REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL

ACCOMMODATIONS IN RENO, NEVADA, USA FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF NATIONAL DEFENSE (DND)

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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Statement of Work

The Department of National Defence (DND), Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) will be conducting vehicle testing at Nevada Automotive Test Center, and therefore has a requirement for hotel accommodations from approximately **04 Jan 2016 to 30 April 2016** in Reno, Nevada USA to support test and evaluation activities.

The Contractor will provide accommodation services to DND personnel for the estimated period starting **04 Jan 2016 to 30 April 2016**, for 30 personnel in single occupancy for a total of 3,510 room nights.

Accommodations provided must be located within sixty (60) driving miles (96.5 km) of the Nevada Automotive Test Center which is located at Nevada Automotive Test Center, 605 Fort Churchill Rd, Silver Springs, NV 89429. Distances will be measured using Google Maps.

Statement of Work is detailed at Annex A.

1.2 Debriefings

After contract award, bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

1.3 Trade Agreements

The requirement is subject to the provisions of the World Trade Organization Agreement on Government Procurement (WTO-AGP), the Canada-Chile Free Trade Agreement (CCFTA), and the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT).

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The 2003 (2015-07-03) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

2.3 Former Public Servant

Contracts awarded to former public servants (FPS) in receipt of a pension or of a lump sum payment must bear the closest public scrutiny, and reflect fairness in the spending of public funds. In order to comply with Treasury Board policies and directives on contracts awarded to FPSs, bidders must provide

the information required below before contract award. If the answer to the questions and, as applicable the information required have not been received by the time the evaluation of bids is completed, Canada will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to comply with Canada's request and meet the requirement within the prescribed time frame will render the bid non-responsive.

Definitions

For the purposes of this clause, "former public servant" is any former member of a department as defined in the *Financial Administration Act*, R.S., 1985, c. F-11, a former member of the Canadian Armed Forces or a former member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. A former public servant may be:

- a. an individual;
- b. an individual who has incorporated;
- c. a partnership made of former public servants; or
- d. a sole proprietorship or entity where the affected individual has a controlling or major interest in the entity.

"lump sum payment period" means the period measured in weeks of salary, for which payment has been made to facilitate the transition to retirement or to other employment as a result of the implementation of various programs to reduce the size of the Public Service. The lump sum payment period does not include the period of severance pay, which is measured in a like manner. "pension" means a pension or annual allowance paid under the *Public Service Superannuation Act* (PSSA), R.S., 1985, c. P-36, and any increases paid pursuant to the *Supplementary Retirement Benefits Act*, R.S., 1985, c. S-24 as it affects the PSSA. It does not include pensions payable pursuant to the *Canadian Forces Superannuation Act*, R.S., 1985, c. C-17, the *Defence Services Pension Continuation Act*, 1970, c. D-3, the *Royal Canadian Mounted Police Pension Continuation Act*, 1970, c. R-10, and the *Royal Canadian Mounted Police Superannuation Act*, R.S., 1985, c. R-11, the *Members of Parliament Retiring Allowances Act*, R.S. 1985, c. M-5, and that portion of pension payable to the *Canada Pension Plan Act*, R.S., 1985, c. C-8.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 3 business days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the questions or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered with copies to all bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the bidders.

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

Canada requests that bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their bid:

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

In April 2006, Canada issued a policy directing federal departments and agencies to take the necessary steps to incorporate environmental considerations into the procurement process (<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html>). To assist Canada in reaching its objectives, bidders should:

PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

4.1.1 Technical Evaluation

4.1.1.1 Mandatory Technical Criteria

Bidders are required to comply with all the mandatory criteria below to be considered responsive; a bid must meet all of the mandatory requirements of this bid solicitation. Bidders that submit proposals that are determined to be non-responsive will receive no further consideration.

M.1 Accommodations provided must be located within sixty (60) driving miles (96.5 km) of the Nevada Automotive Test Center which is located at Nevada Automotive Test Center, 605 Fort Churchill Rd, Silver Springs, NV 89429. Distances will be measured using Google Maps.

M.2 Accommodations must include all services required at Annex A – Statement of Work.

4.2 Basis of Selection

A bid must comply with all requirements of the bid solicitation to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for award of a contract.

Financial evaluation will be based on total of room costs + total parking costs + daily rate for conference room .

PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Bidders must provide the required certifications and additional information to be awarded a contract.

The certifications provided by Bidders to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority will render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

5.1 Certifications Required with the Bid

Bidders must submit the following duly completed certifications as part of their bid.

5.2 Certifications Precedent to Contract Award and Additional Information

The certifications and additional information listed below should be submitted with the bid, but may be submitted afterwards. If any of these required certifications or additional information is not completed and submitted as requested, the Contracting Authority will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to provide the certifications or the additional information listed below within the time frame provided will render the bid non-responsive.

