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THIS AMENDMENT #002 IS RAISED TO AMEND THE RFSO/SA AND ANSWER QUESTIONS RECEIVED.

REASON FOR AMENDMENT:

Canada is publishing herein responses to enquiries that it received pertaining to this solicitation subject to Period 1 - Initial Question Period as set out in accordance with Article 2.7 - Enquiries - Request for Bids. Please note that Canada may respond to questions in a non-sequential order, but all questions submitted during Period 1 will be answered and industry will be notified when Canada is proceeding to Period 2 - Supplementary Question Period.

1. At Part 1, Article 1.2 - Summary, sub-article ii. Existing Standing Offer and/or Supply Arrangement Holders on page 6 of the RFSO/SA:

Add:

Scenario:

A Supplier is currently a SA Holder but does not hold a Standing Offer. The Supplier is now seeking to become a new SO Holder for the same categories for which they currently have a SA. To do so, the Supplier must submit a bid in DCC and must select the SO and select (by checking off in CPSS) the regions, categories and levels for which the Supplier wishes to offer rates for Financial Evaluation under the SO. The Supplier will then enter its rates. The Supplier will identify the SO categories in the DCC as "currently substantiated" and will be required to submit the Grandfather Certification in the DCC and in print (found at Attachment E of the RFSO/SA). The Supplier must refer to Part 3, Article 3.1.3 – Bid Submission Grid found on page 17 of the RFSO/SA (E60ZN-15TSPS/A).

Canada will not clarify the pre-qualified categories selected by the Supplier to include in their offer. Canada reserves the right to remove categories included in the offer for which the Supplier is not already qualified and has not provided the required information as per Part 3, Article 3.1.3 – Bid Submission Grid found on page 17 of the RFSO/SA (E60ZN-15TSPS/A) and Attachment C to substantiate the categories.

2. At Part 6B, Article 6.2.3 - Tier 1 Requirement Limitations, sub-article (i) on page 35 of the RFSO/SA:

The following change is being made to align TSPS with PWGSC's National Strategy for Professional Services. All directed requirements valued below \$25,000 must be processed through ProServices (<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/app-acq/sp-ps/index-eng.html>). In order to qualify for ProServices, Suppliers should consult the [ProServices solicitation](#) on [Buyandsell.gc.ca](#). ProServices is a separate method of supply and requires a separate bid submission. TSPS will not evaluate bids submitted in response to a ProServices solicitation.

Delete:

- (i) **Requirement Valued below \$25,000 (applicable taxes included):**
Clients may direct a contract to an eligible Supplier in accordance with the Government Contracts Regulations.

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Replace with:

- (i) **Intentionally left blank**

3. At Part 7B, Article 7.11 – Insurance Requirements on page 57 of the RFSO/SA:

Delete: in its entirety

Replace with:

7.11.1 Insurance requirement for all Categories listed in Stream 1, Stream 2, Stream 3 and/or Stream 4 as applicable to the offered services are set out in the Standing Offer:

7.11.1.1 The Contractor is responsible for deciding if insurance coverage is necessary to fulfill its obligation under the Contract and to ensure compliance with any applicable law. Any insurance acquired or maintained by the Contractor is at its own expense and for its own benefit and protection. It does not release the Contractor from or reduce its liability under the Contract.

7.11.2 Insurance requirement for Categories listed under Stream 5:

7.11.2.1 The Contractor must maintain the insurance requirements specified in section 7.11.2.2 below. The Contractor must maintain the required insurance coverage for the duration of the Contract. Compliance with the insurance requirements does not release the Contractor from or reduce its liability under the Contract.

The Contractor is responsible for deciding if additional insurance coverage is necessary to fulfill its obligation under the Contract and to ensure compliance with any applicable law. Any additional insurance coverage is at the Contractor's expense, and for its own benefit and protection.

The Contractor must forward to the Contracting Authority within ten (10) days after the date of award of the Contract, a Certificate of Insurance evidencing the insurance coverage and confirming that the insurance policy complying with the requirements is in force. Coverage must be placed with an Insurer licensed to carry out business in Canada. The Contractor must, if requested by the Contracting Authority, forward to Canada a certified true copy of all applicable insurance policies.

