Please review the following questions and answers:

- Q1. I am concerned about the timeline allowed to complete this work (Mar. 31/16). The location of the work site will be very challenging under normal circumstances but the time of year is of much concern. The project closes on Feb. 9/16 and a delay in awarding will add to the challenges. Please advise what can be done to provide some flexibility in the completion date.
- A1. The contract completion date remains as March 31, 2016. Time is of the essence in this project. The Contractor should refer to the General Condition clause 5.10 in regard to assessments and damages associated with late completion.
- Q2. On drawings, Restoration Notes: Note R4 references “using hand tools” to remove old mortar. Please clarify if a light impact electric chipping hammer can be used.
- A2. A light impact electric chipping hammer is acceptable for removing old mortar. Take additional precautions where necessary, to ensure the existing stone is not damaged.
- Q3. On drawings, General Notes – Restoration: Note 2. Cleaning and removal of dirt and salt ... “hand tools to be used, no water pressure”. Normally, stone is washed/scrubbed and lightly hosed down to remove loose debris. Is this acceptable?
- A3. A washing/scrubbing and light hose down to remove loose debris/dirt/salt, will be acceptable. Take additional precautions where necessary, to ensure the existing stone is not damaged.
