- Q1. Do you allow NP to work full 8 hours per day?
- A1. No the contract is for **up to** 20 hours per week, may not utilize the whole 20 hours.
- Q2. Do you allow NP to work 10 hours per day? 2 days a week?
- A2. No the contract is for **up to** 20 hours per week, may not utilize the whole 20 hours.
- Q3. Do you allow NPs to have some hours to do research/finding information/case management and studying about patient problems in the clinic hours?

- Q4. It is confusing that clause 11.1 states maximum 6 hours per week and the subsequent tables stated maximum 20 hours per week. What are the exact hours NP to do clinic per week? How it is being distributed each day?

- Q5. It is difficult to find any NP to do part time work therefore; may be able to find some NPs to undertake this work if a full day work is allowed either 8 hr or 10 hr per day?
