# **PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION**

#### 1. Introduction

The bid solicitation is divided into seven parts plus attachments and annexes, as follows:

- Part 1 General Information: provides a general description of the requirement;
- Part 2 Bidder Instructions: provides the instructions, clauses and conditions applicable to the bid solicitation;
- Part 3 Bid Preparation Instructions: provides Bidders with instructions on how to prepare their Bid;
- Part 4 Evaluation Procedures and Basis of Selection: indicates how the evaluation will be conducted, the evaluation criteria that must be addressed in the Bid, and the basis of selection;
- Part 5 Certifications: includes the certifications to be provided;
- Part 6 Security, Financial and Other Requirements: includes specific requirements that must be addressed by Bidders; and
- Part 7 Resulting Contract Clauses: includes the clauses and conditions that will apply to any resulting contract.

The Annexes include the Statement of Work, the Basis of Payment and Declaration Form, the Security Requirements Checklist, and any other annexes.

# 2. Summary

The purpose of this project is to complete design for the renovation and fit-up of the former Forensic Laboratory, located adjacent to "F" Division Headquarters and the RCMP Academy in Regina, SK for alternate use and occupancy. The Regina Forensic Laboratory was constructed in 1995 and is comprised of approximately 5000 M2 of gross interior space.

It is anticipated that the total area required to be fit-up in the Forensic Laboratory to accommodate the new and existing occupancies will be approximately 2600 M2 which is outlined in greater detail in the Statement of Work.

In addition to the work in the Regina Forensic Laboratory, there is also a requirement to provide fall arrest protection around stairwells on the main floor of the "F" Division HQ building and to provide mechanical cooling to the subterranean post garage..

Renovations and fit-up of the first implementation priority must be complete for operations by **March of 2015**. Renovations and fit-up of the second priority construction work must be complete by **September 30, 2015**.

Indicative Cost Estimate for construction is \$6,121,514.00; not including construction risk, design fees, design contingencies or GST but does include construction contingencies. This budget is based on a Class "D" estimate.

There is a security requirement associated with this requirement. For additional information, consult Part 6 - Security, Financial and Other Requirements, and Part 7 - Resulting Contract Clauses.



For services requirements, Bidders in receipt of a pension or a lump sum payment must provide the required information as detailed in article 3 of Part 2 of the bid solicitation.

The requirement is subject to the provisions of the World Trade Organization Agreement on Government Procurement (WTO-AGP), and the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA).

There is a Federal Contractors Program (FCP) for employment equity requirement associated with this procurement; see Part 5 - Certifications, and Part 7 - Resulting Contract Clauses.

# 3. Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

#### 4. Procurement Ombudsman

The Office of the Procurement Ombudsman (OPO) was established by the Government of Canada to provide an independent avenue for suppliers to raise complaints regarding the award of contracts under \$25,000 for goods and under \$100,000 for services. #### **PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS**

# 1. Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the <u>Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual</u>(https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Revision to Departmental Name: As this solicitation is issued by Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP), any reference to Public Works and Government Services Canada or PWGSC or its Minister contained in any term, condition or clause of this solicitation, including any individual SACC clauses incorporated by reference, will be interpreted as reference to RCMP or its Minister.

Bidders who submit a Bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The 2003 (2013-06-01) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

Section 01 – Code of Conduct and Certification – Bid of 2003 referenced above is amended as follows:

Delete subsection 1.4 and 1.5 in their entirety.

Subsection 5.4 of 2003, Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, is amended as follows:

Delete: sixty (60) days

Insert: one-hundred and twenty (120) days

#### 2. Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to RCMP Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

Due to the nature of the bid solicitation, Bids transmitted by facsimile to RCMP will not be accepted.

# 3. Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than ten (10) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the questions or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered with copies to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

# 4. Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in **Saskatchewan**.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their Bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

#### 5. Limitation of Submission

Bidders may only submit one (1) proposal in response to this solicitation.

