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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Security Requirement

There is no security requirement associated with this bid solicitation.

2. Requirement

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

1. Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the *Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual* (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The 2003 (2013-06-01) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

2. Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

3. Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than ten (10) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the questions or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered with copies to all bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all bidders may not be answered by Canada.

4. Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the bidders.

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

2. Basis of Selection

- b. Supply with pressure gauges clearly visible by the operator from the tractor cab
- c. Supply with all hydraulic hoses fitted with Pioneer 8010 hydraulic hose ends
- d. Supply with triplet nozzle bodies with one set of air inducted low drift nozzles 11004 included spaced at 20"
- e. Supply with an equipment jack rated and installed by the equipment manufacturer
- f. Supply with a mounted, visible "Slow Moving Vehicle Sign" compliant with Ontario Canada laws for road travel
- g. Supply with safety chains as specified and installed by the equipment manufacturer
- h. Supply with road flashers powered from the tractor, flasher light size and colour must comply with any applicable Ontario, Canada laws from road travel.S
- i. Supply Owners Manual and replacement parts list including parts identification numbers

Installation

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The Contractor must off load at the Harrow, Ontario Site and connect the unit to one of Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada's on site tractors.
