1.2 Summary

A Regional Individual Standing Offer for the supply and delivery of Setina Prisoner Partition Shields for the Royal Canadian Mounted Police for the provinces of Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba on an "as required" basis. Full details of the requirement are detailed in the Requested for Standing Offer (RFSO).

The duration of the Standing Offer is from the date of issuance to 31 March 2016 with two (2) option years (01 April 2016 to 31 March 2017 and 01 April 2017 to 31 March 2018).

As per the Integrity Provisions under section 01 of Standard Instructions 2006 and 2007, offerors must provide a list of all owners and/or Directors and other associated information as required. Refer to section 4.21 of the Supply Manual for additional information on the Integrity Provisions.

The requirement is subject to the provisions of the World Trade Organization Agreement on Government Procurement (WTO-AGP), the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), and the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT).

2.2 Submission of Offers

Offers must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the Request for Standing Offers.

2.3 Enquiries - Request for Standing Offers

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Standing Offer Authority no later than fifteen (15) calendar days before the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Offerors should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the RFSO to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by offerors to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that offerors do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all offerors. 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4.2 Basis of Selection

The lowest aggregate offer price for Financial Evaluation A, Financial Evaluation B and Financial Evaluation C will be awarded a Standing Offer.

PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS
