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## **PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION**

### **1. Security Requirement**

## **PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS**

### **1. Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions**

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the [Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions](https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) (https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) Manual issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, certifications, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The 2003 2014-03-01 Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

**Subsection 1.4 and 1.5 of 2003, Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, does not form part of and not apply to the bid solicitation. All other subsections of '01 Code of Conduct and Certifications – Bid', form part of and apply to the bid solicitation.**

### **2. Submission of Bids**

Bids must be submitted only to Correctional Service Canada (CSC) by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

Due to the nature of the bid solicitation, bids transmitted by facsimile or email to CSC will not be accepted.

### **3. Enquiries - Bid Solicitation**

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than five (5) business days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the questions or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered with copies to all bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all bidders may not be answered by Canada.

### **4. Applicable Laws**

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in the province of Saskatchewan.

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

**Bidders are requested to submit their Financial Bid in an envelope separate from their technical proposal.**

CSC requests that bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their bid:

- i. use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- ii. use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of CSC will evaluate the bids.

D-3, the *Royal Canadian Mounted Police Pension Continuation Act*, 1970, c. R-10, and the *Royal Canadian Mounted Police Superannuation Act*, R.S., 1985, c. R-11, the *Members of Parliament Retiring Allowances Act*, R.S., 1985, c. M-5, and that portion of pension payable to the *Canada Pension Plan Act*, R.S., 1985, c. C-8.

## 6. Payment

## **11. Insurance**

### **11. Insurance Requirements**

- 11.1 The Contractor must comply with the insurance requirements specified in **Annex E** Insurance Requirements. The Contractor must maintain the required insurance coverage for the duration of the Contract. Compliance with the insurance requirements does not release the Contractor from or reduce its liability under the Contract.
- 11.2 The Contractor is responsible for deciding if additional insurance coverage is necessary to fulfill its obligation under the Contract and to ensure compliance with any applicable law. Any additional insurance coverage is at the Contractor's expense, and for its own benefit and protection.
- 11.3 The Contractor must forward to the Contracting Authority within ten (10) days after the date of award of the Contract, a Certificate of Insurance evidencing the insurance coverage and confirming that the insurance policy complying with the requirements is in force. Coverage must be placed with an Insurer licensed to carry out business in Canada. The Contractor must, if requested by the Contracting Authority, forward to Canada a certified true copy of all applicable insurance policies.

## **12. Ownership Control**

Where the Contractor will have access to any and all personal and confidential information belonging to Canada, CSC staff or inmates for the performance of the work, the following will apply:

- (a) The Contractor warrants that it is not under ownership control of any non-resident entity (ie. Individual, partnership, joint venture, corporation, limited liability company, parent company, affiliate or other).
- (b) The Contractor shall advise the Minister of any change in ownership control for the duration of the contract.
- (c) The Contractor acknowledges that the Minister has relied on this warranty in entering into this Contract and that, in the event of breach of such warranty, or in the event that the Contractor's ownership control becomes under a non-resident entity, the Minister shall have the right to treat this Contract as being in default and terminate the contract accordingly.
- (d) For the purposes of this clause, a non-resident entity is any individual, partnership, joint venture, corporation, limited liability company, parent company, affiliate or other residing outside of Canada.

## **13. Closure of Government Facilities**

- 13.1 Contractor personnel are employees of the Contractor and are paid by the Contractor on the basis of services rendered. Where the Contractor or the Contractor's employees are providing services on government premises pursuant to this Contract and the said premises become non accessible due to evacuation or closure of government facilities, and



consequently no Work is being performed as a result of the closure, Canada will not be liable for payment to the Contractor for the period of closure.

- 13.2 Contractors working at CSC sites should be aware that they may be faced with delay or refusal of entry to certain areas at certain times even if prior arrangements for access may have been made. Contractors are advised to call in advance of travel to ensure that planned access is still available.

#### **14. Tuberculosis Testing**

- 14.1 It is a condition of this contract that the Contractor or any employees of the Contractor who require entry into a Correctional Service of Canada Institution to fulfill the conditions of the contract may, at the sole discretion of the Warden, be required to provide proof of and results of a recent tuberculin test for the purpose of determining their TB infection status.
- 14.2 Failure to provide proof of and results of a tuberculin test may result in the termination of the contract.
- 14.3 All costs related to such testing will be at the sole expense of the Contractor.

