1.2 Summary

- (v) The requirement is subject to the provisions of the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT).

1.3 Debriefings

Offerors may request a debriefing on the results of the request for standing offers process. Offerors should make the request to the Standing Offer Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the request for standing offers process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

2.2 Submission of Offers

Offers must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the Request for Standing Offers.

2.3 Enquiries - Request for Standing Offers

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Standing Offer Authority no later than seven (7) calendar days before the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Offerors should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the RFSO to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by offerors to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that offerors do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all offerors. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all offerors may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

The Standing Offer and any contract resulting from the Standing Offer must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Offerors may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their offer, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the offerors.

Any offer which fails to meet the following mandatory requirements will be deemed non-responsive and will receive no further consideration.

The Evaluated Price on an aggregate basis is the sum of the Extended price.

The Extended price is the Estimated Quantity multiplied by the Firm Unit Price.

4.1.2.3 Pack of Unit Size

If a requested size is no longer available, it is up to the offeror to contact the Standing Offer Authority no later than seven (7) calendar days prior to the closing date with a proposed alternative size.

Where changes to pack or unit size are proposed the following must be met:

- a. The proposed change is necessary because the original pack size specified is unavailable in the industry; and

Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Standing Offer Authority may render the Offer non-responsive, may result in the setting aside of the Standing Offer or constitute a default under the Contract.

1. Back Orders: No back orders will be accepted unless arranged in advance with the Project Authority.

2. Final Inspection & Product Acceptance / Rejection: Inspection and acceptance will rest with the Project Authority or the authorized designate specified in the call-up document. All products supplied shall be free of signs of deterioration, spoilage, filth or damage by rodents or insects.

The Project Authority or authorized designate will have the right to reject product at the time of delivery and any unacceptable product(s) will be removed immediately by the Contractor. Rejected items discovered after delivery must be picked-up within 1 working day of notification of the rejection.

Rejected product(s) must be replaced within 1 working day of notification.

3. Preparation for Delivery: Each container shall be packed in such a manner that the faced shown surface of all boxes/cartons must be clearly marked to show the grade, size, net weight and/or quantity, storage instructions and/or special instructions of the product contained in the package. All boxes/cartons must be clearly labeled with the Contractor's name and address.

The Contractor must supply delivery slips for each delivery.
