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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Security Requirement

Annex A Statement of Requirement

The Contractor must supply, deliver, offload and install lecture hall desks and seating with a warranty period of thirty-six (36) months at the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Academy, Depot Division, located in Regina, Saskatchewan, in accordance with the requirements specifications, terms and conditions detailed herein.

The Desks and Seating must have the following specifications:

- Twenty desks with four seats attached to each desk, as per sample drawing at Annex E.
- 2. Each seat is to swivel from side to side and to also swivel to allow user to swing in and out of position, and automatically return to a front facing position
- 3. Each seat is to have a seat pan and back but no arms
- 4. Each seat back to be cushioned and have lumbar support
- 5. Each seat pan to be cushioned and the front of the seat pan to have waterfall edge to reduce pressure at back of the leg
- 6. Seating material: 100% Polyurethane coated polyvinyl face/100% polyester backing, standard weight 29.25 ± 1.5 ounces/yard, 100,000 double rubs-#8 cotton duck using Wyzenbeek Method
- 7. Seating shall meet the Upholstered Furniture Action Council Class 1, California Flammability Regulation (Bulletin 117, Section E), International Furniture Manufacturers Association (BIFMA International) Class A and American National Standards Institute/International Furniture Manufacturers Association ANSI/BIFMA X5.1 standards
- 8. Offer a minimum of twelve (12) standard colors of seating material. Colour to be chosen by the Project Authority.
- 9. Each desk is to be 18 inches deep x 96 inches wide (one straight piece) with 12 inches deep front modesty panel
- 10. Desk is to be overlaid top and bottom with the same laminate
- 11. Desk edges to be covered with 3 mm moulded PVC and have radius corners
- 12. Offer a minimum of ten (10) standard colors of laminate for desk. Colour to be chosen by the Project Authority.
- 13. Desk to meet or exceed the American National Standards Institute (ANSI)/Business and International Furniture Manufacturers Association (BIFMA International) standards, ANSI/BIFMA X5.5 Desk Products and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI)/National Electrical Manufacturers Association (NEMA), ANSI/NEMA LD3 High Pressure Decorative Laminates standards.
- 14. Bases/Pedestals of desk to be constructed of steel; all welds shall be structurally sound free from cracks and surface voids. They must be clean, smooth and uniform in appearance and free from scale, flux, trapped foreign matter or any other inclusions that may be detrimental to the application of the primer or final finish.
