QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Question 1:

Part 1 under Summary states the qualified PhD Psychologist must be "eligible for a license to practice in the Northwest Territories" (pg 4).

In Part 5 – Certifications, under 2.3 Copy of Registration Certificate with Dept. of Health & Social Services, Government of NWT it states "Certificate identifying the Psychologist is licensed to practice in the Northwest Territories."

Again in Annex A Statement of Work, it states the Psychologist must be "eligible for licensing with the Department of Health and Social Services, Government of Northwest Territories" (pg 21).

Please clarify if the license to practice is required with the bid submission.

2. Additional Certifications Precedent to Contract Award

The certifications listed below should be completed and submitted with the bid but may be submitted afterwards. 2.3 Copy of Registration Certificate with Dept. of Health & Social Services, Government of NWT

It is not anticipated bidders will obtain licensing in advance with the Government of NWT. The successful bidder will be required to obtain licensing prior to contract award in the time frame identified by the Contracting Authority.

Question 2:

In ANNEX B BASIS OF PAYMENT the hours of work are specified as:

2080 hours for the first 24 months

1040 hours for each of the remaining two 12 month options

This translates into a contract commitment of 20 hours per week ($20 \times 52 = 1040 \times 2 = 2080$) for the first two years and the same 20 hours for the two option years ($20 \times 52 = 1040$). However in the **SCOPE OF WORK** section of **ANNEX A** the Contract requires a commitment of "between thirty (30) and forty (40) hours per week" (p. 21)

Answer 2:

Annex B, Basis of Payment, identifies an **estimated** level of effort block and a **firm** hourly rate block for a total cost used in the evaluation process. The hours noted are an estimate. The bidder enters their firm bid price here.

The hours required of this contract are identified in the Scope of Work "between thirty (30) and forty (40) hours per week".
