If other potential suppliers submit a statement of capabilities during the 15 calendar day posting period that meet the requirements set out in the ACAN, the government will proceed to a full tendering process on either the government's electronic tendering service or through traditional means, in order to award the contract.

If no other supplier submits, on or before the closing date, a statement of capabilities meeting the requirements set out in the ACAN, a contract will be awarded to the pre-selected supplier, as referenced above.

BACKGROUND

CSIRO Publishing is an internationally recognized independent science and technology publisher. CSIRO Publishing publishes material covering a wide range of scientific disciplines, including agriculture, the plant and animal sciences and environmental management. CSIRO Publishing is a business unit within Australia's Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation. The Canadian Agriculture Library currently subscribes to 9 of their journals.

CAL has subscribed to journals from CSIRO Publishing, in print and/or online, since 1950. These journals are in high demand and are regularly used by AAFC researchers. Articles from these journals were accessed over 1,100 times during the previous calendar year. Licensing these e-journals supports AAFC's mandate by providing AAFC scientists improved access to information. These e-journals directly support research staff in Science and Technology Branch.

CURRENT REQUIREMENTS

CSIRO Publishing will license and deliver web access to the full-text content of the nine (9) subscribed electronic journals as stated in the statement of work below for the time period specified in the license agreement.

- Ensure that the server has adequate capacity and bandwidth to support the usage of the licensee at a level commensurate with the standards of availability for information services of similar scope operating via the World Wide Web.
- Use all reasonable endeavors to make the licensed material available to the licensee and authorized
 users at all times and on a twenty-four hour basis, save for scheduled routine maintenance, and to
 restore access to the licensed materials as soon as possible in the event of an interruption or
 suspension of the service.
- Provide adequate and competent technical support and assistance to enable the licensee to make proper use of the licensed material.