A joint venture is an association of two or more parties who combine their money, property, knowledge, expertise or other resources in a single joint business enterprise, sometimes referred as a consortium, to bid together on a requirement. Bidders who bid as a joint venture must indicate clearly that it is a joint venture and provide the following information:

- the name of each member of the joint venture;
- the Procurement Business Number of each member of the joint venture;
- the name of the representative of the joint venture, i.e. the member chosen by the other members to act on their behalf, if applicable;
- the name of the joint venture, if applicable.



If the information is not clearly provided in the bid, the Bidder must provide the information on request from the Contracting Authority.

The bid and any resulting contract must be signed by all the members of the joint venture unless one member has been appointed to act on behalf of all members of the joint venture. The Contracting Authority may, at any time, require each member of the joint venture to confirm that the representative has been appointed with full authority to act as its representative for the purposes of the bid solicitation and any resulting contract. If a contract is awarded to a joint venture, all members of the joint venture will be jointly and severally or solidarily liable for the performance of any resulting contract.

# 6. Legal Capacity

The Bidder must have the legal capacity to contract. If the Bidder is a sole proprietorship, a partnership or a corporate body, the Bidder must provide, if requested by the Contracting Authority, a statement and any requested supporting documentation indicating the laws under which it is registered or incorporated together with the registered or corporate name and place of business. This also applies to bidders submitting a bid as a joint venture.

#### PART 3 - BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

# 1. Bid Preparation Instructions

Canada requests that Bidders provide their Bid in separate sections as follows:

Section I: Technical Bid (four (4) hard copies) (and one (1) soft copy on DVD/CD)

Section II: Financial Bid (one (1) hard copy) (and one (1) soft copy on DVD/CD)

Section III: Certifications (one (1) hard copy)

If there is a discrepancy between the wording of the soft copy and the hard copy, the wording of the hard copy will have priority over the wording of the soft copy.

Prices must appear in the Basis of Payment and Declaration Form only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the Bid.

The maximum number of pages including text and graphics to be submitted for Annex "F" – Evaluation Criteria is thirty (30) pages (single-sided) or fifteen (15) pages (double-sided). A minimum font size 10 must be used. The following contents are not included as part of the maximum page limitation noted above:

- Covering letter (optional contents not evaluated)
- Completed Annex "E" Team Identification Form;
- Completed Annex "C" Basis of Payment and Declaration Form;
- Front page of the RFP Solicitation; and,
- Front page of revision(s) to the RFP;

Any pages which extend beyond the above page limitation and any other attachments will be extracted from the proposal and will not be evaluated.

Canada requests that Bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their Bid:



- a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

In April 2006, Canada issued a policy directing federal departments and agencies to take the necessary steps to incorporate environmental considerations into the procurement process <u>Policy on Green Procurement</u> (http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html). To assist Canada in reaching its objectives, Bidders should:

# **Section I:** Technical Proposal

In their Technical Proposal, Bidders should demonstrate their understanding of the requirements contained in the bid solicitation and explain how they will meet these requirements. Bidders should demonstrate their capability and describe their approach in a thorough, concise and clear manner for carrying out the work.

The Technical Proposal should address clearly and in sufficient depth the points that are subject to the evaluation criteria against which the Bid will be evaluated. Simply repeating the statement contained in the bid solicitation is not sufficient. In order to facilitate the evaluation of the Bid, Canada requests that Bidders address and present topics in the order of the evaluation criteria under the same headings. To avoid duplication, Bidders may refer to different sections of their Bids by identifying the specific paragraph and page number where the subject topic has already been addressed.

# **Section II:** Basis of Payment and Declaration Form

### 1. Evaluation Procedures

a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.



b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the Bids.

