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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Security Requirements

1.2 Requirement - Bid

The requirement is detailed under Article 2 of the resulting contract clauses.

1.3 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

1.4 Trade Agreements

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the [Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual](https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The [2003](#) (2015-07-03) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

"Subsection 3 of Section 01 Integrity Provisions - Bid of the Standard Instructions [2003](#) incorporated by reference above is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

3. List of Names

- a. Bidders who are incorporated or who are a sole proprietorship, including those bidding as a joint venture, have already provided a list of names of all individuals who are directors of the Bidder, or the name of the owner(s), at the time of submitting an arrangement under the Request for Supply Arrangement (RFSA).
- b. These Bidders must immediately inform Canada in writing of any changes affecting the list of directors during this procurement process.

2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

Due to the nature of the bid solicitation, bids transmitted by facsimile to PWGSC will not be accepted.

2.2.1 Improvement of Requirement During Solicitation Period

Should bidders consider that the specifications or Statement of Work contained in the bid solicitation could be improved technically or technologically, bidders are invited to make suggestions, in writing, to the Contracting Authority named in the bid solicitation. Bidders must clearly outline the suggested improvement as well as the reason for the suggestion. Suggestions that do not restrict the level of competition nor favour a particular bidder will be given consideration provided they are submitted to the Contracting Authority at least 20 days before the bid closing date. Canada will have the right to accept or reject any or all suggestions.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 14 calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in British Columbia.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

PART 3 - BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Bid Preparation Instructions

Canada requests that Bidders provide their bid in separately bound sections as follows:

Section I: Technical Bid (2 hard copies and 1 soft copies)

Section II: Financial Bid (1 hard copy)

Section III: Certifications (1 hard copy)

If there is a discrepancy between the wording of the soft copy and the hard copy, the wording of the hard copy will have priority over the wording of the soft copy.

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

Canada requests that Bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their bid:

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

In April 2006, Canada issued a policy directing federal departments and agencies to take the necessary steps to incorporate environmental considerations into the procurement process [Policy on Green Procurement](http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html) (<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html>). To assist Canada in reaching its objectives, Bidders should:

- 1) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper containing fibre certified as originating from a sustainably-managed forest and containing minimum 30% recycled content; and
- 2) use an environmentally-preferable format including black and white printing instead of colour printing, printing double sided/duplex, using staples or clips instead of cerlox, duotangs or binders.

Section I: Technical Bid

In their technical bid, Bidders should explain and demonstrate how they propose to meet the requirements and how they will carry out the Work.

The technical bid consists of the following:

- i. **Bid Submission Form:** Bidders are requested to include the Bid Submission Form with their bids. It provides a common form in which bidders can provide information required for evaluation and contract award, such as a contact name, the Bidder's Procurement Business Number, the Bidder's status under the Federal Contractors Program for Employment Equity, etc. Using the form to provide this information is not mandatory, but it is recommended. If Canada determines that the information required by the Bid Submission Form is incomplete or requires correction, Canada will provide the Bidder with an opportunity to do so.
- ii. **Substantiation of Technical Compliance:** The technical bid must substantiate the compliance of the Bidder and its proposed solution with the specific articles of Annex A (Requirement) identified in the Substantiation of Technical Compliance Form, which is the requested format for providing the substantiation. The Substantiation of Technical Compliance Form is not required to address any parts of this bid solicitation not referenced in the form. The substantiation must not simply be a repetition of the requirement(s), but must explain and demonstrate how the Bidder will meet the requirements and carry out the required Work. Simply stating that the Bidder or its proposed solution or product complies is not sufficient.

Bidders:

- a Must designate the brand name, model and/or part number of the proposed product; and
- b Must provide complete specifications and descriptive literature to substantiate that the proposed product's meets the mandatory requirements that are specified in the bid solicitation (Form B)

Where Canada determines that the substantiation is not complete, the Bidder will be declared non-responsive and disqualified. The substantiation may refer to additional documentation submitted with the bid - this information can be referenced in the "Reference" column of the Substantiation of Technical Compliance Form, where bidders are requested to indicate where in the bid the reference material can be found, including the title of the document, and the page and paragraph numbers; where the reference is not sufficiently precise, Canada may request that the Bidder direct Canada to the appropriate location in the documentation.

In conducting its evaluation of the bids, Canada may, but will have no obligation to, request bidders to demonstrate, at the sole cost of bidders, that the proposed product meets all mandatory criteria that are specified in the bid solicitation.

Section II: Financial Bid

Bidders must submit their financial bid in accordance with the Basis of Payment. The total amount of Applicable Taxes must be shown separately.

PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

4.1.1 Technical Evaluation

All bids must be completed in full and provide all of the information requested in the bid solicitation to enable full and complete evaluation.

4.1.1.1 Mandatory Technical Criteria

Each bid will be reviewed to determine whether it meets the mandatory requirements of the bid solicitation. Any element of the bid solicitation identified with the words “must” or “mandatory” is a mandatory requirement. Bids that do not comply with each and every mandatory requirement will be declared non-responsive and be disqualified.

The mandatory technical requirements are described in Annex A.