7.11.2.2 The Contractor must obtain Commercial General Liability Insurance, and maintain it in force throughout the duration of the Contract, in an amount usual for a contract of this nature, but for not less than \$2,000,000 per accident or occurrence and in the annual aggregate.

The Commercial General Liability policy must include the following:

- a. Additional Insured: Canada is added as an additional insured, but only with respect to liability arising out of the Contractor's performance of the Contract. The interest of Canada should read as follows: Canada, as represented by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

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- b. Bodily Injury and Property Damage to third parties arising out of the operations of the Contractor.
- c. Products and Completed Operations: Coverage for bodily injury or property damage arising out of goods or products manufactured, sold, handled, or distributed by the Contractor and/or arising out of operations that have been completed by the Contractor.
- d. Personal Injury: While not limited to, the coverage must include Violation of Privacy, Libel and Slander, False Arrest, Detention or Imprisonment and Defamation of Character.
- e. Cross Liability/Separation of Insureds: Without increasing the limit of liability, the policy must protect all insured parties to the full extent of coverage provided. Further, the policy must apply to each Insured in the same manner and to the same extent as if a separate policy had been issued to each.
- f. Blanket Contractual Liability: The policy must, on a blanket basis or by specific reference to the Contract, extend to assumed liabilities with respect to contractual provisions.
- g. Employees and, if applicable, Volunteers must be included as Additional Insured.
- h. Employers' Liability (or confirmation that all employees are covered by Worker's compensation (WSIB) or similar program)
- i. Broad Form Property Damage including Completed Operations: Expands the Property Damage coverage to include certain losses that would otherwise be excluded by the standard care, custody or control exclusion found in a standard policy.
- j. Notice of Cancellation: The Insurer will endeavour to provide the Contracting Authority thirty (30) days written notice of policy cancellation.
- k. If the policy is written on a claims-made basis, coverage must be in place for a period of at least 12 months after the completion or termination of the Contract.
- l. Litigation Rights: Pursuant to subsection 5(d) of the Department of Justice Act, S.C. 1993, c. J-2, s.1, if a suit is instituted for or against Canada which the Insurer would, but for this clause, have the right to pursue or defend on behalf of Canada as an Additional Named Insured under the insurance policy, the Insurer must promptly contact the Attorney General of Canada to agree on the legal strategies by sending a letter, by registered mail or by courier, with an acknowledgement of receipt.

All expenses incurred by Canada to co-defend such actions will be at Canada's expense. If Canada decides to co-defend any action brought against it, and Canada does not agree to a proposed settlement agreed to by the Contractor's insurer and the plaintiff(s) that would result in the settlement or dismissal of the action against Canada, then Canada will be responsible to the Contractor's insurer for any difference between the proposed settlement amount and the amount finally awarded or paid to the plaintiffs (inclusive of costs and interest) on behalf of Canada.

7.11.3 Insurance requirement for Category 5.4 Professional Engineer (P. Eng):

In addition to the insurance requirements detailed in 7.11.2 above:

7.11.3.1 The Contractor must obtain Errors and Omissions Liability (a.k.a. Professional Liability) insurance, and maintain it in force throughout the duration of the Contract, in an amount usual for a contract of this nature but for not less than \$1,000,000 per loss and in the annual aggregate, inclusive of defence costs.

7.11.3.2 If the policy is written on a claims-made basis, coverage must be in place for a period of at least 12 months after the completion or termination of the Contract.

7.11.3.3 The following endorsement must be included:

Notice of Cancellation: The Insurer will endeavour to provide the Contracting Authority thirty (30) days written notice of cancellation.

Question 1:

It is our understanding that BOTH our Supply Arrangement (Solutions) and SO/SA Tasks "standing" will no longer be valid as of June 2015 unless we are to resubmit during these renewal processes that closes March 23, 2015? Is this correct?

