INSURANCE TERMS

The Insurance Terms have been amended. Refer to the Supplementary Conditions.

REMINDER

Changes to PST, GST, HST in British Columbia, Quebec, and Prince Edward Island

Bidders are reminded that there were changes to the Provincial Sales Tax (PST), Goods and Services Tax (GST), and Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) in the provinces of British Columbia (BC), Quebec (QC), and Prince Edward Island (PE). These were effective April 1, 2013.

"Applicable Taxes" are paid by Canada in accordance with the General Conditions. It is the bidder's responsibility to ensure their submission accounts for these changes. There will be no adjustment for any change to increase the Contract Amount due to these changes.

The Bidder is not entitled to use Canada's exemptions from any tax, such as provincial sales taxes. The Bidder must pay applicable provincial sales tax, ancillary taxes, and any commodity tax, on taxable goods or services used or consumed in the performance of the Contract (in accordance with applicable legislation), including for material incorporated into real property.

BID SECURITY REQUIREMENTS

Enquiries received after that time may not result in an answer being provided.
- 2) To ensure consistency and quality of the information provided to Bidders, the Contracting Officer shall examine the content of the enquiry and shall decide whether or not to issue an amendment.
- 3) All enquiries and other communications related to this bid sent throughout the solicitation period are to be directed ONLY to the Contracting Officer named on the Invitation to Tender - Page 1. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in the bid being declared non-responsive.

SI04 MANDATORY SITE VISIT

It is mandatory that the Bidder or a representative of the Bidder visit the work site. Arrangements have been made for the site visit to be held at 2141, chemin St-Paul, St-Mathieu-du-Parc, QC G0X 1N0 on September 30, 2015. The site visit will begin at 10:00 a.m. (EDT).

Bidders must communicate with the Contracting Authority no later than September 28, 2015 to confirm attendance and provide the name(s) of the person(s) who will attend. Bidders will be required to sign an attendance sheet. Bidders should confirm in their bid that they have attended the site visit. Bidders who do not attend the mandatory site visit or do not send a representative will not be given an alternative

appointment and their bid will be declared non-responsive. Any clarifications or changes to the bid solicitation resulting from the site visit will be included as an amendment to the bid solicitation

SI05 REVISION OF BID

SI07 INSUFFICIENT FUNDING

- 1) In the event that the lowest compliant bid exceeds the amount of funding Canada has allocated for the construction phase of the work
 - (a) by 15% or less, Canada, at its sole discretion, shall either
 - (i) Cancel the solicitation; or
 - (ii) Obtain additional funding and, subject to the provisions of GI11 of the General Instructions to Bidders, award the Contract to the Bidder submitting the lowest compliant bid; or
 - (iii) Revise the scope of the work accordingly and negotiate, with the Bidder submitting the lowest compliant bid, a corresponding reduction in its bid price.
 - (b) by more than 15%, Canada, at its sole discretion, shall either
 - (i) Cancel the solicitation; or
 - (ii) Obtain additional funding and, subject to the provisions of GI11 of the General Instructions to Bidders, award the Contract to the Bidder submitting the lowest compliant bid; or
 - (iii) Revise the scope of the work accordingly and invite those who submitted compliant bids at the original solicitation to re-bid the work.
- 2) If negotiations or a re-bid are undertaken as is contemplated in subparagraphs 1)(a)(iii) or 1)(b)(iii) above, Bidders shall retain the same subcontractors and suppliers as they carried in their original bids.
- 3) If Canada elects to negotiate a reduction in the bid price as is contemplated in subparagraph 1)(a)(iii) herein and the negotiations fail to reach an agreement, Canada shall then exercise either of the options referred to subparagraphs 1)(a)(i) or 1)(a)(ii)

SI08 BID VALIDITY PERIOD

- 1) Canada reserves the right to seek an extension to the bid validity period prescribed in BA04 of the Bid and Acceptance Form. Upon notification in writing from Canada, Bidders shall have the option to either accept or reject the proposed extension.

SC03 INSURANCE TERMS**1) Insurance Contracts**

(a) The Contractor must, at the Contractor's expense, obtain and maintain insurance contracts in accordance with the requirements of the Certificate of Insurance. Coverage must be placed with an Insurer licensed to carry out business in Canada.

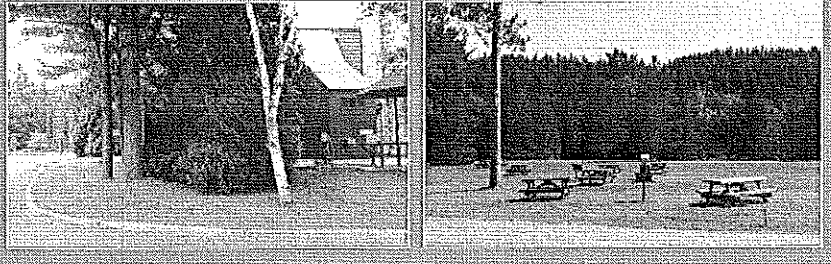

PREAMBLE

This document presents the price description and payment method that accompany the price schedule for the “Replacement of 20 wastewater treatment systems – Phase 1” project.