### 2. Basis of Selection

# 2.1 Highest Combined Rating of Technical Merit and Price

- 1. To be declared responsive, an Bid must:
  - a. comply with all the requirements of the bid solicitation; and
  - b. meet all Mandatory Criteria; and
  - c. achieve an individual criterion pass mark of 60% and a minimum overall Technical Score of 60% (510 out of the 850 points available).
- 2. Bids not meeting (a), (b) and (c) will be declared non-responsive, and will not be evaluated against the highest responsive combined rating of technical merit and price.
- 3. The selections will be based on the highest responsive combined rating of technical merit and price. The ratio will be 85% for the technical merit and 15% for the price.
- 4. To establish the technical merit score, the overall technical score for each responsive Bid will be determined as follows: total number of points obtained / maximum number of points available multiplied by the ratio of 85%.
- 5. To establish the pricing score, each responsive Bid will be prorated against the lowest evaluated price and the ratio of 15%.
- 6. For each responsive Bid, the technical merit score and the pricing score will be added to determine its combined rating.
- 7. The responsive Bid with the highest combined rating of technical merit and price will be recommended for award of a Contract.

The table below illustrates an example where all three Bids are responsive and the selection of the contractor is determined by a 85/15 ratio of technical merit and price, respectively. The total available points equal 135 and the lowest evaluated price is \$45,000 (45).

#### **PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS**

Bidders must provide the required certifications and documentation to be awarded a contract.

The certifications provided by Bidders to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Canada will declare an Bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default, if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether during the Bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply with this request will also render the Bid non-responsive or will constitute a default under the Contract.

# 2.2 Status and Availability of Resources

# Annex "A" - Statement of Work

#### Title:

Architectural and Engineering Design Services – Renovations and Fit-up of the Regina RCMP Forensic Laboratory and space within the "F" Division Headquarters Building.

#### **1.0** General Information:

# 1.1 Project Narrative

The purpose of this project is to complete design for the renovation and fit-up of the former Forensic Laboratory, located adjacent to "F" Division Headquarters and the RCMP Academy in Regina, SK for alternate use and occupancy. The Regina Forensic Laboratory was constructed in 1995 and is comprised of approximately 5000 M2 of gross interior space.

The interior space to be fit-up was previously predominately used as laboratory and support spaces. The intended uses of these spaces will be to provide office accommodation and support spaces on the main and second floors, and will include the provision of enclosed offices, meeting rooms/breakout rooms, industrial workshop space, Secure File Storage and general storage requirements. All of the foregoing shall meet the terms and conditions of the Government of Canada's Workplace 2.0 initiative and/or the RCMP Property Management Manual.

The overall intention of this project is to conduct a review of all of the spaces within this facility and determine the best use of this space to accommodate the occupancies identified as follows. Should the best option include the relocation of existing occupancies, this should be identified for consideration by the Project Authority. The primary purpose of this project will be to accommodate the RCMP National Recruiting Processing Centre which has ninety-seven (97) employees as they relocate their operations to Regina. There is a requirement to renovate and fit-up approximately 1400 M2 of space for this operation. The construction implementation for the development of this space along with any required base building development will occur as the *first priority* of implementation as this group is currently located within leased space which will expire at the end of this project. This occupancy shall follow and adhere to the requirements of Workplace 2.0.

There is also a technology based unit that will be relocating to the redeveloped Forensic Laboratory from an existing lease in Regina. There is a requirement to provide approximately 210 M2 of space for this operation which would be provided in accordance to standards established in the RCMP Property Management Manual. This development would be considered as part of the *first priority* implementation.

"F" Division is planning to relocate 3 operational units to this facility. These units will require renovation and fitup of approximately 500 M2 of space for this purpose. This space will be a combination of office accommodations and industrial workshop space and will adhere to standards established in the RCMP Property Management Manual.

Another group that currently reside within the Laboratory require to have their spaces modified to meet standards. The Forensic Identification Unit currently occupies approximately 170 M2 in the Lab building. It has been determined that their space allocation should be closer to 135 M2. Ideally, the space occupied by this unit should be contiguous.



Another existing occupancy includes the former Northwest Region Human Resources operation for which there will be a reduction of staff remaining within their space which will require review and revision to suit the new occupant loads. It is anticipated that the space requirements for this group will be 276 M2 and shall adhere to the requirements of Workplace 2.0.