Answer 1:

Correct. As per Component II, Part 6A, Article 6.4.2 – Request for Supply Arrangement Bid Solicitation found on page 29 of the RFSO/SA (E60ZN-15TSPS/A) and Component II, Part 6A, Article 6.4.2 – Request for Supply Arrangement Solicitation found on page 30 of the RFSO (E60ZN-15TSSB/A), all arrangements whether issued during a refresh solicitation period or as the result of an arrangement submitted on the closing date of an annual renewal solicitation will be replaced when a renewal solicitation occurs. Therefore, all Suppliers must submit an arrangement before the closing date of a renewal solicitation in order to continue to provide services under its resulting Supply Arrangement. As per Component III, Part 7A, Article 7.4.2 – Request for Standing Offer Bid Solicitation found on page 43 of the RFSO/SA (E60ZN-15TSPS/A), all Offerors must submit a bid before the closing date of a renewal bid solicitation in order to continue to provide services under its resulting Standing Offer.

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Suppliers holding existing awards under series E60ZN-13TSPS/XXX/ZN, E60ZN-13TSSO/XXX/ZN and E60ZN-13TSSB/XXX/ZN will be notified when their awards are set aside and are no longer available for use.

Question 2:

In reference to the Bid Submission Grids published in both RFSO/SA and RFSA. In these two grids, are the rows titled "Mandatory M.1 – all Streams" & "Mandatory M.2 – all streams" and the row called "Mandatory M.3 – all streams" (in the RFSO/SA) (page 17 of the RFSA and of the RFSO/SA) refer to:

- a) Rows MTS B1-MTS1 and B1-MTS2 (For Streams 1, 2 3 and 5) in the RFSA on page 3 of Attachment B? If not, where are the M1 and M2 requirements?
- b) Rows MTS B1-MTT1 and B1-MTT2 and B1 –MTT3 (For Streams 1, 2 3 and 5) in the RFSO/SA – i.e. on page 3 of Attachment B? If not, where are the M1 and M2 and M3 requirements?

Answer 2:

Canada has created the following table to assist Suppliers in cross-referencing the mandatory requirements ("M.x") in the Bid Submission Grid found at Part 3, Article 3.1.3 on page 17 of the RFSO/SA (E60ZN-15TSPS/A) to the mandatory criteria found at Attachment B and Attachment C of the RFSO/SA. This table also cross-references the mandatory requirements ("M.x") of the Arrangement Submission Grid found at Part 3, Article 3.1.3 on page 17 of the RFSA (E60ZN-13TSSB/A) to the mandatory criteria found at Attachment B of the RFSA.

Question 3:

As an existing TSPS holder, we do not want to change our technical response already on file from previous TSPS solicitation (E60ZN-13TSPS/B or E60ZN-13TSPS/C or E60ZN-13TSSB/B or E60ZN-13TSSB/C). Are we correct to interpret the Bid Submission Grid (RFSO/SA) and Arrangement Submission (RFSA), Column C, Section 1 **do not need us to resubmit any new project experiences** in our technical response E60ZN-15TSPS/A or E60ZN-15TSSB/A? We only need to have the grandfather certification signed? We understand we need to resubmit rates, however.

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Answer 3:

For RFSO/SA –

As per the Bid Submission Grid at Part 3, Article 3.1.3 found on page 17 of the RFSO/SA (E60ZN-15TSPS/A), if you are not changing your technical response, you must complete the Grandfather Certification in the DCC and in print for M.2 and M.3 and the Grandfather Certification in the DCC only for M.1. You are not required to submit project summaries for Categories for which you have been qualified under a previous Task solicitation (E60ZN-13TSPS/B or E60ZN-13TSPS/C). Rates are only required for the Standing Offer portion of the RFSO/SA (E60ZN-15TSPS/A). You must submit new rates, subject to a new Financial Evaluation as described in Attachment D, if you wish to retain your Standing Offer. There will be no carry-over of rates from the previous solicitation.

For RFSA –

As per the Arrangement Submission Grid at Part 3, Article 3.1.3 found on page 17 of the RFSA (E60ZN-15TSSB/A), if you are not changing your technical response, you must complete the Grandfather Certification in the DCC and in print for M.2 and the Grandfather Certification in the DCC only for M.1. You are not required to submit project summaries for Streams for which you have been qualified under a previous Solution solicitation (E60ZN-13TSSB/B or E60ZN-13TSSB/C). Rates are not required for the Solution RFSA (E60ZN-15TSSB/A).

