PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Security Requirement

2. Requirement

2.1 Optional Requirement (Installation)

The Bidders grants to Canada the irrevocable option to acquire the installation described at Annex A of the Contract under the same terms and conditions and at the prices stated in Annex A. The option may only be exercised by the Contracting Authority and will be evidenced, for administrative purposes only, through a contract amendment.

2.2 Optional Requirement (Trolley)

The Bidders grants to Canada the irrevocable option to acquire the Trolley described at Annex A of the Contract under the same terms and conditions and at the prices stated in Annex A. 3. Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than ten (10) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item.
