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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Security Requirement

There is no security requirement associated with the requirement.

2. Requirement

Agriculture & Agri-Food Canada, Saskatchewan Irrigation Diversification Centre in Outlook, SK has a requirement for one (1) Research Plot Seeder to Outlook, SK, on or before March 31, 2014.

3. Debriefings

After contract award, bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days of receipt of notification that their bid was unsuccessful. The debriefing may be provided in writing, by telephone or in person.

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

1. Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions (<http://ccua-sacc.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/pub/acho-eng.jsp>) Manual issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The 2003 (2013-06-01) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

2. Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

Due to the nature of the bid solicitation, bids transmitted by facsimile to PWGSC will not be accepted.

3. Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than five (5) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the questions or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered with copies to all bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all bidders may not be answered by Canada.

4. Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Manitoba.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the bidders.

PART 3 - BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

1. Bid Preparation Instructions

Canada requests that bidders provide their bid in separately bound sections as follows:

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

Canada requests that bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their bid:

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

Section I: Technical Bid

In their technical bid, bidders should explain and demonstrate how they propose to meet the requirements and how they will carry out the Work.

Section II: Financial Bid

Bidders must submit their financial bid in accordance with the Basis of Payment. The total amount of Goods and Services Tax (GST) or Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) must be shown separately, if applicable.

2. Basis of Selection

2.1 Basis of Selection - Mandatory Technical Criteria

A bid must comply with the requirements of the bid solicitation and meet all mandatory technical evaluation criteria to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for award of a contract

3. Security Requirement

There is no security requirement.

PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS

Bidders must provide the required certifications and documentation to be awarded a contract.

The certifications provided by bidders to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default, if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply with this request will also render the bid non-responsive or will constitute a default under the Contract.

ANNEX "A" - REQUIREMENT

Agriculture & Agri-Food Canada, Saskatchewan Irrigation Diversification Centre in Outlook, SK has a requirement for one (1) Research Plot Seeder to Outlook, SK, on or before March 31, 2014.

Background:

The requested plot seeder will be a tractor-drawn research plot seeder that is suitable for seeding into cultivated land, and for direct seeding into non-cultivated land with residues of preceding crops.

MANDATORY CRITERIA: Bidders **MUST** record whether they meet (Yes) or not meet (No) the specifications; In order to be deemed compliant, bidders must meet each mandatory criteria listed below. Failure to meet all the mandates will result in your bid being deemed non-compliant and it shall not be given any further consideration in the evaluation process.

Bidders **MUST** provide documentation and should cross reference where each of the Mandatories below can be found within the documentation.

Item	Mandatory Criteria	Yes	No	Bidders Cross Reference
1	Information			
1.01	The seeder must have eight parallel link double-disk type seed row openers, individually adjustable for pressure and depth, and capable of cutting through crop residue and planting into undisturbed and cultivated soil. Each seed row opener will have its own packer wheel.			
1.02	The seeder must also have eight disk fertilizer band openers (any suitable type) capable of cutting through crop residue. The distance between the fertilizer band and the seedrow must be adjustable.			
1.03	Fertilizer band placement must be adjustable horizontally, throughout a minimum range of 2.5 to 10.2 cm to one side of the seedrow.			
1.04	The row spacing of the seedrow openers must be adjustable throughout a minimum range of 15.2 to 30.5 cm.			
1.05	The tool bars must be sufficiently long to allow the outside seedrow openers to be centred up to 178 cm apart, and to allow for positioning of the fertilizer band openers up to 10.2 cm to the same side of each seedrow opener in all seedrow configurations.			
1.06	Initial set-up must be provided with all eight seed runs mounted at 25.4-cm spacings, and all fertilizer sideband openers mounted 2.54 cm to one side of the seedrows.			

