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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Requirement

The requirement is detailed under Annex "A" of the resulting contract clauses.

1.2 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

1.3 Trade Agreements

This requirement is subject to the provision of the World Trade Organization Agreement on Government Procurement (WTO-AGP) and the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) and the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT).

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the *Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual* (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The **2003** (2014-09-25) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than **fourteen (14) calendar days** before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in British Columbia.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the bidders.

PART 3 - BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Bid Preparation Instructions

Canada requests that bidders provide their bid in separately bound sections as follows:

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

Canada requests that bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their bid:

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

In April 2006, Canada issued a policy directing federal departments and agencies to take the necessary steps to incorporate environmental considerations into the procurement process [Policy on Green Procurement](http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html) (<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html>). To assist Canada in reaching its objectives, bidders should:

- 1) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper containing fibre certified as originating from a sustainably-managed forest and containing minimum 30% recycled content; and
- 2) use an environmentally-preferable format including black and white printing instead of colour printing, printing double sided/duplex, using staples or clips instead of cerlox, duotangs or binders.

Section I: Technical Bid

(a) In their technical bid, bidders should explain and demonstrate how they propose to meet the requirements and how they will carry out the Work.

(b) The technical bid should consists of the following:

(1) Bid Submission Form: Bidders are requested to include the Bid Submission Form with their bids. It provides a common form in which bidders can provide information required for evaluation and contract award, such as a contact name, the Bidder's Procurement Business Number, the Bidder's status under the Federal Contractors Program for Employment Equity, etc. Using the form to provide this information is not mandatory, but it is recommended. If Canada determines that the information required by the Bid Submission Form is incomplete or requires correction, Canada will provide the Bidder with an opportunity to do so.

(2) Substantiation of Technical Compliance Form - Mandatory: The technical bid must substantiate the compliance of the Bidder and its proposed product with the specific articles of Annex A (Requirement) identified in the Substantiation of Technical Compliance Form, which is the requested format for providing the substantiation. The Substantiation of Technical Compliance Form is not required to address any parts of this bid solicitation not referenced in the form. The substantiation must not simply be a repetition of the requirement(s), but must explain and demonstrate how the Bidder will meet the requirements and carry out the required Work. Simply stating that the Bidder or its proposed solution or

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product complies is not sufficient. Where Canada determines that the substantiation is not complete, the Bidder will be considered non-responsive and disqualified. The substantiation may refer to additional documentation submitted with the bid - this information can be referenced in the "Reference" column of the Substantiation of Technical Compliance Form, where bidders are requested to indicate where in the bid the reference material can be found, including the title of the document, and the page and paragraph numbers; where the reference is not sufficiently precise, Canada may request that the Bidder direct Canada to the appropriate location in the documentation.

(3) Technical Specifications - Mandatory: The technical bid must include the Mobile Trailers detailed specifications. Drawings if available should be included with their bid.

Section II: Financial Bid

Bidders must submit their financial bid in accordance with the Basis of Payment. The total amount of Applicable Taxes must be shown separately.

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

4.1.1 Technical Evaluation

4.1.1.1 Mandatory Technical Criteria

Failure to meet any of the following mandatory criteria at bid closing will render your submission non-responsive and will be given no further consideration.

- A) Bidders must demonstrate and provide sufficient information and documentation to support compliance with the mandatory requirements listed in Annex "A".
- B) Bidders must provide firm pricing for all items in accordance with Annex "B" Basis of Payment.
- C) Bidders must accept PWGSC General Terms and Conditions and Resulting Contract Clauses contained in this Request for Proposal (RFP).

4.2 Basis of Selection

A bid must comply with the requirements of the bid solicitation and meet all mandatory technical evaluation criteria to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for award of a contract.

PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS

Bidders must provide the required certifications and associated information to be awarded a contract.

The certifications provided by bidders to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default in carrying out any of its obligations under the Contract, if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority may render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

5.1 Certifications Precedent to Contract Award

The certifications listed below should be completed and submitted with the bid, but may be submitted afterwards. If any of these required certifications is not completed and submitted as requested, the Contracting Authority will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to comply with the request of the Contracting Authority and to provide the certifications within the time frame provided will render the bid non-responsive.

1.0 SCOPE

1.1 Title

Supply of a Mobile Wet Lab Trailer.

1.2 Introduction

Fisheries and Oceans Canada requires a new mobile fish tagging trailer for its Inch Creek salmon enhancement facility in Mission, BC.

The trailer must be modified for fish tagging. The trailer is to be delivered to the delivery site by the Contractor.

2.0 REQUIREMENTS

The mobile fish tagging trailer must meet the following specifications:

2.1 Dimension: 10' x 32' Feet

2.2 Building Exterior

- a. Trailer to be dark brown in colour
- b. Exterior trim to be dark green in colour
- c. Vinyl windows three (3) per side. Window dimensions to be a minimum of 48" horizontally x 36" vertically vinyl sealed sliders, complete with screen, pre finished white. All casing in pre-finished light oak. Exterior drip cap.
- d. Metal siding
- e. Metal fascia to be located around the perimeter of the roof. Fascia to be 30 gauge steel fascia x 18" high, prefinished.
- f. Mounted on steel frame trailer with adjustable levelling jack Stands on corners of trailer
- f. Access ramp to be included with trailer
- g. Trailer is to be on wheels (mobile)

2.3 Interior

- a. interior wall height 8' or higher
- b. interior walls to be FRP (Fibreglass Reinforced Plastic)
- c. floor to be non-slip surface
- d. floors to be a minimum of 2mm thick commercial application sheet vinyl with welded seams. Floor must continue up walls 15cms.
- e. trailer to be complete with four (4) evenly spaced floor drains centred along the trailer

- f. switches lights and wiring to be concealed in conduit
- g. all plugs to be surface mounted @44" O.F.F. (Off Finished Floor)

- a. Floor Live Load 100psf (Pounds per square foot)
- b. Roof live load 60psf
- c. Trailer must have dual axels and be designed to support loading requirements as determined in the latest version of the BC building code.

- a. Outlets to be rated for wet or damp service
- b. GFI (Ground Fault Interrupter) equipped
- c. Electrical outlets to be surface mounted 44" O.F.F. and wired in pipe switches and plugs wiring to be concealed
- d. 13 duplex receptacles
- e. 1 single receptacle
- f. 1 water proof receptacle

- a. 7 - 2 lamp 48" florescent fixture complete with wrap around diffuser and 35k lamp inside trailer
- b. 1 – Exterior Light, Vapour proof 60W incandescent fixture c/w 100W bulb

The mobile trailer is to have a (1) yr manufacture warranty against leaks, defects in workmanship, structural, mechanical and electrical defects.