4.1.2 Financial Evaluation

4.1.2.1 Evaluation of Price – Canadian/Foreign Bidders.

1. The price of the bid will be evaluated as follows:
 - a. Canadian-based bidders must submit firm prices, Canadian customs duties and excise taxes included, and Applicable Taxes excluded.
 - b. foreign-based bidders must submit firm prices, Canadian customs duties, excise taxes and Applicable Taxes excluded. Canadian customs duties and excise taxes payable by Canada will be added, for evaluation purposes only, to the prices submitted by foreign-based bidders.
2. Unless the bid solicitation specifically requires bids to be submitted in Canadian currency, bids submitted in foreign currency will be converted to Canadian currency for evaluation purposes. The rate given by the Bank of Canada in effect on the bid solicitation closing date,

or on another date specified in the bid solicitation, will be applied as a conversion factor to the bids submitted in foreign currency.

3. Although Canada reserves the right to award the Contract either on an FOB plant or FOB destination, Canada requests that bidders provide prices FOB their plant or shipping point and FOB destination. **Bids will be assessed on an FOB destination basis.**
4. For the purpose of the bid solicitation, bidders with an address in Canada are considered Canadian-based bidders and bidders with an address outside of Canada are considered foreign-based bidders

Bidders must provide the required certifications and additional information to be awarded a contract.

Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority will render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

5.1 Certifications Required with the Bid

Bidders must submit the following duly completed certifications as part of their bid.

If any of these required certifications or additional information is not completed and submitted as requested, the Contracting Authority will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to provide the certifications or the additional information listed below within the time frame provided will render the bid non-responsive.

Bidders who are incorporated, including those bidding as a joint venture, must provide a complete list of names of all individuals who are currently directors of the Bidder.

Bidders bidding as sole proprietorship, as well as those bidding as a joint venture, must provide the name of the owner(s).

Bidders bidding as societies, firms or partnerships do not need to provide lists of names.

5.2.2 Federal Contractors Program for Employment Equity - Bid Certification

ANNEX "A" REQUIREMENT

A.1 Requirements:

The Contractor must supply and deliver One(1) _____ (Make and Model #) Analyzer that will simultaneously measure CO, CO₂ and H₂O with low detection limits, high precision and time resolution.

A.2 Background:

Environment Canada requires a fast response instrument for use in process studies related to Air Quality. These studies may include near roadside measurements or aircraft measurements of CO and CO₂ where measurement times of 1 second or faster are required. The instrument may be used in remote locations and therefore should be able to operate without maintenance for periods of \geq 1 month. In addition the instrument may be housed in stations which experience temperature changes of up to 10 C and must not have large drifts. The measurement of H₂O in most cases will be utilized in order to correct to dry air from ambient air containing water.

A.3 Mandatory Specifications

The Analyzer must meet or exceed the following specifications:

- 1) Simultaneous Measurements of CO, CO₂ and H₂O with high precision and time resolution.
 - a. The CO monitor requires a reproducibility of ≤ 1 ppb at 1 standard deviation for CO measurements at ambient concentration as measured in 1 second.
 - b. The CO₂ monitor requires a reproducibility of ≤ 1 ppm at 1 standard deviation for CO₂ measurements at ambient concentration as measured in 1 second.
 - c. The H₂O monitor requires a reproducibility of ≤ 5 ppm at 1 standard deviation for CO measurements at ambient concentration as measured in 1 second.
- 2) Low Detection Limit for CO
 - a. Detection Limit of 10 ppb for CO in 1 min
- 3) During continuous operation on all channels, the instrument must have low drift over a 24 hour period
 - a. Maximum Drift of CO in 24 hours at of ≤ 1 ppb
 - b. Maximum Drift of CO₂ in 24 hours at of ≤ 1 ppm
 - c. Maximum Drift of H₂O in 24 hours at of ≤ 50 ppm
- 4) Can measure with 10 second time resolution but be easily modified to produce 1 second or better time resolutions (Only requires the simple change of a pump)
- 5) Since measurements can be from pristine air to highly polluted urban air, the measurement range for a 10 sec average requires a large measurement range
 - a. For CO a range of 50 to 20,000 ppb
 - b. For CO₂ a range of 50 to 5000 ppm
 - c. For H₂O a range of 100 ppm to 100% RH (non-condensing)
- 6) Must fit within a standard 19" rack
- 7) Must Interface using RS232, USB or LAN connections
- 8) The instrument must be able to be plugged into a North American standard power outlet at 115V AC at 60Hz. Power requirements must be 115V AC at 60Hz
- 9) The instrument must run unattended for periods of \geq 1 month.
- 10) Does not require water cooling

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- 11) Does not require cryogenic cooling
- 12) The instrument must have a proven record of performance –
 - a. The instrument must have been used in scientific studies and has been cited in scientific literature and
 - b. The vendor must provide contact information for 2 references who have used this product for similar applications. cited in scientific literature

A.4 Software requirement:

- 1) Must include a perpetual software licence for any applicable software required for instrument operation.

A.5 Warranty and Servicing

- 1) The analyzer must have a minimum 1 year depot warranty
