See the Policy on Green Procurement (<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html>). To assist Canada in reaching its objectives, bidders are encouraged to:
- (i) use paper containing fibre certified as originating from a sustainably-managed forest and/or containing a minimum of 30% recycled content; and
 - (ii) use an environmentally-preferable format including black and white printing instead of colour printing, printing double sided/duplex, and using staples or clips instead of cerlox, duotangs or binders.
- (d) **Submission of Only One Bid from a Bidding Group:**
- (i) The submission of more than one bid from members of the same bidding group is not permitted in response to this bid solicitation. If members of a bidding group participate in more than one bid, Canada will choose in its discretion which bid to consider.
 - (ii) For the purposes of this article, "**bidding group**" means all entities (whether those entities include one or more natural persons, corporations, partnerships, limited liability partnerships, etc.) that are related to one another. Regardless of the jurisdiction where any of the entities concerned is incorporated or otherwise formed as a matter of law, entities are considered "**related**" for the purposes of this bid solicitation if:
 - (A) they are the same legal entity (i.e., the same natural person, corporation, partnership, limited liability partnership, etc.);
 - (B) they are "related persons" or "affiliated persons" according to the *Canada Income Tax Act*,

- (C) the entities have now or in the two years before bid closing had a fiduciary relationship with one another (either as a result of an agency arrangement or any other form of fiduciary relationship); or
- (D) the entities otherwise do not deal with one another at arm's length, or each of them does not deal at arm's length with the same third party.

3.2 Section I: Technical Bid

- (a) In their technical bid, bidders must demonstrate their understanding of the requirements contained in the bid solicitation and explain how they will meet these requirements. Bidders must demonstrate their capability and describe their approach in a thorough, concise and clear manner for carrying out the work. The technical bid must address clearly and in sufficient depth the points that are subject to the evaluation criteria against which the bid will be evaluated. Simply repeating the statement contained in the bid solicitation is not sufficient. In order to facilitate the evaluation of the bid, Canada requests that bidders address and present topics in the order of the evaluation criteria under the same headings. To avoid duplication, bidders may refer to different sections of their bids by identifying the specific paragraph and page number where the subject topic has already been addressed.
- (b) The technical bid consists of the following:
 - (i) **Bid Submission Form:** Bidders are requested to include the Bid Submission Form with their bids. It provides a common form in which bidders can provide information required for evaluation and contract award, such as a contact name, the Bidder's Procurement Business Number, the Bidder's status under the Federal Contractors Program for Employment Equity, etc. Using the form to provide this information is not mandatory, but it is recommended. If Canada determines that the information required by the Bid Submission Form is incomplete or requires correction, Canada will provide the Bidder with an opportunity to do so.
 - (ii) **Substantiation of Technical Compliance Form:** The technical bid must substantiate the compliance with the specific articles of Annex "C", which is the requested format for providing the substantiation. The substantiation must not simply be a repetition of the requirement(s), but must explain and demonstrate how the Bidder will meet the requirements and carry out the required Work. Simply stating that the Bidder or its proposed solution or product complies is not sufficient. Where Canada determines that the substantiation is not complete, the Bidder will be considered non-responsive and disqualified. The substantiation may refer to additional documentation submitted with the bid - this information can be referenced in the "Bidder's Response" column of Annex "C", where Bidders are requested to indicate where in the bid the reference material can be found, including the title of the document, and the page and paragraph numbers; where the reference is not sufficiently precise, Canada may request that the Bidder direct Canada to the appropriate location in the documentation.
 - (iii) **Customer Reference Contract Information:**
 - (A) The Bidder must provide customer references who must each confirm, if requested by PWGSC, the facts identified in the Bidder's proposal. For each customer reference, the Bidder must, at a minimum, provide the name and either the telephone number or e-mail address for a contact person. Bidders are also requested to include the title of the contact person.
 - (B) The form of question to be used to request confirmation from customer references is as follows:

[Sample Question to Customer Reference: "Has [the bidder] provided your organization with [describe the services and, if applicable, describe any required time frame within which those services must have been provided]?"

Yes, the bidder has provided my organization with the services described above.

No, the bidder has not provided my organization with the services described above.

I am unwilling or unable to provide any information about the services described above.]

- (C) If there is a conflict between the information provided by the customer reference and the bid, the information provided by the customer reference will be evaluated instead of the information in the bid. If the named individual is unavailable when required during the evaluation period, the Bidder may provide the name and contact information of an alternate contact from the same customer.
- (D) Crown references will be accepted.

3.3 Section II: Financial Bid

- (a) **Pricing:** Bidders must submit their financial bid in accordance with the Basis of Payment in Annex A. The total amount of Goods and Services Tax or Harmonized Sales Tax must be shown separately, if applicable. Unless otherwise indicated, bidders must include a single, firm, all-inclusive price quoted in Canadian dollars in each cell requiring an entry in the pricing tables.
- (b) **All Costs to be Included:** The financial bid must include all costs for the requirement described in the bid solicitation for the entire Contract Period, including any option years. The identification of all necessary equipment, software, peripherals, cabling and components required to meet the requirements of the bid solicitation and the associated costs of these items is the sole responsibility of the Bidder.
- (c) **Blank Prices:** Bidders are requested to insert "\$0.00" for any item for which it does not intend to charge or for items that are already included in other prices set out in the tables. If the Bidder leaves any price blank, Canada will treat the price as "\$0.00" for evaluation purposes and may request that the Bidder confirm that the price is, in fact, \$0.00. No Bidder will be permitted to add or change a price as part of this confirmation. Any Bidder who does not confirm that the price for a blank item is \$0.00 will be declared non-responsive.

3.4 Section III: Certifications

Bidders must submit the certifications required under Part 5.

PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria. There are several steps in the evaluation process, which are described below. Even though the evaluation and selection will be conducted in steps, the fact that Canada has proceeded to a later step does not mean that Canada has conclusively determined that the Bidder has successfully passed all the previous steps. Canada may conduct steps of the evaluation in parallel.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.
- (c) In addition to any other time periods established in the bid solicitation:
- (i) **Requests for Clarifications:** If Canada seeks clarification or verification from the Bidder about its bid, the Bidder will have 2 working days (or a longer period if specified in writing by the Contracting Authority) to provide the necessary information to Canada. Failure to meet this deadline will result in the bid being declared non-responsive.
 - (ii) **Requests for Further Information:** If Canada requires additional information in order to do any of the following pursuant to the Section entitled "Conduct of Evaluation" in 2003, Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements:
 - (A) verify any or all information provided by the Bidder in its bid;
 - (B) contact any or all references supplied by the Bidder (e.g., references named in the résumés of individual resources) to verify and validate any information submitted by the Bidder,the Bidder must provide the information requested by Canada within 2 working days of a request by the Contracting Authority.
 - (iii) **Extension of Time:** If additional time is required by the Bidder, the Contracting Authority may grant an extension in his or her sole discretion.