0.0 GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR THE CONTRACTOR

0.1 GENERAL MOBILIZATION AND CONSTRUCTION FACILITIES

For all price schedule items

The costs of general mobilization of equipment, trailers, machinery, tools, personnel, materials and temporary facilities, as well as any additional mobilization potentially required to meet the work schedule are included in the different corresponding fixed prices in the price schedule.

Total demobilization of personnel, equipment, trailers, machinery and temporary facilities, unused building materials, demolition materials left on site, scrap materials and construction facilities, including cleaning and restoration at the end of the work, are also included in the different corresponding fixed prices identified in the price schedule.

This price also includes construction facilities, including, but not limited to:

- Site drainage;
- Field and personnel offices;
- Equipment storage facilities;
- Outdoor storage for material and equipment;
- Temporary site signs;
- Costs of transporting, installing and operating vehicles and engines;
- Topographic surveys;
- Supplying all documents required for the work (see Section 01 33 23 of the construction specifications including shop drawings, as-built plans, operating and manufacturer’s manuals);
- Supplying the work schedule (see Section 01 32 16.07 of the construction specifications);
- On-site health and safety of personnel and equipment, in accordance with the requirements of Section 01 35 29.06 of the construction specifications and applicable laws;
- The protection of the environment, in accordance with Section 01 35 43 of the construction specifications and applicable laws;

- Management and disposal of construction/demolition waste (see Section 01 74 21);
- The transportation of personnel;
- The collection of waste;
- All loading and unloading work;
- Costs of coordinating subcontractors and suppliers;
- Site meetings;
- Performance testing and commissioning;
- Total demobilization of personnel, temporary facility equipment, unused building materials, demolition materials left on site, waste and construction facilities, including cleaning and restoration;
- The dismantling of facilities, removal, cleaning, restoration of the original thickness of topsoil, restoration of the site and disposal of rubble and excess materials at the QPA's request;
- Final cleaning of work completed and all the constraints;
- Any other related costs for the completion.

This amount is spread across the costs of the work and equipment in the schedule.

1.0 SEPTIC TANKS TO DISPOSE OF

This price provides a lump-sum payment for all required measures, actions and supplies, including, but not limited to, management, labour, equipment, materials, permits, professional services, required fees or licences, and construction engineering, that are necessary for pumping and disposal of waste water (liquid and solid), excavation, filling and disposal in an approved site. The price also includes excavation, filling and all expenses related to pipes and accessories to dismantle or decommission.

2.0 SEPTIC TANK

This price provides a lump-sum payment for all required measures, actions and supplies, including, but not limited to, management, labour, equipment, materials, permits, professional services, required fees or licences, and construction engineering, that are necessary for excavation and backfilling, supplying with all accessories, the installation, the cushion and encasement of the tank, the chimneys and lids, seal testing, commissioning and all related work.

3.0 SEPTIC TANK AND ADVANCED SECONDARY TREATMENT (AND UV)

This price provides a lump-sum payment for all required measures, actions and supplies, including, but not limited to, management, labour, equipment, materials, permits, professional services, required fees or licences, and construction engineering, that are necessary for excavation and backfilling, supplying with all accessories and required equipments, the installation, the cushion and encasement of tanks, the chimneys and lids, the ventilation pipes between blowers and the processing system, seal testing, commissioning and all related work.

4.0 TRENCH EXCAVATION AND FILLING

This price provides a linear meter payment for all required measures, actions and supplies, including, but not limited to, management, labour, equipment, materials, permits, professional services, required fees or licences, and construction engineering, that are necessary for excavation including rock, removal of existing lines, retaining if required, the supporting of poles and all structures threatened by the excavation. The backfilling includes placing cushions, embedding pipes with borrowed materials and filling the trench with excavated or borrowed materials approved by the Engineer up to the level of infrastructure. The price also includes subjected handling of excavated materials including piling if required, loading and transport to use for backfilling trenches and/or for disposal. In case of disposal, the price also includes leveling of the materials to the satisfaction of the Owner of the land concerned.

5.0 GRAVITY PIPE

This price provides a linear meter payment for all required measures, actions and supplies, including, but not limited to, management, labour, equipment, materials, permits, professional services, required fees or licences, and construction engineering, that are necessary for the purchase and installation of pipes, all required accessories and connectors, as well as connections to existing ones.

6.0 UTILITY DRAINAGE FIELD

This price provides a lump-sum payment for all required measures, actions and supplies, including, but not limited to, management, labour, equipment, materials, permits, professional services, required fees or licences, and construction engineering, that are necessary for excavation including rock, removal of existing pipes, installation of new pipes, additional excavation under the existing field, retaining if required, the support of poles and all structures threatened by the excavation. The filling includes placing granular materials, recovery of the materials of the existing field and filling the excavation with excavated or borrowed materials approved by the Engineer up to the level of infrastructure. The price also includes subjected handling of excavated materials including piling if required, loading and transport to use for backfilling excavation and/or for disposal.

