
ADDENDUM NO.001

Section 35 20 34

Replace Clause 1.4.2 with the following:

The contractor is required to obtain permission from the United States Corp of Engineers (USACE) authorizing use of the Dickinson Island Confined Disposal Facility. The contractor will be required to pay to the USACE a lump sum facility inspection fee and a disposal fee per cubic metre. A permit will be signed prior to contract award. The terms of the agreement are as follows:

- .1 The Contractor shall hold and save the United States free from damages due to the Contractor's use of the facility and its appurtenances.
- .2 The Corps of Engineers reserves the right to halt disposal operations at any time.
- .3 Disposal operations at the CDF are only allowed between the hours of 7:00AM and 9:00PM. Disposal operations are allowed 7 days a week
- .4 The Contractor will be responsible for coordination with other contractors using the facility.
- .5 The Corps of Engineers reserves the right to coordinate disposal operations with others using the facility to minimize impacts to all contractors and to ensure safety of employees utilizing the facility. This may require designated scheduled time periods when contractors will be permitted to offload.
- .6 The contractor is to video or photograph the disposal area prior to and after disposal operations to ensure the CDF is left in the same or better condition prior to disposal operations. This will be submitted to the Detroit Area Office designated point of contact.
- .7 The Corps of Engineers reserves the right to request additional sampling of the dredged material before or during the disposal operations.
- .8 Prior to placement of material into the disposal facility, the Contractor shall submit for approval to the Area Engineer, Detroit Area Office, 6309 W. Jefferson Avenue, Building 414, Detroit, Michigan 48209 (telephone (313) 226-2206), a suitable disposal plan. The plan shall include, but not be limited to, the specific location within the facility where the material will be placed, special material handling procedures, disposal plan that accounts for other contractors utilizing the disposal facility, or other items necessary for the protection of the environment in the area of the disposal facility.
- .9 Weekly reports on the volume of material placed into the disposal facility will be sent to the Corps' Detroit Area Office by the Departmental Representative. One or a combination of the following methods, will determine of the volume of material placed in the disposal area. The Departmental Representative will choose the method:
 - .1 The Contractor will furnish the Corps' Detroit Area Office with copies of container volume and the number of container loads placed within the disposal area.

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- .2 The Contractor will furnish the Corps' Detroit Area Office with copies of prior to dredging surveys and after dredging surveys made over the dredge site. The prior and after survey shall include all processed survey data. These are subject to field check and acceptance by the Corps of Engineers.
- .10 The Contractor must give the Detroit Area Office a minimum of 72 hours (exclusive of Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays) advance notice of a proposed start or resumption of placement of dredged material within the confined disposal area.
- .11 The Contractor will be required to repair any damages or reimburse the government for repair costs (beyond fair wear and tear) to the disposal facilities resulting from the Contractor's operation.
- .12 If the operation of the Contractor is halted for any of the reasons above and the contractor pursues another location to offload dredge spoils other than an approved Corps of Engineers facility, then the contractor will receive a cost adjustment for only the material offloaded into the CDF. This will require documentation from sub paragraph .9 above to determine the reimbursable cost.
- .13 The contractor will receive additional special project procedures that will be discussed at a preconstruction meeting prior to disposal operations.
- .14 Only after award of the contract by Public Works and Government Services Canada, disposal fees are to be paid in advance of the placement of dredged material into the CDF per the following:
- .1 Disposal fees must be received by the USACE prior to the onset of disposal operations.
 - .2 The disposal fee at the Dickinson Island CDF is US\$9.01 per cubic metre. A cash payment of US\$100,000 to cover initial disposal fee must be received by the Corps, prior to the onset of disposal operations. Additional payments of US\$100,000 must be made as the work progresses so that disposal fees are paid prior to the placement of dredged material in the CDF.
 - .3 Payments to the USACE to be made by a cashier's check, payable to Finance and Accounting Officer, "FAO, USAED, Detroit", at 477 Michigan Ave., Detroit, Michigan 48226-2550. Include with the cash payment a reference to Agreement Number 130127, Tax ID Number or Social Security Number, and Address.
 - .4 A cost adjustment will be made after the completion of disposal operations and the final volume determination
 - .5 Pay a lump sum inspection fee of US\$1,500 in advance of the placement of dredged material into the CDF.
- .15 This agreement does not obviate the requirement to obtain other Federal, State, or Local authorization required by law. Work should not commence until proper approval is obtained.