4.2 Technical Evaluation

- (a) **Mandatory Technical Criteria:** Each bid will be reviewed to determine whether it meets the mandatory requirements of the bid solicitation. Any element of the bid solicitation identified with the words "must" or "mandatory" is a mandatory requirement. Bids that do not comply with each and every mandatory requirement will be declared non-responsive and be disqualified. The mandatory requirements are described in Annex C.
- (b) **Customer Reference Checks:**
- (i) For reference checks, Canada will conduct the reference check in writing by email. Canada will send all email reference check requests to contacts supplied by all the Bidders on the same day using the email address provided in the bid. Canada will not award any points unless the response is received within 5 working days of the date that Canada's email was sent.
 - (ii) On the third working day after sending out the reference check request, if Canada has not received a response, Canada will notify the Bidder by email, to allow the Bidder to contact its reference directly to ensure that it responds to Canada within 5 working days. If the individual named by a Bidder is unavailable when required during the evaluation period, the Bidder may provide the name and email address of an alternate contact person from the same customer. Bidders will only be provided with this opportunity once for each customer, and only if the originally named individual is unavailable to respond (i.e., the Bidder will not be provided with an opportunity to submit the name of an alternate contact

person if the original contact person indicates that he or she is unwilling or unable to respond). The Bidder will have 24 hours to submit the name of a new contact. That contact will again be given 5 working days to respond once Canada sends its reference check request.

- (iii) Wherever information provided by a reference differs from the information supplied by the Bidder, the information supplied by the reference will be the information evaluated.
- (iv) Points will not be allocated and/or a bidder will not meet the mandatory experience requirement (as applicable) if the reference customer is not a customer of the Bidder itself (for example, the customer cannot be the customer of an affiliate of the Bidder instead of being a customer of the Bidder itself). Nor will points be allocated if the customer is itself an affiliate or other entity that does not deal at arm's length with the Bidder.
- (v) Whether or not to conduct reference checks is discretionary. However, if PWGSC chooses to conduct reference checks for any given rated or mandatory requirement, it will check the references for that requirement for all bidders who have not, at that point, been found non-responsive.

4.3 FINANCIAL EVALUATION

(a) Financial Calculation

- (i) A financial evaluation will be performed only on proposals that are technically responsive. A technically responsive proposal is a proposal that meets all mandatory criteria.
 - (A) The Financial Proposal will be evaluated by the PWGSC Contracting Authority, independently of the technical proposals.
 - (B) The price of proposals will be evaluated in Canadian dollars, Goods and Services Tax (GST) and Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) excluded, Customs duties and Excise taxes included.
- (ii) For the purpose of bid evaluation, the total evaluated price will be calculated in the Basis of Payment contained in Annex "A".

(b) Formulae in Pricing Tables

If the pricing tables provided to Bidders include any formulae, Canada may re-input the prices provided by Bidders into a fresh table, if Canada believes that the formulae may no longer be functioning properly in the version submitted by a Bidder.

(c) Substantiation of Professional Services Rates

In Canada's experience, bidders will from time to time propose rates at the time of bidding for one or more categories of resources that they later refuse to honour, on the basis that these rates do not allow them to recover their own costs and/or make a profit. When evaluating the rates bid for professional services, Canada may, but will have no obligation to, require price support in accordance with this Article. If Canada requests price support, it will be requested from all otherwise responsive bidders who have proposed a rate that is at least 20% lower than the median rate bid by all responsive bidders for the relevant resource category or categories. If Canada requests price support, the following information is required:

- (i) an invoice (referencing a contract serial number or other unique contract identifier) that shows that the Bidder has provided and invoiced a customer (with whom the Bidder deals at arm's length) for services performed for that customer similar to the services that would be provided in the relevant resource category, where those services were provided for at least three months within the twelve months before the bid solicitation closing date, and the fees charged were equal to or less than the rate offered to Canada;

- (ii) in relation to the invoice in (i), evidence from the Bidder's customer that the services identified in the invoice include at least 50% of the tasks listed in the Statement of Work for the category of resource being assessed for an unreasonably low rate. This evidence must consist of either a copy of the contract (which must describe the services to be provided and demonstrate that at least 50% of the tasks to be performed are the same as those to be performed under the Statement of Work in this bid solicitation) or the customer's signed certification that the services subject to the charges in the invoice included at least 50% of the same tasks to be performed under the Statement of Work in this bid solicitation);
- (iii) in respect of each contract for which an invoice is submitted as substantiation, a résumé for the resource that provided the services under that contract that demonstrates that, in relation to the resource category for which the rates are being substantiated, the resource would meet the mandatory requirements and achieve any required pass mark for any rated criteria; and
- (iv) the name, telephone number and, if available, email address of a contact person at the customer who received each invoice submitted under (i), so that Canada may verify any information provided by the Bidder.

Once Canada requests substantiation of the rates bid for any resource category, it is the sole responsibility of the Bidder to submit information (as described above and as otherwise may be requested by Canada, including information that would allow Canada to verify information with the resource proposed) that will allow Canada to determine whether it can rely, with confidence, on the Bidder's ability to provide the required services at the rates bid. If Canada determines that the information provided by the Bidder does not adequately substantiate the unreasonably low rates, the bid will be declared non-responsive.

4.4 Basis of Selection

- (a) A bid must comply with the requirements of the bid solicitation and meet all mandatory evaluation criteria in this bid solicitation to be declared responsive.
- (b) The responsive bid that obtains the highest Total Bidder Score will be recommended for award of a contract. For any given Bidder, the greatest possible Total Data Record Sets (DRS) Score is 60 while the greatest possible Total Financial Score is 40.

