Technical enquiries that are of a "proprietary " nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as proprietary will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the questions or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered with copies to all bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all bidders may not be answered by Canada.

In Amendment No. 014 The answer to question 52 states “The subcontractor will include in its bid a fixed amount only for his expenses and accommodations. The cost for air fare will be covered with a 1379 action.”. The quote from Wartsila states that “Flights, fuel and travel time – to be covered by an arising”.

Q: Please confirm that fuel and travel time will be covered with a 1379 action.

By not allowing negotiation of proposals, Canada would be interfering in the natural application of market forces dictating competitiveness and not allowing all bidders the opportunity to play to their individual strengths.