7.0 TERRAIN AND GRAVEL PATH REPAIR

This price provides a lump-sum payment for all required measures, actions and supplies, including, but not limited to, management, labour, equipment, materials, permits, professional services, required fees or licences, and construction engineering, that are necessary for repairing all damaged surfaces work including gravel, grass surface (topsoil and coco fiber mats) and others, leveling of surfaces, supply and installation of granular material, retrieving and replacing topsoil.

8.0 PAVED PARKING AND CONCRETE BORDERS REPAIR

This price provides a lump-sum payment for all required measures, actions and supplies, including, but not limited to, management, labour, equipment, materials, permits, professional services, required fees or licences, and construction engineering, that are necessary for the repair of all paved surfaces damaged by the work including granular base (150 mm MG-20), concrete borders poured in place, leveling of surfaces and all related work.

9.0 ELECTRICAL CONNECTION

This price provides a lump-sum payment for all required measures, actions and supplies, including, but not limited to, management, labour, equipment, materials, permits, professional services, required fees or licences, and construction engineering, that are necessary for supply, installation and connection of electrical systems, all accessories required for a complete installation and perfect operation.

10.0 DEFORESTATION AND GRUBBING

This price provides a lump-sum payment for all required measures, actions and supplies, including, but not limited to, management, labour, equipment, materials, permits, professional services, and required fees or licences, that are necessary for the deforestation, the grubbing, cleaning the grounds, the evacuation of debris from the site and the recovery of topsoil.

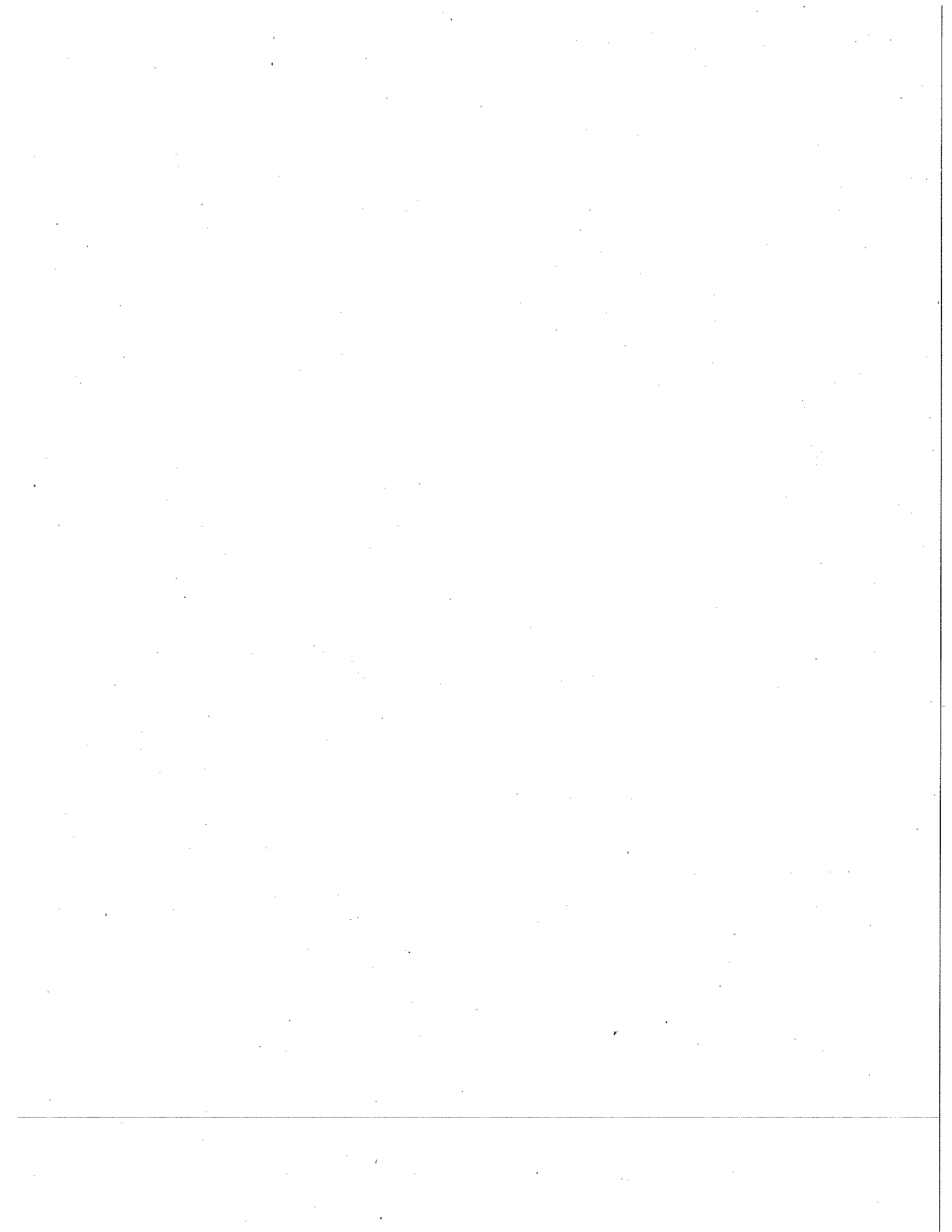