Question4:

We are asking Question no. 3 because some of our client experience summaries originally submitted our response to the **RFSA** are now outside the 5 years now listed in B1-MTS2, albeit we can certify that we have done similar large work/projects since then. The confusion comes from the statement made in the RFSA to the effect that project experiences must have been obtained within 5 years of RFSA closing, in this case, March 23 2015 and then there is a statement on the next page that says *“A Supplier may use a project summary(ies) submitted in a previous TSPS solicitation provided the criteria noted above (a through e) are met”*. Yet, in Section IV of the Grandfather certification in Attachment C, (page 1) indicates that as long as we attest that *“since the date the mandatory or certification was first met (as evidenced by the date of issuance of the supply arrangement) the Supplier has continuously met at the date of arrangement submissions all the qualification requirements related to the supply arrangement necessary to remain a supplier of the Services, and no arrangement has been cancelled by PWGSC or withdrawn by the Supplier”*. **We are therefore assuming that we do not need to resubmit additional client experience and by signing this certification, we will not be deemed non-compliant because project experience on files at PWGSC are now older than the 5 year limit. Is this correct?**

Answer 4:

If Suppliers wish to carry forward their Solution Supply Arrangement as previously awarded under E60ZN-13TSSB/B or E60ZN-13TSSB/C to maintain the Streams for which they are currently qualified, they must complete the Grandfather Certification in the DDC and in print (found at Attachment C of the RFSA). Please refer to Part 3, Article 3.1.3 – Arrangement Submission Grid found on page 17 of the RFSA (E60ZN-15TSSB/A). They do not need to re-submit project summaries for Streams for which they are already qualified.

If Suppliers wish to carry forward their Task Supply Arrangement as previously awarded under E60ZN-13TSPS/B or E60ZN-13TSPS/C to maintain the Categories for which they are currently qualified, they must complete the Grandfather Certification in the DCC and in print (found at Attachment E of the RFSO/SA). Please refer to Part 3, Article 3.1.3 – Bid Submission Grid found on page 17 of the RFSO/SA (E60ZN-15TSPS/A). Suppliers do not need to re-submit project summaries for Categories for which they are already qualified.

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If Suppliers wish to carry forward their Task Standing Offer as previously awarded under E60ZN-13TSPS/B to maintain the Categories for which they are currently qualified, they must complete the Grandfather Certification in the DCC and in print (found at Attachment E of the RFSO/SA). Please refer to Part 3, Article 3.1.3 – Bid Submission Grid found on page 17 of the RFSO/SA (E60ZN-15TSPS/A). Suppliers must submit new rates, subject to a new Financial Evaluation as described in Attachment D, if they wish to retain their Standing Offer.

Question 5:

In the RFSO/SA, we see that our projects can date of no older than May 26, 2006, but for the RFSA, there is a 5 year prior of RFSA closing. Is this an error in the RFSO/SA?

Answer 5:

No, this is not an error. As the RFSO/SA and the RFSA are separate and distinct solicitations, the mandatory requirements for each of these solicitations are separate and distinct. The "May 26, 2006" requirement has been consistently used in the RFSO/SA solicitations and the "5-year prior to bid closing" requirement has been consistently used in the RFSA solicitations.

Question 6:

We are an existing SA Holder awarded under bid solicitation E60ZN-13TSSB/C and E60ZN-13TSPS/C.

Can you tell me if we have to redo the complete submission process to qualify or do we only need to provide a submission in order to qualify for tiers, regions, metropolitan areas and categories for which we do not currently hold a supply arrangement?

