QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Question 1:

Does the \$6.32 per metre price to manufacture the blue, polyester and cotton coveralls include a profit or is it the price the government paid?

Answer 1:

With regards to the GAM, we are not nor have ever been selling these materials to make a profit. Our prices are based on moving averages, typically with Treasury Board mandated percentages to cover administrative costs (2%).

Question 2:

Can the material be purchased from another supplier?

Answer 2:

No.

Question 3:

I also wanted to know whether you earn a profit on the epaulettes and whether they can be made without purchasing them from the government.

Answer 3:

With regards to the GAM, we are not nor have ever been selling these materials to make a profit. Our prices are based on moving averages, typically with Treasury Board mandated percentages to cover administrative costs (2%).

Question 4:

I would have liked to know the amount of the winning bid in the last, similar bidding process, and the quantities involved.

Answer 4:

The previous requirement had a contract value of \$29,933.70 for a quantity of 500 Coveralls including Firm and Special quantities.

Question 5:

Are the Certifications of Compliance, such as those specific to the sewing thread under GS 1045-113 in paragraph 4.1.2 as well as the Zipper on paragraph 4.1.3, required when submitting or only if we are requested given we are selected?

Answer 5:

The Certificates of Compliance will be required after the bid closing date, upon a written request from the Contracting Authority, from the four (4) lowest bidders.

Question 6:

Where can we get to see Clause A3050T in regards to Canadian content? Should the document be included in the submittal?

Answer 6:

Please consult the Public Works and Government Services Canada website for the Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions (SACC) Manual for the full text of clause A3050T. At this time, it is only requested that the information as presented in the Request for Proposal be completed as part of the bid submission; please refer to Part 5, Section 2.2 for full detail.

Question 7:

On page 4 of the Specification sheets, there is a testing method CAN/CGSB-4.2 Textile Test Method mentioned. Since the fabric is supplied by the RCMP, is a textile testing still required?

Answer 7:

The testing textile methods are mentioned for reference to the material as the RCMP tested it. No additional textile testing is required.