Also located within this facility is the Security Administration Unit which is currently located on two separate floors. A significant renovation was undertaken 2 years ago to accommodate the majority of this group on the second level. There is a desire to have the group currently located on the main floor relocated to the second level, adjacent to one another which would require fit up of approximately 45 M2. The construction implementation for the development of spaces to accommodate this unit and the units in the previous 3 paragraphs will be considered **second priority** implementation.

There is also a desire to re-purpose the existing firearms test range into secure storage. This area encompasses approximately 140 M2 of space. Work will include deconstruction of the existing firearms range apparatus, removal of any contaminants, provision of appropriate heating and ventilation and facilitation of access to this sunken space for large and/or heavy articles.

It is anticipated that the total area required to be fit-up to accommodate the new and existing occupancies will be approximately 2600 M2

There will be a requirement to review the existing mechanical systems to determine requirements specific to an office accommodation program as opposed to a laboratory environment and some smaller specialized ventilation requirements and modify/replace these systems to suit the new uses and purpose. It would be expected that the current 100% make up air model would be modified to a traditional supply/return air ventilation system or some other more efficient system.

The electrical systems will be required to be reviewed and modified to suit the new use as well. Also within this scope will be the development and implementation of a structured wire management system for data and voice communications. There also exists within this facility an Uninterrupted Power Source. A review of this system to confirm its condition and life expectancy will be required. There will not be a requirement for continued use of this system within this facility. The condition assessment and life expectancy is required to determine if the system could be considered for re-use in another location.

Given the change of use and occupancy of this facility, the consultant team will be requested to undertake a Code review of the facility and implement changes to rectify any deficiencies identified. The Federal Fire Commissioner has completed a pre-renovation inspection and the report generated from that inspection will be made available for use to the consultant team.

The use of the existing common staff lounge/lunch area is to be reviewed in the context of Workplace 2.0 with the goal to maintain a common area for this purpose for all occupants rather than duplicate this space within each occupancy group. This may require modification and/or expansion of the existing space.

In addition to the work in the Regina Forensic Laboratory, there is also a requirement to provide fall prevention devices around two open stair wells that traverse down through planters inside the building and fall prevention devices around a raised planter on the exterior of the building.

# 1.2 Introduction

The RCMP requires the services of Architectural and Engineering professionals to provide the services for the



review of the existing Regina RCMP Forensic Laboratory facility, provision of recommendations, design and implementation of fit-up of space for the uses outlined in the preceding paragraphs in Regina, SK. The construction administration will occur through two differing levels of implementation priority but will be accomplished through one construction tender.

# 1.3 Constraints and Challenges

- 1. Security clearances will be required by personnel working on this project.
- Budget control and management is of significant importance in the completion of this project. Utilization of innovative design to reduce the overall cost of the project is critical and design options provided by the consultant team will be challenged to ensure economies and efficiencies are identified.
- 3. Most areas within the facilities will remain to be occupied during design and partially occupied through construction. Additionally, time is of the essence with respect to completion of this project to ensure that the space is ready for occupancy as scheduled.
- 4. Consideration will have to be made throughout the implementation of this project for the ongoing operational activities within this facility. There will be a requirement to consider and coordinate tie-in to existing systems.
- 5. Schedule management. Renovations and fit-up of the first implementation priority must be complete for operations by March of 2015. Renovations and fit-up of the second priority construction work must be complete by September 30, 2015.

# 2.0 Project Objectives:

# 2.1 Project Delivery Approach

The tendering of this requirement will be an open tender on Buy and Sell, the Government of Canada's procurement website, administered by the RCMP.

This project will use a Traditional, design - tender - build approach. A consultant will be retained by the RCMP and report directly to the RCMP Project Authority to co-ordinate all services related to Design Development, Construction documents, tendering and Construction administration. Contractors will be retained by the RCMP and report directly to the RCMP Project Authority to co-ordinate all services related to construction. The construction activity shall occur via two distinct sets of priorities as outlined in the schedule below.