#### **15. Compliance with CSC Policies**

- 15.1 The Contractor agrees that its officers, servants, agents and subcontractors will comply with all regulations and policies in force at the site where the work covered by this contract is to be performed.
- 15.2 Unless otherwise provided in the contract, the Contractor shall obtain all permits and hold all certificates and licenses required for the performance of the Work.
- 15.3 Details on existing CSC policies can be found at: [www.csc-scc.gc.ca](http://www.csc-scc.gc.ca) or any other CSC web page designated for such purpose.

#### **16. Health and Labour Conditions**

- 16.1 In this section, "Public Entity" means the municipal, provincial or federal government body authorized to enforce any laws concerning health and labour applicable to the performance of the Work or any part thereof.
- 16.2 The Contractor shall comply with all laws concerning health and labour conditions applicable to the performance of the Work or part thereof and shall also require compliance of same by all its subcontractors when applicable.
- 16.3 The Contractor upon any request for information or inspection dealing with the Work by an authorized representative of a Public Entity shall forthwith notify the Project Authority or Her Majesty.
- 16.4 Evidence of compliance with laws applicable to the performance of the Work or part thereof by either the Contractor or its subcontractor shall be furnished by the Contractor to the Project Authority or Her Majesty at such time as the Project Authority or Her Majesty may reasonably request."

#### **17. Dispute Resolution Services**



The parties understand that the Procurement Ombudsman appointed pursuant to Subsection 22.1(1) of the *Department of Public Works and Government Services Act* will, on request, and consent of the parties for both the process and to bear the cost of such process, assist in an alternative dispute resolution process to resolve any dispute between the parties respecting the interpretation or applicable of a term and condition of this contract. #### **18. Contract Administration**

The parties understand that the Procurement Ombudsman appointed pursuant to Subsection 22.1(1) of the *Department of Public Works and Government Services Act* will review a complaint filed by the contractor respecting administration of this contract if the requirements of Subsection 22.2(1) of the *Department of Public Works and Government Services Act* and Sections 15 and 16 of the *Procurement Ombudsman Regulations* have been met, and the interpretation and the application of the terms and conditions and the scope of work of this contract are not in dispute. 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## **ANNEX A – Statement of Work**

### **1. Background:**

The Regional Psychiatric Centre (Prairies) located in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan is a secure forensic mental hospital operated by the Correctional Service of Canada. The Centre currently houses approximately 210 patients, both male and female, referred from various correctional facilities in the Prairie region for assessment and treatment.

Part of CSC's mission is to provide safe, secure and humane control of offenders; CSC provides a variety of health care services to offenders, which includes the supply of prescription drugs and pharmaceuticals that support its health care programs.

The Correctional Service Canada has gone through a transitional phase of being taken on by a Correctional Services Canada New Pharmacy Program in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, however will still require a pharmacy contract for emergency situations. The estimated number of prescriptions filled through the contract for Pharmacy Services for RPC is approximately 2-3 prescriptions 3 times per week.

### **2. Objective:**

The goal of the Pharmacy Services Contract is to provide quality Pharmaceutical Services for inmates at the Institution as per the Health Services Manual.

### **3. Statement of Work:**

3.1 To provide pharmacy services for filling prescriptions (including methadone) that are prescribed by medical practitioners (doctors, dentist and psychiatrist under contract to the institution). The services must be provided by facility/personnel who are registered and licensed to provide such service in the province of Saskatchewan. CCHSA accredited standards must be maintained in the delivery of pharmaceutical services.

3.2 The prescriptions will be filled at the Contractor's facility.

3.3 The institution's program for providing medication to offenders is regulated through a variable Dosing System. This system necessitates the dispensing of medication either monthly, weekly, or daily in a bottle for individual use. Select medication will be dispensed from a Ward Stock, or blister pack. The Contractor will be required to respond accordingly. The Contractor shall provide a medication record that clearly has the medication, dosage, route of administration, time of administration and period that the prescription covers.

3.4 Delivery of the filled prescriptions will be accomplished by the following,

The institution requires that the Contractor delivers the filled orders to Health Care at the institution. Such deliveries, if required, shall be made by a carrier authorized/licensed and bonded to make such deliveries.

The institution shall provide a three-part prescription for narcotics orders, delivered to the Contractor prior to the dispensing of such orders.

3.5 Deliveries will occur with the use of a locked box. The pharmacist will have the key to the boxes provided by the institution. The pharmacist shall then lock the box and give it to the courier/driver/pharmacy staff for delivery.

