1. Welcome and Introductions

2. National Food Strategy update

Overview of the National Food strategy:

- a. Duration of Standing Offers will be one (1) year only. Competitive process will run every year. Number of categories has been decreased from 8 to 6
- b. Number of zones has been decreased from 3 to 2 (to reduce administrative levels).
- c. Refresh cycles have changed back to less frequent model.
- d. Evaluation has changed and pricing and bidding will be line by line on all items. Previously, the method was to split total Standing Offer value evenly between successful bidders. This time, to adhere to Food&Beverage National Strategy, it will be line by line up to a maximum of three (3) Standing Offers per zone, per category.

Several examples cited. Further discussion ensued on the advantages and disadvantages on using this method. One concern regarding small order delivery was raised if only one or two item(s) awarded to a supplier. Major Franklin, representing Food Services (Ottawa) provided clarification that the orders from the base will be consolidated and the way items are delivered should not really change. All necessary items needed for the fleet, large and small were reviewed and basic consumption items used every day. Orders are expected to be large. Part of evaluation on Annex C of the Active Standing Offer was provided. Will involve a trial and error period and if too many issues arise, the process will be adjusted.

3. Changes to case sizes of items

- a. MWO McLaughlin explained the standards used on some items (yogurt was the example used) will be from the food service manual. Will accept substitutions at times. Major Franklin added that there are large and small food orders, not having to be exact, but relatively close to as stated in the guide. Further examples provided.
- b. Question brought up on unit conversion. The price conversion will be built into the spreadsheet provided by Acquisitions.

Further discussion on the types of units, price increases on substitutions or products for the end user (subs, small boats).

4. Term "Preferred Brand "

- a. Preferred brand will not mean the item will get preferential treatment. The word used before is incumbent brand. The supplier is not bound to this specific word. There are a few items that will not allow for substitutions (example, ketchup, artificial sweetener, and peanut butter), and must meet the food quality specification.

A list will be provided to suppliers on those specific items.

- b. Food specs are on the Buy and Sell Tender site.

Further discussion on the items, the specifications, and the sizes and quantities. It was stated the list had some duplications and no specifics on some items (such as meat). Should expect the list to become smaller as more efficiency is developed. Discussion on the deployed standing offer and how some quality specifications from the meat products could be used in other areas of food products. The start date for the new contract will be April 2014.

- c. Regarding the price update process, the format of spreadsheet cannot be changed other than the price columns. This process will allow for a faster processing as it will be linked to the DND National food ordering software.

5. Miscellaneous Clauses

Off contracts items are slowly being removed from the DND list. A separate quote may be required for items but a smaller list should be expected. It was noted that the miscellaneous clause is still included in the contract to allow the end user to be able to order food items not on the list.

Discussion on the issues created when withholding volumes on the lists. Vendors would prefer to see such numbers. However, from past purchases, the suppliers already know the appropriate consumption levels. MWO Mclaughlin noted the department does not want to be held liable for putting forward volumes that may be too high or too low. For the purpose of this Standing Offer a number may be provided even though the volumes will not be accurate.

Each line will be compared to other bidders. There will be no other inserting of prices when line items are blank as done previously. Comment by Major Franklin that the system of using line items on the Standing Offer has worked well for food services in the other regions.

6. Final Comments

Contact the Contracting Authority if there are any other questions. Government process requires translation services, therefore questions raised closer to the closing date may not get answered. Excel spreadsheets should be received by the end of next week.
