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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Security Requirement

There is no security requirement associated with this bid solicitation.

1.2 Requirement

Justice Canada has a requirement for the supply and installation of one (1) Security screening X-ray device (SSXD) with maintenance and service support, system software, training and manuals as detailed under "Annex A": Technical Specifications. It is estimated that the life cycle of the new equipment will be seven (7) years. The bidder is expected to carry parts and maintain maintenance and support of the unit for the entire life cycle.

1.2.1 Optional Requirement (Removal, Move and Installation)

The Contractor grants to Canada the irrevocable option of the removal, move and the reinstall and applicable re-certification of the current SSXD system from the 275 Sparks Street, Ottawa, ON. Location to 1770 Pink Road, Gatineau, QC.

1.2.2 Optional Requirement (Baggage Roller Table)

The Contractor grants to Canada the irrevocable option to purchase a baggage roller table to fit the SSXD unit to be delivered to the 275 Sparks location. The contractor must offer the different baggage roller(s) available including the height, width and depths and be fully compatible with the proposed SSXD system. The price of any baggage roller must include the installation of the table to the SSXD system.

1.2.3 Optional Requirement (Maintenance and Support Service Agreement)

The Contractor grants to Canada the irrevocable option to extend maintenance and support services agreement for up to five (5) additional one (1) year periods after the initial two (2) year mandatory warranty period. The contractor must submit with the bid, the cost of the annual maintenance and support services as described in Part 3 section 3.1.3.

1.2.4 Optional Requirement (Software Upgrades)

The Contractor grants to Canada the irrevocable option to extend the software upgrades for up to five (5) additional one (1) year periods after the initial two (2) year mandatory warranty period. The contractor must submit with the bid, the cost of the annual software upgrades as described in Part 3 section 3.1.7.

1.2.5 Optional Requirement (Recommended Spare Parts)

The Contractor grants to Canada the irrevocable option to purchase recommended spare parts under the same terms and conditions for a fixed period of five (5) years at the prices stated in the contract.

1.2.6 Optional Requirement (Training)

The Contractor grants to Canada the irrevocable option to purchase one (1) additional training session every year for the next 6 years (year 2 to 7). The contractor must submit with the bid, the cost per training session as described in Part 3 section 3.1.2.

1.3 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

1.4 Trade Agreements

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

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2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than ten (10) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the questions or may request that the Bidder do so, so that

the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in the province of Ontario, Canada.

The Bidder may, at its discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of its choice without affecting the validity of its bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of its choice. PART 3 - BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Bid Preparation Instructions

3.1.2 Operator Training Course (OTC)

On-site Operator Training (Ottawa, Ontario) must be provided in both official language of Canada (English and French) for up to 8 users. All costs associated with the on-site training (included travel and living of the trainer) must be included in the firm lot price.

The Contractor must provide an Operator Training Course at the 275 Sparks street location. The training course must be a "Train the Trainer" type program for the operators. The course must cover the following: X-Ray (SSXD) system operation functions, safety requirements, routine maintenance (including cleaning), troubleshooting, hardware maintenance procedures and software usage. The course must also provide Threat visual training for the operators using a variety of present day threat examples.

Upon completion of the course the Contractor must provide, to the Technical Authority, all of the operator's course training material, including Instructors notes, Lesson Plans, Slides (Power Point Format), Student guide, Training Material, and Test and Verification questions sufficient for Justice to conduct follow-on training. An operator manual must be provided to each participant.

3.1.2.1 Course Training Plan (CTP) and Course Training Schedule (CTS)

The Contractor must provide a Course Training Schedule (CTS) and a Course Training Plan (CTP) as per below to the Technical Authority.