Step 1: Calculation of Total DRS Score:

- (A) Bidders will need to determine the number of bibliographic records, Appendix 5 to Annex B - DRS1, that can be converted to enhanced records. Bidders will need to download the bibliographic records, Appendix 5 to Annex B - DRS1, that has been provided with the solicitation document in order to determine the number of enhanced records.
- (B) The Total DRS Score will be computed for each responsive bid by converting the number of enhanced records obtained from the DRS1 package provided, using the following formula, rounded to two decimal places:

$$\frac{\text{Number of Enhanced Records from DRS1}}{\text{Total Number of DRS1 Provided}} \times 60 = \text{Total DRS Score}$$

Step 2: Calculation of Total Financial Score: The Total Financial Score will be computed for each responsive bid by converting the Total Financial Price using the following formula rounded to two decimal places:

$$\frac{\text{Lowest Total Financial Price}}{\text{Lowest Total Financial Price}} \times 40 = \text{Total Financial Score}$$

Bidder's Total Financial Price

Step 3: Calculation of the Total Bidder Score: The Total Bidder Score will be computed for each responsive bid in accordance with the following formula:

$$\text{Total DRS Score} + \text{Total Financial Score} = \text{Total Bidder Score}$$

- (e) Bidders should note that all contract awards are subject to Canada's internal approvals process, which includes a requirement to approve funding in the amount of any proposed contract. Despite the fact that the Bidder may have been recommended for contract award, a contract will only be awarded if internal approval is granted according to Canada's internal policies. If approval is not granted, no contract will be awarded.

PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS

Bidders must provide the required certifications to be awarded a contract. Canada will declare a bid non-responsive if the required certifications are not completed and submitted in accordance with the articles below.

Compliance with the certifications Bidders provide to Canada is subject to verification by Canada during the bid evaluation period (before award of a contract) and after award of a contract. The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify Bidders' compliance with the certifications before award of a contract. The bid will be declared non-responsive if any certification made by the Bidder is untrue, whether made knowingly or unknowingly. Failure to comply with the certifications or to comply with the request of the Contracting Authority for additional information will also render the bid non-responsive.

5.1 Certification Precedent to Contract Award

The certifications listed below should be completed and submitted with the bid, but may be submitted afterwards. If any of these required certifications is not completed and submitted as requested, the Contracting Authority will so inform the Bidder and provide the Bidder with a time frame within which to meet the requirement. Failure to comply with the request of the Contracting Authority and meet the requirement within that time period will render the bid non-responsive.

5.2 Federal Contractors Program - Certification

- (a) The Federal Contractors Program for Employment Equity (FCP) requires that some suppliers, including a supplier who is a member of a joint venture, bidding for federal government contracts, valued at \$200,000 or more (including all applicable taxes), make a formal commitment to implement employment equity.  - (ii) not subject to FCP, being a regulated employer under the *Employment Equity Act*, S.C. 1995, c. 44;
 - (iii) subject to the requirements of FCP, because it has a workforce of 100 or more permanent full or part-time permanent employees, or temporary employees having worked 12 weeks or more in Canada, but it has not previously obtained a certificate

- number from HRSD (because it has not bid before on requirements of \$200,000 or more), in which case a duly signed certificate of commitment is required from the Bidder; or
- (iv) subject to FCP, and has a valid certification number (e.g., has not been declared an ineligible contractor by HRSDC).

- (iii) **"pension"** means, in the context of the fee abatement formula, a pension or annual allowance paid under the *Public Service Superannuation Act* (PSSA), R.S., 1985, c. P-36, and any increases paid pursuant to the *Supplementary Retirement Benefits Act*, R.S. 1985, c. S-24 as it affects the PSSA. It does not include pensions payable pursuant to the *Canadian Forces Superannuation Act*, R.S., 1985, c. C-17, the *Defence Services Pension Continuation Act*, 1970, c. D-3, the *Royal Canadian Mounted Police Pension Continuation Act*, 1970, c. R-10, and the *Royal Canadian Mounted Police Superannuation Act*, R.S., 1985, c. R-11, the *Members of Parliament Retiring Allowances Act*, R.S., 1985, c. M-5, and that portion of pension payable to the *Canadian Pension Plan Act*, R.S., 1985, c. C-8.
- (c) If the Bidder is an FPS in receipt of a pension as defined above, the Bidder must provide the following information:
- (i) name of former public servant;
- (ii) date of termination of employment or retirement from the Public Service.
- (d) If the Bidder is an FPS who received a lump sum payment pursuant to the terms of a work force reduction program, the Bidder must provide the following information:
- (i) name of former public servant;

-
- (ii) conditions of the lump sum payment incentive;
 - (iii) date of termination of employment;
 - (iv) amount of lump sum payment;
 - (v) rate of pay on which lump sum payment is based;
 - (vi) period of lump sum payment including start date, end date and number of weeks; and
 - (vii) number and amount (professional fees) of other contracts subject to the restrictions of a work force reduction program.
- (e) For all contracts awarded during the lump sum payment period, the total amount of fee that may be paid to a FPS who received a lump sum payment is \$5,000, including the Goods and Services Tax or Harmonized Sales Tax.
- (f) By submitting a bid, the Bidder certifies that the information submitted by the Bidder in response to the above requirements is accurate and complete.

Note to Bidders: Bidders are requested to provide the information required by this clause in their Bid Submission Form.

5.4 Code of Conduct Certifications - Certifications Required Precedent to Contract Award

Bidders should provide, with their bids or promptly thereafter, a complete list of names of all individuals who are currently directors of the Bidder. If such a list has not been received by the time the evaluation of bids is completed, the Contracting Authority will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Bidders must submit the list of directors before contract award, failure to provide such a list within the required time frame will render the bid non-responsive.

The Contracting Authority may, at any time, request that a Bidder provide properly completed and Signed Consent Forms (*Consent to a Criminal Record Verification form - PWGSC-TPSGC 229*) for any or all individuals named in the aforementioned list within a specified delay. Failure to provide such Consent Forms within the delay will result in the bid being declared non-responsive.

PART 6 - RESULTING CONTRACT CLAUSES

6.1 Requirement

- (a) _____ (**the Contractor**) agrees to supply to the Client the services described in the Contract, including the Statement of Work, in accordance with and at the prices set out in the Contract. This includes providing professional services, as and when requested by Canada to one or more locations to be designated by Canada, excluding any locations in areas subject to any of the Comprehensive Land Claims Agreements.
- (b) **Client:** Under the Contract, the "**Client**" is the Publishing and Depository Services.
- (c) **Reorganization of Client:** The Contractor's obligation to perform the Work will not be affected by (and no additional fees will be payable as a result of) the renaming, reorganization, reconfiguration, or restructuring of any Client. The reorganization, reconfiguration and restructuring of the Client includes the privatization of the Client, its merger with another entity, or its dissolution, where that dissolution is followed by the creation of another entity or entities with mandates similar to the original Client. In connection with any form of reorganization, Canada may designate another department or government body as the Contracting Authority or Technical Authority, as required to reflect the new roles and responsibilities associated with the reorganization.
- (d) **Defined Terms:** Words and expressions defined in the General Conditions or Supplemental General Conditions and used in the Contract have the meanings given to them in the General Conditions or Supplemental General Conditions. Any reference to an Identified User in the Supply Arrangement is a reference to the Client. Also, any reference to a "**deliverable**" or "**deliverables**" includes all documentation outlined in this contract.

