## **ADDENDUM NO. 2**

Further to the above mentioned Request for Proposal documentation previously posted on Buy and Sell, Addendum (#2) is hereby issued to revise documents in the Request for Proposal.

## Question 1

One of the mandatory requirements (noted on page 50 of the solicitation documents) is that of providing "proof that the proposed instructor(s) is approved by Transport Canada to teach Marine First Aid". If we are in the process of having the instructor(s) accredited by Transport Canada and have not yet received final approval, will our bid be discounted?

#### Answer 1

Instructors have to be in teaching status with the approved certification agency (St-John's Ambulance, Red Cross, ect)

Another mandatory requirement is that of providing "copies of all training material for assessment purposes". I have two associated questions:

## **Question 5**

In Appendix "C" Statement of Work, it explains this training is delivered in 5 days (40 hours). Yet in Appendix "B" Basis of Payment (page 30 para 3.), the definition of a day is 7.5 hours; therefore a 5 day period would be 37.5 hours. Can you clarify the client's exact expectation, so we can calculate accurately?

#### **Answer 5**

The Transport Canada course outline mentions a minimum number of hours, while we are asking for a 40 hour course over 5 days.