Furthermore, the Contractor must provide the Technical Authority with a copy of the Operators training material to be reviewed and approved by Director General Nuclear Safety (DGNS) for content and mandatory radiation awareness training. This hard-copy document must be provided to the Technical Authority in Microsoft Word format 2010 or PDF and on a CD-ROM or USB key. The Course Training Plan (CTP) must include but not limited to:

- a) An overview of the training;
- b) A training schedule in matrix format that must cover each of the training days and must indicate the length of the lessons;
- c) The proposed evaluation process by which all aspects of training must be evaluated; and
- d) Facility requirements to run the courses.

The Contractor must provide the Technical Authority with the above information ten (10) working days prior the training session date. The TA will review the CTS/CTP and if necessary provide

written comments within five (5) working days of receipt. The Contractor must revise and amend the CTP/CTS to incorporate the TA's comments, where appropriate within five (5) working days of receipt.

The exact date, time and location of the training will be mutually agreed upon between the Contractor and the Technical Authority stated herein.

3.1.3 Maintenance and support services

Maintenance and support services must be included in the firm lot price of the system and must be covered during the warranty period of no less than 2 years. The bidder must include the additional number of years (if any) where the maintenance and support services would be offered at no charge.

The Contracting Authority may exercise the option at any time before the expiry of the Contract by sending a written notice to the Contractor.

Maintenance and Support Service Agreement

The Contractor grants to Canada the irrevocable option to extend the maintenance and support services agreement for up to five (5) additional one (1) year periods after the initial two (2) year mandatory warranty period. The contractor must submit with the bid, the cost of the annual maintenance and support services as described in section 6.2.7.

The Contracting Authority may exercise the option thirty (30) days before the expiration of the original two (2) years warranty by sending a written notice to the Contractor.

Software Upgrades

The Contractor grants to Canada the irrevocable option to extend the software upgrades for up to five (5) additional one (1) year periods after the initial two (2) year mandatory warranty period. The contractor must submit with the bid, the cost of the annual software upgrades as described in section 6.2.6.

The Contracting Authority may exercise the option thirty (30) days before the expiration of the original two (2) years software upgrades by sending a written notice to the Contractor.

Recommended Spare Parts

The Contractor grants to Canada the irrevocable option to purchase recommended spare parts under the same terms and conditions for a fixed period of five (5) years at the prices stated in the contract.

The Contracting Authority may exercise the option thirty (30) days before the expiration of the original two (2) years warranty by sending a written notice to the Contractor.

Training

The Contractor grants to Canada the irrevocable option to purchase one (1) additional training session every year for the next 6 years (year 2 to 7). The contractor must submit with the bid, the cost per training session as described in section 6.2.5.

The Contracting Authority may exercise the option at any time before the expiry of the Contract by sending a written notice to the Contractor.

6.2.3 Installation

On-site installation of the new SSXD to the 275 Sparks location must be provided and be carried out by a qualified service technician and must be scheduled within five (5) calendar days of delivery and be synchronized with the move of the actual SSXD unit to the Pink Road location.

6.2.4 Manuals

One (1) complete set (consisting of one hard and one soft copy in MS Word 2010 or PDF format) of the following technical documentation must be provided with the system. Imbedded objects must not be included in electronic documents.

Each complete set must consist of the following items:

- a) Two Operators Manuals in English and two in French for the SSXD;
- b) A Preventive Maintenance Schedule and Corrective Maintenance Procedures in English and French for the SSXD;
- c) Two Technical Maintenance Manuals in English and two in French for the SSXD;
- d) Two copies of the Illustrated Parts Lists of the SSXD in English and two in French;
- e) Two copies (if applicable) of the hazardous components list with their special handling and disposal instructions, one in English and one in French.

In addition, the Justice Technical Authority must be provided with a total of two (2) complete sets.

6.2.5 Operator Training Course (OTC)

On-site Operator Training (Ottawa, Ontario) must be provided either with one (1) French session or one (1) English session or one (1) bilingual session for up to 8 users. All costs associated with the on-site training (included travel and living of the trainer) must be included in the firm lot price.