Answer 6:

You do not need to redo the complete bid submission process. As described in the Bid Submission Grid at Part 3, Article 3.1.3 found on page 17 of the RFSO/SA (E60ZN-15TSPS/A) and the Arrangement Submission Grid found on page 17 of the RFSA (E60ZN-15TSSB/A), you only need to submit a bid/arrangement to qualify for the tiers, streams, regions, metropolitan areas and/or categories for which you do not currently hold a supply arrangement. If you are not adding tiers, streams, regions, metropolitan areas and/or categories, you must follow the respective submission grids of each of the solicitations and submit the information required in Column C.

Question 7:

There are two bids on MERX and I just wanted clarification as they both appear to be identical with a slightly different name.

Can you please tell me if TSPS - RFSO/SA Tasks Based (E60ZN-15TSPS/A) is the same as the RFSA Solutions Based (E60ZN-15TSSB/A)

Answer 7:

As the RFSO/SA (E60ZN-15TSPS/A) and the RFSA (E60ZN-15TSSB/A) are separate and distinct solicitations, the mandatory requirements for each of these solicitations are separate and distinct. E60ZN-15TSPS/A is a task-based solicitation which will result in multiple Standing Offers and Supply Arrangements. E60ZN-15TSSB/A is a solution-based solicitation which will result in a multiple Supply Arrangements. Therefore, Suppliers must bid on each solicitation separately and meet the requirements set out in each accordingly.

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Question 8:

What do I do if I am an existing SA Holder and would now like to become a SO Holder?

Answer 8:

A Supplier is currently a SA Holder but does not hold a Standing Offer. The Supplier is now seeking to become a new SO Holder for the same categories for which they currently have a SA. To do so, the Supplier must submit a bid in DCC and must select the SO and select (by checking off in CPSS) the regions, categories and levels for which the Supplier wishes to propose rates for Financial Evaluation under the SO. The Supplier will then enter its rates. The Supplier will identify the SO categories in the DCC as "currently substantiated" and will be required to submit the Grandfather Certification in the DCC and in print (found at Attachment E of the RFSO/SA). The Supplier must refer to Part 3, Article 3.1.3 – Bid Submission Grid found on page 17 of the RFSO/SA (E60ZN-15TSPS/A).

As a result of this question, the above scenario is added to the content under "*Existing Standing Offer and/or Supply Arrangement Holders*" under Article 1.2 Summary, sub-article ii. (page 6 of the RFSO/SA).

Question 9:

Can we submit our submission electronically?

Answer 9:

As per Part 2, Article 2.3 Submission of Bids found on page 11 of the RFSO/SA (E60ZN-13TSPS/A) and Part 2, Article 2.3 Submission of Arrangements found on page 11 of the RFSA (E60ZN-13TSSB/A), certain aspects of the submission are required physically (in print) and others are required electronically. Please refer to Article 2.3 of the respective solicitations for additional information as well as the Bid Submission Grid at Part 3, Article 3.1.3 found on page 17 of the RFSO/SA (E60ZN-15TSPS/A) and Arrangement Submission Grid at Part 3, Article 3.1.3 found on page 17 of the RFSA (E60ZN-15TSSB/A).

Suppliers are reminded of and/or referred to the following:

- 1) The solicitation closing date for both the RFSO/SA (E60ZN-13TSPS/A) and the RFSA (E60ZN-13TSSB/A) is 2:00pm EDT on March 23, 2015.

- 6) Under the RFSA (E60ZN-13TSSB/A), if a Supplier wishes to add new streams to their existing SA, the mandatory requirements as set out in Attachment B must be met in accordance with the Arrangement Submission Grid at Part 3, Article 3.1.3 found on page 17.

Question 10:

Can I combine my bid submissions for both E60ZN-15TSPS/A and E60ZN-15TSSB/A and my response to any other bid solicitation closing on the same day as E60ZN-15TSPS/A and E60ZN-15TSSB/A in one envelope, package or box and send them to PWGSC?

Answer 10:

No. If a Bidder chooses to participate in more than one competitive process, each proposal must be presented as a physically separate document in its own envelope, clearly marked with the Solicitation Number specific to the Solicitation to which the Bidder is responding and delivered in accordance with the delivery instructions for that specific Solicitation. If a Bidder sends in the same envelope more than one bid, Canada will, at its own discretion, choose which bid it will evaluate.
