## **PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION**

### **1.1 Introduction**

The Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) is divided into seven parts plus attachments and annexes, as follows:

- Part 1 General Information: provides a general description of the requirement;
- Part 2 Offeror Instructions: provides the instructions applicable to the clauses and conditions of the RFSO;
- Part 3 Offer Preparation Instructions: provides offerors with instructions on how to prepare their offer to address the evaluation criteria specified;
- Part 4 Evaluation Procedures and Basis of Selection: indicates how the evaluation will be conducted, the evaluation criteria which must be addressed in the offer, and the basis of selection;
- Part 5 Certifications: includes the certifications to be provided;
- Part 6 6A, Standing Offer, and 7B, Resulting Contract Clauses:
  - 6A, includes the Standing Offer containing the offer from the Offeror and the applicable clauses and conditions;
  - 6B, includes the clauses and conditions which will apply to any contract resulting from a call-up made pursuant to the Standing Offer.

### **1.2 Summary**

1.2.1 To establish a Regional Individual Standing Offer for the provision of Miscellaneous Groceries and Cheese items on an "as and when requested" basis for the Department of National Defence at CFS Alert and Canadian Forces Base (CFB) Trenton. All items shall conform to the relevant CGSB Standard, as applicable.

1.2.2 For items to be delivered to CFS Alert: Delivery of these items is to be made to the CFB Trenton, Trenton, Ontario, for furtherance by DND to CFS Alert.

1.2.3 The requirement is subject to the provisions of the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT).

1.2.4 The period for placing call-ups against the Standing Offer shall be from December 17, 2015 to May 17, 2016.

1.2.5 This procurement is reserved for beneficiaries of the following Comprehensive Land Claims Agreement(s) (CLCAs): Nunavut Land Claims Agreement.

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### **1.3 Debriefings**

Offerors may request a debriefing on the results of the request for standing offers process. Offerors should make the request to the Standing Offer Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the request for standing offers process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

## PART 2 - OFFEROR INSTRUCTIONS

### 2.2 Submission of Offers

Offers must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the Request for Standing Offers.

### 2.3 Enquiries - Request for Standing Offers

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Standing Offer Authority no later than seven (7) calendar days before the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Offerors should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the RFSO to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by offerors to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that offerors do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all offerors. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all offerors may not be answered by Canada.

### 2.4 Applicable Laws

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The Standing Offer and any contract resulting from the Standing Offer must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Offerors may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their offer, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. Canada requests that offerors follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their offer.

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to that of the Request for Standing Offers.

## **PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION**

### **4.1 Evaluation Procedures**

- (a) Offers will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the Request for Standing Offers including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the offers.

#### **4.1.1 Financial Evaluation**

##### **4.1.1.1 Mandatory Financial Criteria**

The Offeror must complete and submit with its offer, Annex B - Basis of Payment (Excel File). Pricing must be provided for **all** line items as listed and a % amount for Annex B-1 CFB Trenton & CFS Alert. Where the Offeror proposes an alternate UOIS (Unit of Issue Size), the Offeror must enter an amount for both PACK **AND** SIZE

For Annex B – where an item is described as "No Substitute", only that brand name with associated pack and unit size will be acceptable.

Offers will be evaluated based on the prices detailed in Annex B - Basis of Payment (Excel File), Incoterms 2000 "DDP Delivered Duty Paid".

The price used in the evaluation will be the Total Evaluated Price which is calculated as follows:

The Unit of Issue Size (UOIS) is the PACK multiplied by the SIZE.

The Total Evaluated Price is the sum of the Extended prices.

1. When no change is proposed to the Preferred (UOIS), the Extended price is the Estimated 6 Month Usage multiplied by the Unit Price.
2. When a change is proposed to the Preferred UOIS, the Extended price is the Unit Price divided by the Proposed UOIS multiplied by the Preferred UOIS multiplied by the Estimated 6 Month Usage.

##### **4.1.1.3 Unit of Issue Size**

Where changes to the Preferred UOIS are proposed the following must be met:

- a. The Proposed UOIS reflects the next size up or down (from the Preferred UOIS specified) that is available in the industry; and/or
- b. There is a less than 15% difference between the Preferred UOIS specified and the Proposed UOIS.

### **4.2 Basis of Selection**

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- 4.2.1** An offer must comply with the requirements of the Request for Standing Offer to be declared responsive. The responsive offer with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for issuance of a standing offer.

## **PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS**

Offerors must provide the required certifications and associated information to be issued a standing offer.

The certifications provided by offerors to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Canada will declare an offer non-responsive, will have the right to set-aside a standing offer, or will declare a contractor in default in carrying out any of its obligations under any resulting contracts, if any certification made by the Offeror is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly during the offer evaluation period, during the Standing Offer period, or during the contract period.

The Standing Offer Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Offeror's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Standing Offer Authority may render the Offer non-responsive, may result in the setting aside of the Standing Offer or constitute a default under the Contract.

### **5.1 Certifications Precedent to Issuance of a Standing Offer**

**REQUIREMENT**

1. No minimum call-ups apply to this Regional Individual Standing Offer.
2. All products supplied must be in accordance with the latest issue of the relevant Canadian General Standards and all relevant Acts and Regulations.
3. **Electronic Price Lists** - The Supplier shall provide electronic copies (in the form of a CDs or Excel spreadsheet sent by e-mail) of the products, the products individual item codes, and price lists to the Project Authority.
4. **Item Sizes** - The Supplier must supply items in the size identified in Annex "B" – Basis of payment. No deviation from that size will be acceptable unless the stated size is no longer available to the industry. The Supplier must notify the Project Authority and PWGSC to obtain their written acceptance of a replacement size.
5. **No Substitution** - Items provided under Annex B, Basis of payment MUST be the brand name specified.
6. **Brand Name** - All other items offered and supplied under Pricing Basis "B-1" CFB Trenton & CFS Alert must be a recognized brand name.
7. **Back Orders:** No back orders will be accepted unless arranged in advance with the Project Authority or authorized designate.
8. **Final Inspection & Product Acceptance / Rejection:** Inspection and acceptance will rest with the Project Authority or authorized designate at the delivery destination. All products supplied shall be free of signs of deterioration, spoilage, filth or damage by rodents or insects.

The Project Authority or authorized designate will have the right to reject product at the time of delivery and any unacceptable product(s) will be removed immediately by the Supplier. Rejected items discovered after delivery must be picked-up within 1 working day of notification of the rejection.

Rejected product(s) must be replaced within 1 working day of notification.