- 3.6 Generic or least cost alternatives to the prescribed drugs should be provided whenever possible. The Contractor is to request advice from the prescribing physician as necessary if a particular drug is temporarily out of stock.
- 3.7 The institution retains a small stock of prescription drugs for emergencies and offender transfers and may submit prescriptions to the Contractor for restocking these items.
- 3.8 The Contractor shall dispose of unused or outdated drugs from the stock above and shall provide credit, where available.
- 3.9 Pharmacist's services shall be provided on-site for about 7.5 hours per week, or 30 hours per month, as arranged with the Project Authority to perform audits and update records as detailed herein. Consulting and advisory services are to be performed as and when requested by the institution, possibly involving a few days per year. The on-site services portion of the work may include:
- i) ensuring that records pertaining to implementation of physician's medication orders and medication administration, etc. are accurately maintained;
  - ii) administering the management of controlled and semi-controlled drugs, including monthly audits of drugs and dispensing sheets, and ensuring their proper storage and disposal;
  - iii) providing consulting service and problem solving advice to Health Care Services staff for both routine and emergency issues including: procedures development, educational programs, medication delivery system and inventory control, pharmaceutical supplier evaluations and maintaining accreditation standards;
  - iv) provide in-service presentations to other members of the treatment team or other institutional areas as may be identified;
  - v) participate in regional projects as identified, i.e. Regional Formulary, program evaluation and consultation to the Regional Manager, Health Care Services;
  - vi) serve quarterly on the Medication Review Committee as an advisor;
  - vii) the Contractor's invoices for prescriptions must be received at least monthly and the invoice must provide sub-totals as follows:

Service Charges, Methadone Cost, HIV Drug Costs, Psychiatric Drug Costs and all other Drug Costs; and returns for Credit.

CSC will provide a current copy of the CSC formulary to the contract pharmacy. The CSC formulary provides a list of eligible drug products available for supply by the pharmacy. Open listed medication on the CSC formulary do not require prior approval and maybe provided upon the request of the institution. Certain drug products on the CSC formulary are listed with criteria and require prior approval.

A limited supply of criteria medication maybe provided in urgent cases or outside the operating hours of the CSC Regional Pharmacy from 8:00 a.m to 4:00 p.m. (Saskatchewan time). Contact the Regional Pharmacy at the following number 306-975-6339.

Medications that are not listed on the CSC formulary are considered Non-Formulary. A limited supply of Non-Formulary medication maybe provided upon request of the institution for continuity and urgent care.

A copy of all prescriptions dispensed by the contract pharmacy is to be forwarded to the CSC Regional Pharmacy to ensure a complete medication file is maintained at the CSC Regional Pharmacy.

**4. Language of Work:**

The work shall be performed and delivered in English.

**5. Additional Information**

At the request of the Project Authority, the Contractor and their personnel shall attend orientation, security awareness and other appropriate courses developed by the Correctional Service of Canada.

### 1.0 Technical Evaluation:

**The following elements of the proposal will be evaluated and scored in accordance with the following evaluation criteria.**

Mandatory Technical Criteria

### 2.0 Evaluation Criteria:

- 1 In addressing the mandatory evaluation criteria, the Bidder should supplement the information supplied in response to the mandatory evaluation criteria with details outlining the depth and extent of the relevant experience, qualifications and specialized expertise of the proposed resource(s). All claims with regard to resource experience, qualifications or expertise must be substantiated through the provision of detailed project descriptions of how, when and where the claimed experience, qualifications or expertise were gained. Unsubstantiated claims of experience, qualifications or expertise will not be considered by the evaluation team during evaluation.
- 2 Proposals should include a résumé for each of the proposed resources, which support the skills/expertise being offered. Names and telephone number of business references should be provided which can substantiate the work experience claimed. The Bidder should indicate the location in the proposed resource's résumé of supporting information to substantiate relevant experience for each mandatory evaluation criteria.
- 3 Experience obtained after bid closing will not be considered.
- 4 For evaluation purposes,
  - (a) “where” means the name of the employer as well as the position/title held by the proposed resource;
  - (b) “when” means the start date and end date (e.g. from January, 2000 to March, 2002) of the period during which the proposed resource acquired the qualification/experience; and
  - (c) “how” means a clear description of the activities performed and the responsibilities assigned to the proposed resource under this position and during this period.
- 5 Furthermore, Bidders are also advised that the month(s) of experience listed for a project or experience whose timeframe overlaps that of another referenced project or experience will only be counted once. For example: Project 1 timeframe is July 2001 to December 2001; Project 2 timeframe is October 2001 to January 2002; the total months of experience for these two project references is seven (7) months.
- 6 In order to facilitate evaluation of proposals, it is recommended that bidders address, in their proposal, the mandatory and rated criteria in the order in which they appear below, using the numbering outlined below.
- 7 It is imperative that the proposal address each of these criteria to demonstrate that the requirements are met.

