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## FRESH FRUITS AND VEGETABLES, CSC ALBERTA

### PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

#### 1. Introduction

The Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) is divided into six parts plus attachments and annexes, as follows:

#### 2. Summary

For the supply and delivery of Fresh Fruits and Vegetables for the Correctional Services Canada (CSC) Institutions in Alberta, as required during the period of the Standing Offer. The requirement is divided into the following six (6) locations:

1. Bowden Institution, Innisfail, Alberta;
2. Drumheller Institution, Drumheller, Alberta;
3. Edmonton Institution, Edmonton, Alberta;
4. Edmonton Institution for Women, Edmonton, Alberta;
5. Grande Cache Institution, Grande Cache, Alberta; and
6. Pê Sâkâstêw Centre, Maskwacis, Alberta.

The period of the standing offer will be for one (1) year from date of issuance of the Standing Offer. Refreshing of pricing will then be permitted to the Standing Offer Holder(s) on a monthly basis.

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Up to 6 Standing Offers could be issued under this procurement process. If an Offeror is being recommended for issuance of a Standing Offer for more than one location, only one Standing Offer will be issued to this supplier for those locations.

Offerors must submit a list of names , or other related information as needed, pursuant to section 01 of Standard Instructions 2006.

The requirement is subject to the provisions of the World Trade Organization Agreement on Government Procurement (WTO-AGP), the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), and the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT).

### **3. Debriefings**

Offerors may request a debriefing on the results of the request for standing offers process. Offerors should make the request to the Standing Offer Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the request for standing offers process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

## PART 2 - OFFEROR INSTRUCTIONS

### 1. Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) by number, date and title are set out in the *Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual* (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Offerors who submit an offer agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the RFSO and accept the clauses and conditions of the Standing Offer and resulting contract(s).

### 2. Submission of Offers

Offers must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the Request for Standing Offers.

### 3. Enquiries - Request for Standing Offers

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Standing Offer Authority no later than five (5) calendar days before the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Offerors should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the RFSO to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by offerors to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that offerors do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all offerors. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all offerors may not be answered by Canada.

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#### **4. Applicable Laws**

The Standing Offer and any contract resulting from the Standing Offer must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Alberta.

Offerors may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their offer, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the offerors.

Prices must appear in the financial offer only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the offer.

Canada requests that offerors follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their offer.

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to that of the Request for Standing Offers.

In April 2006, Canada issued a policy directing federal departments and agencies to take the necessary steps to incorporate environmental considerations into the procurement process Policy on Green Procurement

- 1) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper containing fibre certified as originating from a sustainably-managed forest and containing minimum 30% recycled content; and
- 2) use an environmentally-preferable format including black and white printing instead of colour printing, printing double sided/duplex, using staples or clips instead of cerlox, duotangs or binders.

## PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

### 1. Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Offers will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the Request for Standing Offers including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the offers.

#### 1.1 Financial Evaluation

The estimated values identified under Annex "B" are for evaluation purposes only.

The total aggregate evaluated amount for each offer and per location is calculated by:

1. multiplying the unit price for each product by their weekly estimated quantity (ie. Drumheller unit price for line item #1 multiplied by estimated usages for that specific institution); plus
2. the offered wait time price under page 19, Annex "B", item "B" multiplied by an estimated one (1) wait time; and

summing all these values to determined the total evaluated offered price of the offer per location.

Pricing must be provided for a minimum of 90% of the items listed in Annex "B" - Basis of Payment (per location). Failure to provide pricing for 90% of the items will render the offer non-complaint without further consideration being given. Evaluations will be performed per location. Offeror is not obligated to provide pricing for all locations to be considered for a Standing Offer.

### 2. Basis of Selection

An offer must comply with the requirements of the Request for Standing Offers to be declared responsive. The responsive offer with the lowest evaluated price on an aggregate basis will be recommended for issuance of a standing offer.

Up to 6 Standing Offers could be issued under this procurement process. If an Offeror is being recommended for issuance of a Standing Offer for more than one location, only one Standing Offer will be issued to this supplier for those locations.

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## PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS

Offerors must provide the required certifications and associated information to be issued a standing offer.

The certifications provided by offerors to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Canada will declare an offer non-responsive, will have the right to set-aside a standing offer, or will declare a contractor in default in carrying out any of its obligations under any resulting contracts, if any certification made by the Offeror is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly during the offer evaluation period, during the Standing Offer period, or during the contract period.

The Standing Offer Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Offeror's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Standing Offer Authority may render the Offer non-responsive, may result in the setting aside of the Standing Offer or constitute a default under the Contract.

At all times, the Contractor must ensure that 90 % off all the food items listed at Annex "B" are available for regular purchase.

**ANNEX "B"****BASIS OF PAYMENT**

F.O.B. destination (locations specified in Annex "A"), including all ecology fees, deposits, delivery, offloading and fuel charges, Canadian customs duties and excise tax included. Additional surcharges will not be accepted. All delivery cost must be included in the cost of food ordered.

Pricing must be provided for a minimum of 90% of all items per location listed in Annex "B" - Basis of Payment. Failure to provide pricing for a minimum of 90% of the items will render the offer non-complaint without further consideration being given. Offerors are not required to provide pricing for all locations to be deemed compliant for a location.

Pricing is to remain valid from date of issuance of Standing Offer for a period of one (1) month. This period is in addition to the bid validity period identified under Part 2, article 1.