# 2.2 Objectives

#### 1. Functional Performance

a. Provide a fit up space that responds to the requirements of the proposed occupants of these facilities

# b. Achieve:

- i. Space that meets the functional, performance, quality, and technical requirements of the various occupants of these facilities;
- ii. Updated facilities that provide functional, responsive and efficient workspace in keeping with the functional program, RCMP and Treasury Board standards and Building Codes;
- iii. Healthy working environments that fully support optimum work productivity;
- iv. Easy to use and adaptable systems and technologies to support operating requirements with capacity for growth and change; and,
- v. Effective and efficient office landscape furniture plan, utilizing approved suppliers from the Government of Canada's National Master Standing Offer Agreement and Workplace 2.0, fully coordinated with the Mechanical and Electrical disciplines.

#### 2. Design Quality and Character

a. Provide a fit-up space that will effectively and appropriately serve the occupants.

#### b. Achieve:

- i. Design excellence, use of quality materials and precise execution respecting the condition and location of the facility;
- ii. A fit-up space that accommodates the functions that will be placed within it; and,
- iii. An integrated design whereby the project team members from all disciplines work together early and often throughout the project design process. This must include what goes on when the design team gets together the synthesis of climate, use, building

design and systems.

# 3. Building Performance

a. Modify or replace systems that will enable long-term efficient and cost effective life cycle performance. Review the existing 100% make-up air building ventilation system and modify to meet standards for an office occupancy and for small independent industrial applications.

a. Deliver the project utilizing best practices in support of the RCMP's needs, respecting the approved scope, expected quality, budget and schedule.

#### b. Achieve:

# 2.3 Scope of Work

#### Overview:

<u>Phase I</u> – Review the facilities, conduct a building code review, review the Statement of Work and functional program, and provide up to three (3) options for consideration by the Project Authority for placement of these spaces, ensuring optimal use of the building footprint and consideration for future growth and address base building systems to meet requirements of the portion of the building receiving fit-up.

Phase II – Design and completion of Tender Documents based upon approved recommendations from Phase I.

<u>Phase III</u> – Contract Administration including Commissioning and warranty.

# 1. Architectural, Interior Design

- a. Design to provide accommodations in response to the functional space program for the fit-up of existing building that will be approximately 2600 M2 in area in the Forensic Laboratory Building and approximately 644 M2 in the "F" Division Headquarters building. Services to include all professional expertise required to fully complete pre-design, design development, contract documents and construction administration of this project. A vast majority of the finished flooring has been replaced within the Forensic Laboratory building over the past two years through the utilization of carpet tile. Re-use of this material is expected where possible.
- b. Furniture, Fittings and Equipment layouts are to be completed in conformance with Workplace 2.0 and/or the RCMP Property Management Manual.
- c. Develop the space to ensure proper optimization of building footprint.

### 2. Structural Engineering

a. All applicable structural elements for the design.

# 3. Mechanical Engineering

a. Review existing base building mechanical systems and identify items that require upgrading as part of this project as well as modifications to meet the requirements of the building occupants. Specific review of the existing mechanical systems in the Forensic Laboratory Building with a view to move away from the 100% make-up air system intended for a laboratory environment with a view to provide systems that are normally found in new office environments will be necessary as well as two small scale industrial ventilation systems.

#### 4. Electrical Engineering

a. Review existing base building electrical and fire protection systems and identify items that require upgrading, modification or expansion as part of this project as well as modifications to meet the detailed requirement of the space to be fit-up. Review requirements and complete the

design and establishment of communications wiring network, audiovisual, CCTV, intrusion alarm, connection to the utility and security electronics and related items as required. Review the lighting systems in the areas to be renovated to determine whether replacement with more efficient systems would be warranted and provide an analysis that would determine the pay-back period should this be adopted. A previous renovation to some of the spaces within these facilities explored and implemented daylight harvesting and this should be pursued as part of the scope of this project.

