Question 3: We have noticed the presence of a representative from DGH Engineering at the site visit. Our understanding is that they have the intention to submit a proposal in answer to your RFP. Looking at Bio-Terre website, we have noticed that they are in partnership with DGH Engineering. Do you see a conflict of interest in this situation?

Answer 3: Departments must ensure that adequate management controls are in place to protect the integrity of the bidding process. In the event that DGH Engineering would be in conflict of interest in the delivery of the required services, AAFC would not be able to accept their proposal.