1.07	The fertilizer and seeding depth must be accurately adjustable throughout a minimum range of 0.0 cm to 10.2 cm, with stops to set the desired depth for the conditions. The openers are to be lifted from the soil by means of a hydraulic ram.			
1.08	Two mounted rotating belted cone metering systems must be provided - one capable of directing material to the seedrows and the sidebands as required, and the other to the seedrows only.			
1.09	Each cone must be at least 30 cm in diameter, and include a cover, and must feed into a spinner divider with six and eight-outlet heads (both head types to be included).			
1.10.	The spinners must be electrically driven from the tractor 12-volt electrical system.			
1.11	Cones, spinners, and all seed metering systems, tubes, and outlets must be capable of handling seeds from bluegrass to large dry bean in size. A Zero-Max drive system providing for seeded plot lengths throughout the 2.5 m to 20 m range will be provided for each cone.			
1.12	Two bulk seeding boxes, each with a dedicated Zero-Max drive, with one metering into each of the cone spinner dividers, must be included.			
1.13	Each seeding box must have a 10-kg capacity and be capable of delivery of a minimum range of 0 to 250 kg/ha of seed, based on a 2.03-m effective seeding width and wheat seed. Box design must allow for easy clean-out, by opening the bottom or tipping.			
1.14	<p>Three fertilizer boxes, each with a minimum 45-kg capacity, a dedicated Zero-Max drive system, and an eight-outlet delivery system with ability to shut off or block any selected runs, must be included, with capabilities as follows:</p> <p>.01 Box #1: Delivery of a minimum range of 0 to 225 kg/ha of fertilizer to the seedrow discs only. This box (only) must have dividers to separate the end portions of the box supplying the end runs from the centre portion of the box supplying the other six runs.</p> <p>.02 Box #2: Delivery of a minimum range of 0 to 250 kg/ha of fertilizer to the seedrow disc and to the sidebanding disks.</p> <p>.03 Box #3: Delivery of a minimum range of 0 to 400 kg/ha of fertilizer to the sidebanding disks only.</p> <p>Above capabilities and rates are based on granular urea (46-0-0) fertilizer and a 25.4-cm row spacing.</p>			

1.15	Seed and fertilizer delivery systems must be ground-driven and must be consistently ($\pm 10\%$) metering down to 2% of each indicated maximum delivery rate. Interchangeable feed wheel types and drive sprockets can be used to achieve accuracy at low delivery rates, so long as they are included and readily changeable. Split fertilizer boxes may be used.			
1.16	The seeder will have an operators' platform and steps for mounting, to allow safe operation and comfortable access to the cones for two operators at field speeds. The platform must have seats or a bench for two operators, and a surface to support seed boxes.			
1.17	Must be a light to indicate clearly to the operator if each spinner divider is operating.			
1.18	The transport wheels must be 2.032 m apart centre-to-centre.			
1.19	The seeder must have all necessary safety shields, step and platform safety rails/handles, and a slow moving vehicle sign, per industry standards.			
1.20.	Each cone drive, and each seed and fertilizer box drive, must be equipped with an electric clutch controlled by a toggle switch in a control panel at the operator platform, and powered from the tractor 12-volt electrical system.			
1.21	All Zero-Max drive units must be variable speed and infinitely adjustable within each indicated range, and readily accessible from the ground or operator platform.			
1.22	The length of the seeder must not exceed 2.90 m (from centre of hitch to centre of transport wheels) and the width must not exceed 2.30 m.			
1.23	The hitch must be of a "gooseneck" design.			
1.24	Hydraulics for lifting the openers must be operated from the tractor. The hydraulic ramp will be connected to the tractor using standard Pioneer couplers			
1.25	All openers must be of a design to either accept a tube for liquid fertilizer application, or be readily modified to do so, at later date.			
1.26	The seeder must be supplied with all attachments assembled, installed, completely serviced, and ready for operation.			
1.27	All moving gears, discs, etc., must either have sealed bearings or clearly marked and accessible greasable fittings.			

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1.28	The implement must be transportable at speeds of up to 100 km/hr when loaded on a trailer, so all lids must be able to be secured and there must be a means of adequately securing the seeder to the trailer using chains.			
1.29	A schematic diagram of the seeder must be included with the tender, detailing all dimensions, weights, type of openers, etc.			
1.30.	An operator's manual and a parts manual for the seeder must be included (one copy, in English).
