ADVANCE CONTRACT AWARD NOTICE (ACAN)

1. Definition

An Advance Contract Award Notice (ACAN) allows departments and agencies to post a notice, for no less than fifteen (15) calendar days, indicating to the supplier community that it intends to award a good, service or construction contract to a pre-identified contractor. If no other supplier submits, on or before the closing date, a Statement of Capabilities that meets the requirements set out in the ACAN, the competitive requirements of the government's contracting policy have been met. Following notification to suppliers not successful in demonstrating that their Statement of Capabilities meets the requirements set out in the ACAN, the contract may then be awarded using the Treasury Board's electronic bidding authorities.

If other potential suppliers submit Statement of Capabilities during the fifteen calendar day posting period, and meet the requirements set out in the ACAN, the department or agency must proceed to a full tendering process on either the government's electronic tendering service or through traditional means, in order to award the contract.

2. Definition of Requirements

As part of the GEM2 Hudson-Ungava Project, Core Zone Surficial mapping activity, a regional surficial mapping and surficial sampling program is being undertaken east of Schefferville, Quebec, in a region with highly prospective geology, yet hampered by a complex sequence of glacial sediments. Sampling and field observations are being targeted in regions where no previous maps or sampling exists, and logistical support is required to operate in remote parts of Quebec and Labrador. The work described herein, is in part, restricted to the 2015 GEM2 field season being conducted in the region.

The contractor is to provide logistic support for various aspects of fieldwork, which could include variances to account for poor weather. Logistic support will be broken down and defined by individual tasks in the following section, and includes specific tasks related to remote sites and support within the town of Schefferville.

Complete logistical management of requirement, including provision of room/board for crew near Schefferville, Quebec (roughly 55 degrees north latitude and about 50 km to the west of 65 degrees west longitude) NTS 23I and 23P

Logistical and lodging services must include:

- 1. Shipping of 3 pallets of material (Includes pallet, wrapping, preparation for shipping and tracking to destination)
 - A) Ground Shipping required, with closed trailer and no tailgate. (1000lbs) from Ottawa to Shefferville
 - B) Railroad shipping from Sept-Îles to Shefferville
- 2. Shipping of 7 pallets of samples/material (Includes pallet, wrapping, preparation for shipping and tracking to destination)
 - A) Ground shipping required with closed trailer and no tailgate. (15,000lbs) from Shefferville to Ottawa
 - B) Railroad shipping from Shefferville to Sept-Îles
- 3. Purchasing and shipping of 20 new & Sealed Jet-A Drums (2 years before re-test)
 - A) Drum fuel ordered and shipped by rail, from Sept Isles to Schefferville, so that fuel can be cached before our helicopter arrives on the 16th

- 4. Air transportation of drums into different locations (fuel cache permits required) and pickup of empty drums
 - A) Must be provided with a float plane or aircraft with floats for caching fuel
- 5. Elimination/crushing of 20 empty drums
 - A) Complete process includes individual inspection of drums for contamination, emptying drums, drying and crushing drums.
- 6. Provide Room and Board for crew (5-8 people)
 - A) Must have 6 separate rooms and 2 bathrooms (dual occupation possible for when 8 people are present)
 - B) Crew must be provided with 3 meals daily (breakfast/field lunch/supper)
 - C) Must have access to internet
 - D) Fork loader required at camp for handling of samples (when each pallet is ready to prepped for shipping)
 - E) Must have Helicopter parking available
- 7. Provide a working area, which must have electricity

3. Trade Agreements/Comprehensive Land Claims Agreements

Inuit Portion of JBNQA Labrador Inuit Land Claims Agreement

4. Title to Intellectual property

There will be no resulting Intellectual property from this requirement

5. Contract Period

The approximate period of the contract will be from July 13, 2015 to August 14th, 2015.

6. Estimated Cost

The estimated maximum value of the contract will not exceed \$63,000.00 (HST included).

7. Exception to the Government Contracts Regulations and applicable trade agreements

Sole Source Justification - Exception of the Government Contract Regulations (GCR) based on the following:

(d) only one person is capable of performing the contract

Norpaq is the sole supplier who can provide all of the services listed in #2 for the remote region NRCan is working in. As each service depends on the delivery of the previous service, it is imperative that NRCan receive the complete requirement outlined in #2 from one provider. If there is a delay in delivery of one service, it jeopardizes the entire project.

Norpaq holds the Fuel cache permits required from the provincial government (Quebec) for fuel caching.