6.2 Minimum Work Guarantee

- (a) In this clause,
- (i) "**Maximum Contract Value**" means the amount specified in the "**Limitation of Expenditure**" clause set out in the Contract (excluding GST/HST); and
- (ii) "**Minimum Contract Value**" means 1% of the Maximum Contract Value on the date the contract is first issued.
- (b) Canada's obligation under the Contract is to request Work in the amount of the Minimum Contract Value or, at Canada's option, to pay the Contractor at the end of the Contract in accordance with sub-article (c), subject to sub-article (d). In consideration of such obligation, the Contractor agrees to stand in readiness throughout the Contract Period to perform the Work described in the Contract. Canada's maximum liability for work performed under the Contract must not exceed the Maximum Contract Value, unless an increase is authorized in writing by the Contracting Authority.
- (c) In the event that Canada does not request work in the amount of the Minimum Contract Value during the Contract Period, Canada must pay the Contractor the difference between the Minimum Contract Value and the total cost of the Work requested.
- (d) Canada will have no obligation to the Contractor under this article if Canada terminates the entire Contract
- (i) for default;
- (ii) for convenience as a result of any decision or recommendation of a tribunal or court that the contract be cancelled, re-tendered or awarded to another supplier; or
- (iii) for convenience within ten business days of Contract award.

6.3 Standard Clauses and Conditions

All clauses and conditions identified in the Contract by number, date and title are set out in the Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual (<http://ccua-sacc.pwgsc.gc.ca/pub/acho-eng.jsp>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

6.6 Payment**(a) Basis of Payment - Firm Lot Prices**

- (i) In consideration of the Contractor satisfactorily completing all of its obligations under the Contract, the Contractor will be paid a firm lot price, as specified in Annex A for a cost of \$ _____. Customs duties are excluded and Applicable Taxes are extra.
- (ii) **Competitive Award:** The Contractor acknowledges that the Contract has been awarded as a result of a competitive process. No additional charges will be allowed to compensate for errors, oversights, misconceptions or underestimates made by the Contractor when bidding for the Contract.
- (iii) **Purpose of Estimates:** All estimated costs contained in the Contract are included solely for the administrative purposes of Canada and do not represent a commitment on the part of Canada to purchase services in these amounts. Any commitment to purchase specific amounts or values of services are described elsewhere in the Contract.

(b) Limitation of Expenditure

Canada will not pay the Contractor for any design changes, modifications or interpretations of the Work, unless they have been approved, in writing, by the Contracting Authority before their incorporation into the Work.

(c) Method of Payment - Multiple Payments

- (i) Canada will pay the Contractor upon completion and delivery of records in accordance with the payment provisions of the Contract if:

- (A) an accurate and complete invoice and any other documents required by the Contract have been submitted in accordance with the invoicing instructions provided in the Contract;
- (B) all such documents have been verified by Canada;
- (C) the Work delivered has been accepted by Canada.
- (ii) Suppliers are to bid a firm lot price based on all records being supplied under each record set. Due to the large amount of bibliographic records for conversion under record set DRS1 (69,902), provisions are being incorporated to allow for partial payment of the records up to a maximum amount not to exceed 34,951 records monthly. Upon completion and acceptance of the records, and in accordance with the payment provisions described in this Sub-article (c), the price calculation, for payment purposes only, will be based on the monthly records received and computed using the following formula rounded to two decimal places.

$$\frac{\text{Lot Price for DRS1 (taxes excluded)}}{\text{DRS1 Total Quantity (69,902)}} \times \text{number of monthly records delivered} = \text{Monthly Price}$$

The above partial payment provisions have been granted to the set of records under DRS1 only. The final delivery of the total converted records under DRS1, as well as DRS2 and DRS3, must be in accordance with the delivery schedule outlined in Table 1 of the Statement of Work.

- (d) **No Responsibility to Pay for Work not performed due to Closure of Government Offices**
- (i) Where the Contractor, its employees, subcontractors, or agents are providing services on government premises under the Contract and those premises are inaccessible because of the evacuation or closure of government offices, and as a result no work is performed, Canada is not responsible for paying the Contractor for work that otherwise would have been performed if there had been no evacuation or closure.
- (ii) If, as a result of any strike or lock-out, the Contractor or its employees, subcontractors or agents cannot obtain access to government premises and, as a result, no work is performed, Canada is not responsible for paying the Contractor for work that otherwise would have been performed if the Contractor had been able to gain access to the premises.

6.7 Invoicing Instructions

- (a) The Contractor must submit invoices in accordance with the information required in the General Conditions.
- (b) The Contractor's invoice must include a separate line item for each subparagraph in the Basis of Payment provision.
- (c) By submitting invoices, the Contractor is certifying that the goods have been delivered and that all charges are in accordance with the Basis of Payment provision of the Contract, including any charges for work performed by subcontractors.
- (d) The Contractor must provide the original of each invoice to the Technical Authority, and a copy to the Contracting Authority.

6.8 Certifications

Compliance with the certifications provided by the Contractor in its bid is a condition of the Contract and subject to verification by Canada during the entire Contract Period. If the Contractor does not comply with

any certification or it is determined that any certification made by the Contractor in its bid is untrue, whether made knowingly or unknowingly, Canada has the right, under the default provision of the Contract, to terminate the Contract for default.

6.9 Applicable Laws

The Contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in _____.