# 2.4 Building Permits and Occupancy Authorities

- 1. The Consultant will support the Contractor in applying for building permits by providing the required documentation.
- 2. The Consultant will negotiate and resolve building permit related issues.
- 3. The Consultant shall support the Contractor in its application for an occupancy permit and coordinate the resolution of all outstanding issues relating to the permit.
- 4. The Contractor shall pay for the permits on behalf of the RCMP.

# 2.5 Design Quality

The Prime Consultant is responsible for controlling quality throughout the life of the project. As part of the design quality assurance process the Prime Consultant will be responsible for coordinating peer reviews for each disciple. Peer reviews will be completed by all disciplines and documented with follow up responses and included in each design submission.

# 3.0 Consultant Service Requirements:

# 3.1 Overview

- 1. The Consultant will be responsible for providing and coordinating full professional Architectural and Engineering services, from the Pre- Design Services Stage to the completion of the Post Warranty Stage of the project. A summary of professional expertise and relevant specialty experience requirements for this project include, but are not limited to the following:
  - a. Architectural and Engineering Services; and,
  - b. Budget and Schedule Management Services.

# 2. Summary Scope of Services



- a. Pre- Design Services and report that reviews the project program and conducts architectural, mechanical and electrical systems, security electronics, and IT assessment with recommendations to address deficiencies as part of the scope of this renovation;
- b. Prepare a final Design Development Report based on the approved Schematic Design, complete with outline specifications, including peer review reports and Class "C" estimate;
- c. Conduct peer reviews and submit reports throughout design;
- d. Prepare fully coordinated sets of construction drawings based on the approved Design Development Report, ready for tendering purposes and Class "A" cost estimate;
- e. Prepare specifications using National Master Specification (NMS) program including Division;
- f. Provide assistance during the tendering processes including preparation of addenda and review tender results:
- g. Provide identified contract administration services for each project phase;
- h. Identify Commissioning activities through standard Testing, Adjusting and Balancing protocols, monitor these processes and document results;
- i. Prepare Maintenance Manuals including maintenance schedule, as-built drawings and specifications; and,
- j. Provide warranty services.

# 3.2 Team Responsibilities

# 1. Prime Consultant

a. The Prime Consultant is completely responsible for providing and coordinating the work of all professional disciplines (Architectural and Engineering Consultant Services) required, from the Pre -design Stage to the completion of the Post Construction Stage of the project.

### 2. Consultant Team

- a. The Prime Consultant and their personnel including Sub-Consultants comprise the Consultant Design Team (Consultant Team).
- b. The Consultant Team will be required to maintain its expertise for the duration of the project.
- c. The Consultant Team shall be comprised of qualified professional and technical expertise with extensive relevant experience in renovating industrial, commercial and/or office facilities, capable of providing the services identified and required for this project.

# 3.3 General Service Requirements

# 1. Overview

a. The RCMP will act as the Project Manager and the Contracting Authority during all phases of design and construction of the project.

- b. The Consultant team will be required to deliver integrated professional services, in accordance with the requirements set forth in this brief. The services will be administered in distinct stages, as follows:
  - i. Pre-Design Building Assessment and Project Requirements Confirmation
  - ii. Design Development
  - iii. Construction Documents
  - iv. Tender Call, Bid Evaluation and Construction Contract Award
  - v. Construction and Contract Administration with established priority implementation plans
  - vi. Post Construction Services
- c. The outline of deliverables and processes, as presented in this brief, are intended as a general outline only. It is not exhaustive and does not preclude alternative or supplementary approaches as may be suggested by the Consultant for consideration by the Project Manager.
- 2. The Consultant shall perform the following services, in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Agreement and all the requirements of the Statement of Work:
  - a. Standard of Care;
  - b. Budget and Schedule Management Services, broken down in segments as deemed required by the Project Authority;
  - c. Project Information, Decisions, Approaches & Approvals;
  - d. Change in Services;
  - e. Code, By-Laws, Licenses, Permit Reviews;
  - f. Provision of Staff and Sub-Consultant Services; and,
  - g. Commissioning
    - Identify Commissioning activities, which outline the systematic approach to testing, adjusting, balancing and verifying the systems' performance in accordance with the design intent and related testing and verification forms.