The Contractor must provide an Operator Training Course at the 275 Sparks street location. The training course must be a "Train the Trainer" type program for the operators. The course must cover the following: X-Ray (SSXD) system operation functions, safety requirements, routine maintenance (including cleaning), troubleshooting, hardware maintenance procedures and software usage. The course must also provide Threat visual training for the operators using a variety of present day threat examples.

Upon completion of the course the Contractor must provide, to the Technical Authority, all of the operator's course training material, including Instructors notes, Lesson Plans, Slides (Power Point Format), Student guide, Training Material, and Test and Verification questions sufficient for Justice to conduct follow-on training. An operator manual must be provided to each participant.

6.2.5.1 Course Training Plan (CTP) and Course Training Schedule (CTS)

The Contractor must provide a Course Training Schedule (CTS) and a Course Training Plan (CTP) as per below to the Technical Authority.

Furthermore, the Contractor must provide the Technical Authority with a copy of the Operators training material to be reviewed and approved by Director General Nuclear Safety (DGNS) for content and mandatory radiation awareness training. This hard-copy document must be provided to the Technical Authority in Microsoft Word format 2010 or PDF and on a CD-ROM or USB key. The Course Training Plan must include but not limited to:

- a) An overview of the training;
- b) A training schedule in matrix format that must cover each of the training days and must indicate the length of the lessons;
- c) The proposed evaluation process by which all aspects of training must be evaluated; and
- d) Facility requirements to run the courses.

The Contractor must provide the Technical Authority with the above information ten (10) working days prior the training session date. The TA will review the CTS/CTP and if necessary provide written comments within five (5) working days of receipt. The Contractor must revise and amend the CTP/CTS to incorporate the TA's comments, where appropriate within five (5) working days of receipt.

The exact date, time and location of the training will be mutually agreed upon between the Contractor and the Technical Authority stated herein.

6.2.6 Software Upgrades

The Bidder must provide all system software, updates and new releases as defined in Annex A, article 3.7 including the Computer Base Training (CBT) article 3.8 and Threat Aid Identification (TAI) software article 3.9, to the purchaser for a period of two (2) years following the acceptance, at no additional cost.

Note: The word "updates" means all enhancements, extensions or other modifications to the software. The word "releases" means enhancements or modifications to the software or new

modules or supplementary modules that function in conjunction with the software, that represent the next generation of software, and which the Contractor has decided to make available to its customers usually for an additional charge.

6.2.7 Maintenance and support services

Maintenance and support services must be included in the firm lot price of the system and must be covered during the warranty period of no less than 2 years. The bidder must include the additional number of months/years (if any) where the maintenance and support services would be offered at no charge.

- 1) The Contractor represents and warrants that, to the best of its knowledge, neither it nor Canada will infringe any third party's intellectual property rights in performing or using the Work, and that Canada will have no obligation to pay royalties of any kind to anyone in connection with the Work.
- 2) If anyone makes a claim against Canada or the Contractor concerning intellectual property infringement or royalties related to the Work, that Party agrees to notify the other Party in writing immediately. If anyone brings a claim against Canada, according to [Department of Justice Act](#), R.S. 1985, c. J-2, the Attorney General of Canada must have the regulation and conduct of all litigation for or against Canada, but the Attorney General may request that the Contractor defend Canada against the claim. In either case, the Contractor agrees to participate fully in the defence and any settlement negotiations and to pay all costs, damages and legal costs incurred or payable as a result of the claim, including the amount of any settlement. Both Parties agree not to settle any claim unless the other Party first approves the settlement in writing.
- 3) The Contractor has no obligation regarding claims that were only made because:
 - (a) Canada modified the Work or part of the Work without the Contractor's consent or used the Work or part of the Work without following a requirement of the Contract; or
 - (b) Canada used the Work or part of the Work with a product that the Contractor did not supply under the Contract (unless that use is described in the Contract or the manufacturer's specifications); or
 - (c) the Contractor used equipment, drawings, specifications or other information supplied to the Contractor by Canada (or by someone authorized by Canada); or