6.10 Priority of Documents

If there is a discrepancy between the wording of any documents that appear on the following list, the wording of the document that first appears on the list has priority over the wording of any document that appears later on the list:

- (f) Annex C, Evaluation Criteria; and

6.14 Limitation of Liability - Information Management/Information Technology

- (a) This section applies despite any other provision of the Contract and replaces the section of the general conditions entitled "Liability". Any reference in this section to damages caused by the Contractor also includes damages caused by its employees, as well as its subcontractors, agents, and representatives, and any of their employees. This section applies regardless of whether the claim is based in contract, tort, or another cause of action. The Contractor is not liable to Canada with respect to the performance of or failure to perform the Contract, except as described in this section and in any section of the Contract pre-establishing any liquidated damages. The Contractor is only liable for indirect, special or consequential damages to the extent described in this section, even if it has been made aware of the potential for those damages.
- (b) **First Party Liability:**
- (i) The Contractor is fully liable for all damages to Canada, including indirect, special or consequential damages, caused by the Contractor's performance or failure to perform the Contract that relate to:
 - (A) any infringement of intellectual property rights to the extent the Contractor breaches the section of the general conditions entitled "Intellectual Property Infringement and Royalties";
 - (B) physical injury, including death.
 - (ii) The Contractor is liable for all direct damages caused by the Contractor's performance or failure to perform the Contract affecting real or tangible personal property owned, possessed, or occupied by Canada.
 - (iii) Each of the Parties is liable for all direct damages resulting from its breach of confidentiality under the Contract. Each of the Parties is also liable for all indirect, special or consequential damages in respect of any unauthorized disclosure of the other Party's trade secrets (or trade secrets of a third party provided by one Party to another under the Contract) relating to information technology.
 - (iv) The Contractor is liable for all direct damages relating to any encumbrance or claim relating to any portion of the Work for which Canada has made any payment. This does not apply to encumbrances or claims relating to intellectual property rights, which are addressed under (i)(A) above.
 - (v) The Contractor is also liable for any other direct damages to Canada caused by the Contractor's performance or failure to perform the Contract that relate to:
 - (A) any breach of the warranty obligations under the Contract, up to the total amount paid by Canada (including any applicable taxes) for the goods and services affected by the breach of warranty; and
 - (B) any other direct damages, including all identifiable direct costs to Canada associated with re-procuring the Work from another party if the Contract is terminated by Canada either in whole or in part for default, up to an aggregate maximum for this subparagraph (B) of the greater of 75% times the total estimated cost (meaning the dollar amount shown on the first page of the Contract in the block titled "Total Estimated Cost" or shown on each call-up, purchase order or other document used to order goods or services under this instrument), or \$1,000,000.00.

In any case, the total liability of the Contractor under subparagraph (v) will not exceed the total estimated cost (as defined above) for the Contract or \$1,000,000.00 whichever is more.

- (vi) If Canada's records or data are harmed as a result of the Contractor's negligence or willful act, the Contractor's only liability is, at the Contractor's own expense, to restore Canada's records and data using the most recent back-up kept by Canada. Canada is responsible for maintaining an adequate back up of its records and data.

(c) **Third Party Claims:**

- (i) Regardless of whether a third party makes its claim against Canada or the Contractor, each Party agrees that it is liable for any damages that it causes to any third party in connection with the Contract as set out in a settlement agreement or as finally determined by a court of competent jurisdiction, where the court determines that the Parties are jointly and severally liable or that one Party is solely and directly liable to the third party. The amount of the liability will be the amount set out in the settlement agreement or determined by the court to have been the Party's portion of the damages to the third party. No settlement agreement is binding on a Party unless its authorized representative has approved the agreement in writing.
- (ii) If Canada is required, as a result of joint and several liability, to pay a third party in respect of damages caused by the Contractor, the Contractor must reimburse Canada by the amount finally determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be the Contractor's portion of the damages to the third party. However, despite Sub-article (i), with respect to special, indirect, and consequential damages of third parties covered by this Section, the Contractor is only liable for reimbursing Canada for the Contractor's portion of those damages that Canada is required by a court to pay to a third party as a result of joint and several liability that relate to the infringement of a third party's intellectual property rights; physical injury of a third party, including death; damages affecting a third party's real or tangible personal property; liens or encumbrances on any portion of the Work; or breach of confidentiality.
- (iii) The Parties are only liable to one another for damages to third parties to the extent described in this Sub-article (c).

6.15 Joint Venture Contractor

- (a) The Contractor confirms that the name of the joint venture is _____ and that it is comprised of the following members: *[list all the joint venture members named in the Contractor's original bid]*.

- (d) All the members are jointly and severally or solidarily liable for the performance of the entire Contract.

- (e) The Contractor acknowledges that any change in the membership of the joint venture (i.e., a change in the number of members or the substitution of another legal entity for an existing member) constitutes an assignment and is subject to the assignment provisions of the General Conditions.
- (f) The Contractor acknowledges that all security and controlled goods requirements in the Contract, if any, apply to each member of the joint venture Contractor.

Note to Bidders: *This Article will be deleted if the bidder awarded the contract is not a joint venture. If the contractor is a joint venture, this clause will be completed with information provided in its bid.*

6.16 Safeguarding Electronic Media

- (a) Before using them on Canada's equipment or sending them to Canada, the Contractor must use a regularly updated product to scan electronically all electronic media used to perform the Work for computer viruses and other coding intended to cause malfunctions. The Contractor must notify Canada if any electronic media used for the Work are found to contain computer viruses or other coding intended to cause malfunctions.
- (b) If magnetically recorded information or documentation is damaged or lost while in the Contractor's care or at any time before it is delivered to Canada in accordance with the Contract, including accidental erasure, the Contractor must immediately replace it at its own expense.

6.17 Representations and Warranties

The Contractor made statements regarding its experience and expertise in its bid that resulted in the award of the Contract. The Contractor represents and warrants that all those statements are true and acknowledges that Canada relied on those statements in awarding the Contract. The Contractor also represents and warrants that it has, and all its resources and subcontractors that perform the Work have, and at all times during the Contract Period they will have, the skills, qualifications, expertise and experience necessary to perform and manage the Work in accordance with the Contract, and that the Contractor (and any resources or subcontractors it uses) has previously performed similar services for other customers.

6.18 Access to Canada's Property and Facilities

Canada's property, facilities, equipment, documentation, and personnel are not automatically available to the Contractor. If the Contractor would like access to any of these, it is responsible for making a request to the Technical Authority. Unless expressly stated in the Contract, Canada has no obligation to provide any of these to the Contractor. If Canada chooses, in its discretion, to make its property, facilities, equipment, documentation or personnel available to the Contractor to perform the Work, Canada may require an adjustment to the Basis of Payment and additional security requirements may apply.

6.19 Termination for Convenience

With respect to Article 30 of General Conditions 2035, subarticle 4 is deleted and replaced with the following subsections 4, 5 and 6:

4. The total of the amounts, to which the Contractor is entitled to be paid under this section, together with any amounts paid, due or becoming due to the Contractor must not exceed the Contract Price.