# 3.4 Project Administration Requirements

# 1. <u>Lines of Communication</u>

- a. Unless otherwise directed by the Project Manager, the Consultant shall communicate with the Project Manager only.
- b. During construction tender call, the Contracting Authority conducts all correspondence and makes the contract award.

# 2. General Deliverables

a. Where deliverables and submissions include summaries, reports, drawings, plans, specifications and schedules, two (2) original hard copies and one (1) copy in electronic format shall be provided to the Project Manager, unless otherwise specified.



b. The following are the deliverables, and the electronic format requested:

iii. Schedules Microsoft Project or other acceptable product

iv. Drawings Auto CADD and PDF

# 3. Acceptance of Consultant Deliverables

- a. While the RCMP acknowledges the Consultant's obligations to meet project requirements, the project delivery process entitles the RCMP to review the work. The RCMP reserves the right to reject undesirable or unsatisfactory work. The Consultant must obtain the Project Manager's acceptance during each of the project stages.
- b. Acceptance indicates that, based on a general review of material for specific issues, the material is considered to comply with governmental and departmental objectives and practices and that overall project objectives should be satisfied. The acceptance does not relieve the Consultant of professional responsibility for the work and compliance with the terms and conditions of the contract.
- c. The RCMP acceptance does not prohibit rejection of work which is determined to be unsatisfactory at later stages of review. If progress design development of technical investigation reveals that earlier acceptance should be withdrawn, the Consultant is responsible for redesigning work and resubmitting for acceptance at the Consultant's cost.

#### 4. Design Meetings

- a. The Prime Consultant shall arrange meetings generally throughout the design and tendering stages of the project, for all members of the project team. Project meetings will normally occur every two weeks, alternating between in-person meetings and conference calls, unless project requirements dictate otherwise.
- b. Meetings will be held at the offices of the Prime Consultant and at the RCMP Academy/Lab Building on an alternate basis, or wherever is deemed to be the most beneficial to meet requirements of the project.
- c. The Consultant shall attend the meetings, record the issues and decisions and prepare and distribute minutes within 72 hours of the meeting.

# 5. Security Requirement

c. The Consultant shall distribute project documents such as drawings, specifications, reports, only to the design team members and only as required to perform the work.

The Consultant Team will review and analyse all available program information, consult with the RCMP and the User Department, and deliver a comprehensive Pre-Design Report. This approved deliverable will become the formal project work plan and will be utilized throughout the project to guide the delivery.

# 2. Scope of Activities

- a. Analyze the project requirements / program including any amendments,
- b. Conduct a building code and building systems analysis. Pre-design report to include a synopsis of each building system, Architectural, Structural, Electrical, Mechanical, Life Safety, Security Electronics, IT etc. with recommendations on building systems that must be addressed as part of this project.
- Analyze all base building components and connectivity (BCC) requirements including any amendments identified by the Project Authority / Users for Information Services, Security and Furniture / Equipment,
- d. Analyze the building design security requirements and confirm design standards,
- e. Analyze the sustainable design requirements and confirm design standards,
- f. Review all other available existing material related to the project including requirements identified in the Statement of Work,
- g. Identify all additional information that will be needed to deliver the project,
- h. Undertake a budget, schedule and risk analysis and identify any conflicts that will need to be addressed with respect to scope, quality, schedule, cost,
- i. Identify and verify all authorities having jurisdiction over the project and codes, regulations and standards that apply,
- j. Conduct value engineering design reviews and reports for all disciplines through design,

- iii. Review, develop, prepare and submit detailed Standards analysis
- iv. Review, develop, prepare and submit detailed Canada Labour Code Part II analysis.

### c. Building Design:

- i. Refine and prepare detailed concept design for consideration by the RCMP that will offer three design options and will demonstrate acceptable response to the Functional Space Program. - 4.