5.2.1 - Integrity Provisions List of Names

Bidders who are incorporated, including those bidding as a joint venture, must provide a complete list of names of all individuals who are currently directors of the Bidder.

Bidders bidding as sole proprietorship, as well as those bidding as a joint venture, must provide the name of the owner(s).

Bidders bidding as societies, firms or partnerships do not need to provide lists of names to provide the related documentation or to comply with the request of the Contracting Authority for additional information will also render the bid non-responsive.

5.2.2 Federal Contractors Program for Employment Equity - Bid Certification

1. Background

The Department of National Defence (DND), Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) will be conducting vehicle testing at Nevada Automotive Test Center, and therefore has a requirement for hotel accommodations from approximately **04 Jan 2016 to 30 April 2016** in Reno, Nevada USA to support test and evaluation activities.

2. General Requirements

2.1. Hotel Room Schedule and Deliverables

2.1.1. The Contractor will provide accommodation services to DND personnel for the estimated period starting **04 Jan 2016 to 30 April 2016**, for 30 personnel in single occupancy for a total of 3,510 room nights.

2.1.2. The contractor(s) will provide the following support configuration of the rooms over the below listed dates:

2.1.3. Personnel shall not be relocated to another room during their stay unless it becomes necessary as a result of a maintenance issue.

2.1.4. DND must have the ability to directly liaise with the hotel to modify the booking and room allocations.

2.1.5. Others members of the project will be required to visit Nevada to verify test results. Extra rooms at the same location may be needed to accommodate theses occasional members subject to availability at the same rate.

2.2. Location

Accommodations provided must be located within sixty (60) driving miles (96.5 km) of the Nevada Automotive Test Center which is located at Nevada Automotive Test Center, 605 Fort Churchill Rd, Silver Springs, NV 89429. . Distances will be measured using Google Maps.

2.2.1. Services such restaurants, and grocery stores must be available in a radius of walking distance (max 2000 feet (610 meters)).

2.3. Services and Amenities

The Contractor must provide DND personnel with the following services:

- 2.3.1. Fully furnished, single occupancy accommodations such as apartment/suite or hotel rooms;
- 2.3.2. Fully equipped kitchen/kitchenette (ie, pans/pots, dishes and utensils for each room);
- 2.3.3. Apartment/Suite or hotel room to accommodate at a minimum 30 person at the same location with full size refrigerators and separate freezer compartment, microwaves, coffee/Tea Maker and, either a stove or hotplate. If only a hotplate is available, an access to a large size BBQ is required 24 hours a day as personnel will be working on different shifts schedule 24 hours a day, 6 days a week.
- 2.3.4. 24 hour registration desk and switchboard service;
- 2.3.5. Daily housekeeping services: accommodations must be:
 - a. Cleaned including bathrooms;
 - b. Beds made up;
 - c. Fresh towels, soap and shampoo sufficient in each room provided;
- 2.3.6. Parking: Onsite parking must be available as follows for large size SUV;

- 2.3.7. Television with cable service in each room;
- 2.3.8. Local and Room to Room calling;
- 2.3.9. The hotel must be capable of providing access to an on-site laundry service;
- 2.4. High Speed Internet access (Ethernet based or wireless), it is preferable that Internet will be wireless and accessible throughout common areas, including guest rooms and conference rooms. Cost for Internet must be included in room rates;
- 2.4.1. Meeting room available that will be use once or twice a month to accommodate 30 people with tables and chairs including also a screen and projector;
- 2.4.2. Smoke free environment policy;
- 2.4.3. Early check-in and late check-out as required to accommodate flight changes. If not feasible, in lieu of early or late check out, a secured luggage storage area must be provided;
- 2.4.4. On-site fitness center available 24 hrs./day; and
- 2.4.5. Business services like copy/fax service.

3.1 Due to the nature of the test and evaluation activities, actual numbers of personnel may fluctuate. As well, the end date for the deployment is dependent on the ability for all personnel and equipment to leave at the end of test and evaluation activities. Therefore, Contractor shall be flexible to changes in dates and number of rooms required with a minimum of 48-hour notice once the period has commenced without incurring any penalties to DND.

4. Special Instructions

- 4.1. Each person will pay for his room phone charges or any drinks or food consumed during his stay at time of check out. DND will not be invoiced for personal calls made from the room or any food and drinks charges;
- 4.2. Each person will pay for laundry services. DND will not be invoiced for laundry services requested by anyone.

5. On-Site Point of Contact

Contractor must provide a local staff member as the primary point of contact for all matters relating to accommodation services. The individual must be available from 0800 hrs to 1800 hrs daily. For matters occurring outside these hours, a contact person and number must be provided if different than the designated individual.

6. Quality Assurance

The Contractor will ensure that all of the requirements outlined in this Statement of Work are met at all times. Discrepancies in the provision of services to the required standard shall be first dealt with by the liaison staff at the hotel and escalated to the Technical Authority and Contract Manager if the issue remains unsolved.