-
5. Where the Contracting Authority terminates the entire Contract and the Articles of Agreement include a Minimum Work Guarantee, the total amount to be paid to the Contractor under the Contract will not exceed the greater of
- (a) the total amount the Contractor may be paid under this section, together with any amounts paid, becoming due other than payable under the Minimum Revenue Guarantee, or due to the Contractor as of the date of termination, or
 - (b) the amount payable under the Minimum Work Guarantee, less any amounts paid, due or otherwise becoming due to the Contractor as of the date of termination.
6. The Contractor will have no claim for damages, compensation, loss of profit, allowance arising out of any termination notice given by Canada under this section except to the extent that this section expressly provides. The Contractor agrees to repay immediately to Canada the portion of any advance payment that is unliquidated at the date of the termination.

ANNEX B - STATEMENT OF WORK

1. Requirement

The Publishing and Depository Services (PDS) Directorate of the Integrated Services Branch of Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) requires the services of a company that has proven experience in the conversion of bibliographic records from a non-Machine Readable Cataloging (MARC) bibliographic format to a MARC21 format, including record matching and upgrading using MARC source records and transfer of local data.

2. Background

PDS publishes and distributes Government of Canada publications to depository libraries, the public, federal departments and agencies, parliamentarians, the private sector, and other levels of government. The mission of PDS is to ensure that Canadians have easy, ready, and equal access to federal government publications in all formats.

Since 2002, PDS has been using a software solution developed in-house to process and catalogue Government of Canada publications using a non-standard data format. PDS has made a strategic business decision to replace the current application with a MARC-based Integrated Library System (ILS). PDS requires professional services to convert its current bibliographic data set to MARC format.

3. Objective

The objective of the contract is to acquire data conversion services to convert PDS non-MARC bibliographic records to MARC21 bibliographic records for migration to a MARC-based ILS.

4. Responsibilities

The Contractor will be responsible for, without being limited to, the following tasks and deliverables:

Tasks:

1. Match Supplied XML monograph records to and replace with available MARC21 bibliographic records. At a minimum, this would include:
 - a. Review the Criteria for Data Conversion, Appendix 2 to Annex B, and propose a record matching strategy for best results.
 - b. Match records according to the Criteria for Data Conversion Decisions.
 - c. Match Supplied XML records to Supplied MARC records created by Library and Archives Canada (LAC).
 - d. If Supplied MARC records by LAC are not available replace Supplied XML records with Derived Records from other sources. Recommend a strategy to avoid error due to incorrect ISBNs in source records.
 - e. When not available as Derived records, convert Supplied XML records to MARC 21 bibliographic records.
2. Derive or convert Supplied Master Records (serials and series) as described above in Task 1.
3. Serial issue records are not part of this project but series (monographic series) issue records are included and should be replaced by Derived records or converted to MARC 21 bibliographic records as described above in Task 1. For every series issue record, add a series statement (MARC 490) and series added entry (MARC 800-830). In the case of converted records, the series title is recorded in the PDS English and French series title and subtitle (See Appendix 4).

4. Populate MARC fields of Derived records with specified local data from matching Supplied XML records, according to specifications in Appendix 3 and Appendix 4.
5. If no existing equivalent MARC records can be identified for Supplied XML records, then convert non-MARC Supplied XML records to MARC bibliographic records (as specified in Appendix 4 to Annex B). At a minimum, this would include:
 - a. Where no appropriate source records are available, the creation of a new MARC21 record (a Converted record) with PDS data copied according to specifications in the Data Map (Appendix 4 to Annex B).
 - b. Insert correct non-filing characters in the records.
 - c. Insert minimum data in 007 and 008 as identified in the Data Map.
 - d. Insert minimum data in other fields as identified in the Data Map.
6. Generate analytical reports to document work done, and identify problems and requirements for further data cleanup. Generate reports for each batch of records. As a minimum, the reports should include the following:
 - a. All Supplied records for which no match was found.
 - b. Report of Converted records.
 - c. Other errors identified by the Contractor.
 - d. Number of bibliographic records delivered.
 - e. Other reports recommended by or available from the Contractor.

Deliverables:

1. Write a data conversion plan. At a minimum, the plan should include:
 - a. Timelines, project activities and responsibilities of the Contractor and PDS.
 - b. Any recommended changes to the Data Map that would improve results. Identify and report proposed changes for discussion with PDS.
 - c. The recommended process to achieve best results for matching of bilingual records and creation of linking fields.
 - d. The recommended process to achieve best results for population of appropriate MARC fields in Derived record with specified local data elements from matching Supplied record.
 - e. Description of the level of manual review and manipulation needed to meet the requirements.
 - f. Description of the measures taken by the Bidder for quality control.
2. For each set of provided XML records, the complete set of MARC21 bibliographic records (the Delivered record set) in accordance to Table 1 below.
3. Format of Deliverables:
 - a. All bibliographic records should be in MARC21 format, and in UTF-8 or MARC-8 character encoding for correct transmission of diacritics and special characters. UTF-8 is preferred.
 - b. All reports should be in MS Word. An electronic copy and a hard copy are required.
 - c. All documents should be written in English.

4. Conversion of Data Record Sets (DRS) Schedule:

The Contractor will be provided with three sets of records for conversion. The first set of records, Appendix 5 to Annex B - DRS1, includes all records for conversion (enhanced and basic) up to and including June 26, 2013. The second set of records, DRS2, will be composed of records for conversion (enhanced and basic) and will be provided to the Contractor on January 2, 2014. The third set of records, DRS3, will be composed of records for conversion (enhanced and basic) and will be provided to the Contractor on April 1, 2014. The conversion of each set of records will have a firm delivery date. The below table outlines the delivery schedule, the number of records per set as well as providing an overview of the above.

5. Delivery and Acceptance:

- a. All deliverables are to be completed in accordance with the accepted schedule outline in Table 1: Data Record Sets Schedule.
- b. All deliverables will be subject to inspection and acceptance by the Technical Authority or designated representative. Inspection and acceptance of the work will be done within 10 business days.
- c. Should any deliverable not be in accordance with the requirements of the contract the Technical Authority will have the right to reject it or to require its correction before recommending payment.
- d. Any corrections must be completed with 10 business days of notification from the Technical Authority.

5. Client Support

PDS will provide the following data:

1. Non-MARC files in XML format with data dictionary. Data is consistently-coded. Supplied Records will be provided in categorized batches listed in Appendix 1 to Annex B.
2. Criteria for data conversion decisions (Appendix 2 to Annex B).
3. Data definition map for non-MARC and PDS-specific data fields and the MARC fields to which they should be copied (Appendix 4 to Annex B).
4. List of data elements in Supplied XML records to be copied to Derived records (Appendix 3 to Annex B).
5. The full set of Supplied XML records will be delivered in categorized batches to facilitate specific processing (Appendix 2, Article 6)
6. Diacritics in Supplied XML records will be in UTF-8.