## ANNEX E - Insurance Requirements

### 1. Commercial General Liability Insurance:

- 1.1 The Contractor must obtain Commercial General Liability Insurance, and maintain it in force throughout the duration of the Contract, in an amount usual for a contract of this nature, but for not less than \$2,000,000 per accident or occurrence and in the annual aggregate.
- 1.2 The Commercial General Liability policy must include the following:
  - a) Additional Insured: Canada is added as an additional insured, but only with respect to liability arising out of the Contractor's performance of the Contract. The interest of Canada should read as follows: Canada, as represented by the Correctional Service of Canada.
  - b) Bodily Injury and Property Damage to third parties arising out of the operations of the Contractor.
  - c) Products and Completed Operations: Coverage for bodily injury or property damage arising out of goods or products manufactured, sold, handled, or distributed by the Contractor and/or arising out of operations that have been completed by the Contractor.
  - d) Personal Injury: While not limited to, the coverage must include Violation of Privacy, Libel and Slander, False Arrest, Detention or Imprisonment and Defamation of Character.
  - e) Cross Liability/Separation of Insureds: Without increasing the limit of liability, the policy must protect all insured parties to the full extent of coverage provided. Further, the policy must apply to each Insured in the same manner and to the same extent as if a separate policy had been issued to each.
  - f) Blanket Contractual Liability: The policy must, on a blanket basis or by specific reference to the Contract, extend to assumed liabilities with respect to contractual provisions.
  - g) Employees and, if applicable, Volunteers must be included as Additional Insured.
  - h) Employers' Liability (or confirmation that all employees are covered by Worker's compensation (WSIB) or similar program)
  - i) Broad Form Property Damage including Completed Operations: Expands the Property Damage coverage to include certain losses that would otherwise be excluded by the standard care, custody or control exclusion found in a standard policy.
  - j) Notice of Cancellation: The Insurer will endeavour to provide the Contracting Authority thirty (30) days written notice of policy cancellation.
  - k) If the policy is written on a claims-made basis, coverage must be in place for a period of at least 12 months after the completion or termination of the Contract.
  - l) Owners' or Contractors' Protective Liability: Covers the damages that the Contractor becomes legally obligated to pay arising out of the operations of a subcontractor.

### 2. Litigation Rights:

- 2.1 Pursuant to subsection 5(d) of the Department of Justice Act, S.C. 1993, c. J-2, s.1, if a suit is instituted for or against Canada which the Insurer would, but for this clause, have the right to pursue or defend on behalf of Canada as an Additional Named Insured under the insurance policy,



the Insurer must promptly contact the Attorney General of Canada to agree on the legal strategies by sending a letter, by registered mail or by courier, with an acknowledgement of receipt.

- 2.2 A copy of the letter must be sent to the Contracting Authority. Canada reserves the right to co-defend any action brought against Canada. All expenses incurred by Canada to co-defend such actions will be at Canada's expense. If Canada decides to co-defend any action brought against it, and Canada does not agree to a proposed settlement agreed to by the Contractor's insurer and the plaintiff(s) that would result in the settlement or dismissal of the action against Canada, then Canada will be responsible to the Contractor's insurer for any difference between the proposed settlement amount and the amount finally awarded or paid to the plaintiffs (inclusive of costs and interest) on behalf of Canada.

### **3. Medical Malpractice Liability Insurance:**

- 3.1 The Contractor must obtain Medical Malpractice Liability Insurance, and maintain it in force throughout the duration of the Contract, in an amount usual for a contract of this nature, but for not less than \$1,000,000 per loss and in the annual aggregate, inclusive of the defence costs.
- 3.2 Coverage is for what is standard in a Medical Malpractice policy and must be for claims arising out of the rendering or failure to render medical services resulting in injury, mental injury, illness, disease or death of any person caused by any negligent act, error or omission committed by the Contractor in or about the conduct of the Contractor's professional occupation or business of good samaritan acts.
- 3.3 If the policy is written on a claims-made basis, coverage must be in place for a period of at least 12 months after the completion or termination of the Contract.
- 3.4 Notice of Cancellation: The Insurer will endeavour to provide the Contracting Authority thirty (30) days written notice of cancellation.
