This amendment is to respond to questions submitted in response to solicitation 5P420-15-5275/A:

A. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS:

Q17. Is the PCA providing a designated laydown area? If so please provide specifics on location, signs, available facilities (i.e. power), and possibility of landing and loading/ off-loading helicopters.

A17. Please refer to Amendment 003 and 004. No power is available.

Q18. Considering the work will be executed by experienced high scalers, is it a contract requirement to employ ACMG mountain guides and SPRAT/ IRATA certified trainers? And if yes, to what extent? Please note that the majority of high scaling contracts in the province do not require SPRAT, or IRATA certified trainers, or ACMG mountain guides.

A18. All work must be completed in accordance with Worksafe BC OH&S Regulations. Specifically, the following sections should be reviewed;

- Part 34 Rope Access (<http://www2.worksafebc.com/Publications/OHSRegulation/Part34.asp>)
- Part 11 Fall Protection (<http://www2.worksafebc.com/Publications/OHSRegulation/Part11.asp>)
- Scaling Operations Sections 20.96 to 20.101 (<http://www2.worksafebc.com/Publications/OHSRegulation/Part20.asp>)

Q19. Rock slope stabilization (rock scaling and rock fall fence) work will be required on Cougar Corner #6. Will it be paid on hourly basis under Prime Lump Sum, or it's incidental to the work?

A19. Rock work slope stabilization is incidental to the Work.

Q20. How will the contractor get paid for removing trees and vegetation within the snow nets boundary? Is it incidental to the work or, it will be paid under prime lump sum?

A20. Removal of trees and vegetation, if required, is incidental to the Work.

Q21. Section 33 42 36 – Sub section 2.3.1 (page 79) “Supply and install rock bolts”: is it incidental to the work or it will be paid under Prime Lump Sum?

A21. If required, the supply and installation of rock bolts will be paid under Prime Cost Sum as reviewed and agreed by the Departmental Representative.

Q22. Given the access constraints of the work, our proven procedure for collecting and testing grout samples is to utilize in house personnel to conduct the grout sample collection, and then provide the samples to an independent CSA certificated laboratory for testing. Please confirm if this is acceptable.

A22. The Contractor may collect, complete site testing and deliver the samples to a Third Party CSA certified laboratory for compressive testing under the supervision of the Departmental Representative.

Q23. What options are there for extension of construction deadline if delays beyond the Contractor's control occur?

A23. This will be reviewed with the Departmental Representative prior to the expiration of the contract term and will be dealt with according to the circumstances.

Q24. What is the nearest site to Cougar Corner that may be leased from Parks Canada to store equipment and materials, and from where a helicopter can land and take off?

A24. Please refer to Addendum 3 and 4.

Q25. Will Parks Canada require a full time environmental monitor on site during the construction?



A25. A full time environmental monitor will not be required so long as the contractor conforms to section 01-35-43, Environmental Procedures.

All other terms and conditions remain the same.