6. Additional Information for Contractor

1. Background / History of the records

- a. Current bibliographic records were created in a non-MARC system that was launched in 2002. This system was populated at launch with records derived from a previous non-MARC system (MINISIS) that date back to 1992 approximately. Since 2002, the database has been populated with bibliographic records created to represent Government of Canada (GC) publications released since then as well as older publications supplied by GC organizations retroactively in electronic or hard-copy formats.
- b. Bibliographic data was created using AACR2 as a content standard but the non-MARC data standard was developed to support business requirements at the time. Records include many non-standard fields but many are now obsolete and will not be included in the set of Supplied records unless there is a continuing business requirement for them (e.g. Weekly Checklist Number, E-Book Number). PDS has provided a data mapping document, the first of two data sets for conversion, and criteria for data conversion decisions.

2. Other critical information:

- a. All bibliographic records from PDS have Government of Canada Catalogue numbers. Many of the records have ISBNs or ISSNs. Where there is an ISBN or ISSN in the Supplied XML record, it is authoritative (see 3a below).
- b. Bilingual publications are provided in a single PDS bilingual XML record, but PDS requires two MARC records (one English and one French) from this project for each of these.
- c. PDS requires separate records for every format that has been catalogued, e.g. PDF and EPUB.

3. Local practice affecting conversion

Local data fields to be converted in to the MARC records are specified in detail in the Data Map Appendix 4 and Appendix 3 Data Elements in Supplied Records to be copied to Derived Records.

Key practices are briefly described below:

- a. ISBN: PDS assigns ISBNs to Government of Canada publications under a delegated authority from Library and Archives Canada. Therefore PDS records have the correct ISBN in all cases. Other source records often have incorrect ISBNs because of errors made by author departments during their publication preparation. These errors are often subsequently recorded by cataloguing authorities that follow AACR2 regarding the Chief Source of Information for this data element. This will affect matching criteria and requires that PDS ISBN overwrites any source ISBN (if different) for a matching record.
- b. There are a number of specific PDS local fields and field data that should be copied from Supplied records and added to either Derived or Converted records as specified in Appendix 3.
- c. Serials: DSP cataloguing practice has been to catalogue a serial or series (monographic series) issue individually and associate it with a so-called "Master record". This was driven by a business requirement to have these issues individually represented in the inventory control system that manages ordering by and distribution to external clients. This requirement will end on or before April 1 2014. Therefore, in the new MARC based ILS, serial issues will be managed by a serials check-in function. Consequently, in this project Master records will be converted to MARC bibliographic serial records. Serials issue records are not part of this project.

-
- d. PDS maintains a bilingual subject thesaurus and applies subject descriptors derived from this thesaurus to its bibliographic records. These descriptors should be copied to all Derived or Converted records as specified in Appendix 3.
 - e. PDS creates separate records for different formats of the same publication, and links them. Often libraries catalogue the two formats in one record with one ISBN. PDS requires separate records with correct ISBNs for each format.
4. PDS cataloguing standard complies with Government of Canada Official Languages Act. PDS, as an official distributor of Government of Canada publications, must provide equal access to both official languages as appropriate. Cataloguing practice will follow that of Library and Archives Canada, viz:
- a. Unilingual publications in English or French are catalogued in the language of publication.
 - b. When there is both an English and a French edition of the same publication, the two language editions are linked. This link should be provided by MARC field 775.
 - c. Bilingual publications are catalogued with two equivalent records, one in English and one in French. The two equivalent records will use MARC 791 (English record) and 792 (French record) as linking fields.

Criteria for Data Conversion decisions:	guidelines for expected approach to data conversion (see Appendix 2)
Data Map:	Detailed list of PDS bibliographic data fields specifying where the data should be mapped to MARC21 (see Appendix 4)
Converted record:	a MARC record created by the contractor when a suitable Derived record is not available, that consists of data from a Supplied record converted to MARC 21 format using PDS supplied mapping.
Delivered record set:	a complete set of Derived and Converted records delivered as a result of this project
Derived record:	an existing MARC record available to the contractor, created by another cataloguing authority, and that is a match or equivalent to a given PDS record.
EBook Number	a unique bibliographic record number assigned by the current PDS system to all PDS bibliographic records when first created.
Government of Canada Catalogue Number	a unique, alpha-numeric number applied to every publication catalogued by the DSP (GC Cat. No.).
Supplied MARC record	a bibliographic record in MARC format supplied to the contractor by PDS. Such records have been created by Library and Archives Canada (LAC). Supplied MARC records are also Derived records.
Supplied XML record	a record supplied by PDS in non-MARC format that will require an equivalent MARC21 record as a deliverable.
Weekly Checklist of Canadian Government Publications	a catalogue of Government of Canada publications in all formats received by the Depository Services Program published in a print edition and online.
Weekly Checklist Number	a four digit hyphenated issue number of a Weekly Checklist issue having the form: "year year-issue issue".
Supplementary Checklist of Canadian Government Publications:	a catalogue published only online and on an occasional basis listing older electronic publications acquired by the Depository Services Program.
Supplementary Checklist Number	an alphanumeric issue number of a Supplementary Checklist issue having the form "year year-issue issue-Supp".

APPENDIX 2 TO ANNEX B

CRITERIA FOR DATA CONVERSION

1. Introduction

1. This section describes key criteria for data conversion decisions, and will be reviewed with the Contractor as part of the implementation.
2. Data Map for PDS local fields to MARC is provided in Appendix 4.
3. Data Elements in Supplied XML records to be Copied to Derived records is provided in Appendix 3.
4. Definitions are provided in Appendix 1.

2. Basic assumptions

1. The ISBNs assigned by PDS to GC publications and recorded in Supplied XML records for monographic publications are correct and have authority over all other sources.
Note: Supplied XML records may also contain ISBN assigned by other authorities. This often occurs in the case of co-published publications or non-government publications that have received a substantial level of funding or other participation by the Government of Canada. When such publications appear in the PDS catalogue, they are catalogued as if they were government publications.
2. Because Supplied XML records represent cataloguing of publications produced and published by Government of Canada organizations and distributed by the DSP to Depository Libraries, it is likely that MARC records created by various cataloguing authorities and equivalent to Supplied XML records are available.
3. The Government of Canada Catalogue Numbers assigned to Supplied records for monographic publications are correct and have authority over all other sources.
4. The ISSNs included in Supplied XML records are generally derived from LAC AMICUS serial records and may be assumed to be correct unless there is obvious and strong evidence that they are incorrect.
5. PDS will require two MARC bibliographic records (one English and one French) for every bilingual publication.
6. Unilingual publications in English or French will require catalogue records in the language of publication. Where there is both an English and a French edition of the same publication, PDS will require a linking field (expected to be 775).
7. Derived records may not include relationships to bibliographic records representing editions in other formats or languages. When Supplied XML records represent other formats and languages, then Derived or Converted records must be modified to include relationships with other represented formats and languages using linking fields as appropriate.
8. Subject headings and classification / call numbers should be accepted if they are in a Derived record. None should be created.
9. In the case of records for monographic series, PDS will require a series authority record and a linked record for every issue in the series for which a Supplied XML record is provided. Derived or Converted series issue records will include a series statement in MARC 490 and a link to the series title authority file in MARC 830.

10. The title of the Derived record should be retained and, if different or coded differently from the title in the Supplied XML record, then the title of the Supplied XML record should be placed in alternate title field (246).

11. Contractor deliverables will include a set of modified Derived records and a set of converted Supplied XML records, both in MARC21 format. Collectively, the two sets will provide MARC21 records for all Supplied XML records.

3. Data Elements for Record Matching Factors (MF)

1. Corporate Author (MF 1)

- a. A Supplied XML record will not have Corporate Author names recorded in a jurisdictional / legal name format common to MARC Authority Files.
- b. A Supplied XML record Corporate Author name format follows the current "Applied Title" of GC organizations as published by the Treasury Board Secretariat.

- c. Supplied XML records may include a subordinate Branch name in a separate field. If the same Branch name also appears in a Derived record, then it may be taken as a matching factor. If the Branch name does not appear in the Derived record then it may be ignored as a matching factor.

2. Title (MF 2)

- a. Supplied XML records have separate fields for title and sub-title (Other Titles Information) but frequently the title and sub-title have been recorded in the title field only as a single, punctuated text string.
- b. Because a very limited number of title fields are available in the current PDS cataloguing application, titles normally recorded in MARC fields 130, 222, 240 may be recorded in Title field. Parts of the title normally recorded in subfield n and p of field 245 may be recorded in Title field or both the Title and Subtitle fields (e.g. \$n in Title field, \$p in Subtitle field).

3. GC Catalogue Number (MF 3)

- a. A GC Cat. No. is a unique control number applied to all Supplied XML records by PDS. It is the practice of Library and Archives Canada to record this number in MARC 086. The Government of Canada Catalogue number in MARC 086 in LAC record will be a primary match point.
- b. Other cataloguing authorities may follow this practice, or record it another MARC field or not record it at all.

4. ISBN / ISSN (MF 4)

ISBNs are assigned exclusively by PDS to GC monographs; therefore, all ISBNs in Supplied XML records are authoritative matching factors. Unfortunately, GC organizations have frequently applied assigned ISBNs to their publications incorrectly. Some common errors that have been detected by PDS include:

- a. The ISBN assigned by PDS to a print edition has been applied by the author organization to other editions—typically the electronic (PDF) edition, but also the other Official Language edition, or other language edition.
- b. The ISBN assigned (pre-publication) to a proposed bilingual print edition has been applied by the author organization to either the separate English and French editions (as actually published) or to both editions.
- c. The ISBN assigned by PDS to a proposed English or French edition has been applied to a single bilingual edition (as actually published).
- d. The ISBN applied to the publication by the author organization has been derived by the author organization from a previous edition of the title and is therefore incorrect (and a duplicate).
- e. Other cataloguing authorities may follow a cataloguing procedure that takes the publication as the Chief Source of Information for the ISBN. In the cases cited above, this practice will result in incorrect ISBNs recorded in Derived Records.
- f. ISSN applied to Supplied XML records are derived from publications and validated against equivalent AMICUS (LAC) records. They are reliable matching factors.

5. Publication Format

Publication Format will be Electronic (PDF; EPUB; MP4).

6. Language of Publication

- a. Language of publication to be determined by coding of 008 and / or 041 in Derived record.
- b. Language of cataloguing should match language of publication 040\$b.

4. Evaluation of Matching Factors (MF) in Derived and Supplied XML records

1. If the data in Matching Factors (MF) 1 – 6 in both the Derived Record (DR) and in the Supplied XML Record are identical, then the DR is a match for the SR.
2. If the data in MF 1, 4 - 6 in both the DR and in the Supplied XML record are identical, then the DR is an acceptable match for the Supplied XML record.
3. If the data in MF 4 in both the DR and in the Supplied XML record are identical, but the data in MF 5 in the DR and in the Supplied XML record are not identical, then the DR is not a match for the Supplied XML record (see MF 4, a).
4. If the data in MF 1 – 2 and 5 - 6 in both the DR and in the Supplied XML record are identical but either MF 3 or MF 4 are either absent from or different in the DR and the Supplied XML record, then the DR is an acceptable match for the Supplied XML record. In this case the GC Cat. No. and the ISBN from the Supplied XML record should be copied to the DR.

Note: Many libraries do not catalogue their electronic editions – they use one record for both print and electronic, and add the URL to the record for the print, or will have a record for the electronic edition only. PDS requires separate records for electronic editions and with the correct ISBNs.

5. Conversion Procedures

1. Preferred Sources of Derived records:

-
- a. LAC MARC batch files from PDS web site
 - b. LAC (CaOONL)
 - c. Library of Parliament (CaOOP) in the National Union Catalogue
 - d. Other Canadian cataloguing authorities (e.g., Canadian Full Depository libraries - (<http://publications.gc.ca/site/eng/locatingOurPublications/depositoryLibraries/fullDepositories.html>)).
2. If Derived records assessed as equivalents for Supplied XML records are not available, convert Supplied XML records according to the Data Map. Create minimum 007 and 008 as specified in Data Map and generate leader field.
 3. Selected field values in Supplied XML records must migrate to Derived records. The fields are shown in Appendix 3, Data Elements.

6. Batches of Records and Special Processing

1. Supplied XML records will be provided in categorized batches as follows:
 - a. Approved electronic monograph records (bilingual)
 - b. Approved electronic monograph records (English)
 - c. Approved electronic monograph records (French)
 - d. Approved electronic periodical, series and committee master records (bilingual)
 - e. Approved electronic periodical, series and committee master records (English)
 - f. Approved electronic periodical, series and committee master records (French)
 - g. Approved electronic series issue records (bilingual)
 - h. Approved electronic series issue records (English)
 - i. Approved electronic series issue records (French)
