PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Security Requirement

1.1 Before award of a contract, the following conditions must be met:

3. the Bidder must hold a valid organization security clearance as indicated in Part 6 - Resulting Contract Clauses;
4. the Bidder's proposed individuals requiring access to classified or protected information, assets or sensitive work site(s) must meet the security requirement as indicated in Part 6 - Resulting Contract Clauses;
5. the Bidder must provide the name of all individuals who will require access to classified or protected information, assets or sensitive work sites.

1.2 Bidders are reminded to obtain the required security clearance promptly. Any delay in the award of a contract to allow the successful bidder to obtain the required clearance will be at the entire discretion of the Contracting Authority.

1.3 For additional information on security requirements, bidders should refer to the Industrial Security Program of Public Works and Government Services Canada (<http://ssi-iss.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/index-eng.html>) website.

2. Statement of Work

The Work to be performed is detailed under Annex A of the resulting contract clauses.

3. Revision of Departmental Name

As this bid solicitation is issued by Correctional Service Canada (CSC), any reference to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) or its Minister contained in full text or by reference in any term, condition or clause of this document, or any resulting contract, must be interpreted as a reference to CSC or its Minister.

4. Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

5. Procurement Ombudsman

The Office of the Procurement Ombudsman (OPO) was established by the Government of Canada to provide an independent avenue for suppliers to raise complaints regarding the award of contracts under \$25,000 for goods and under \$100,000 for services. PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

1. Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the [Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions](https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) Manual (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, certifications, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The 2003 (2015-07-03) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

Subsection 1.4 and 1.5 of 2003, Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, do not form part of and not apply to the bid solicitation. All other subsections of '01 Integrity Provisions – Bid', form part of and apply to the bid solicitation.

2. Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Correctional Service of Canada (CSC) by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

Due to the nature of the bid solicitation, bids transmitted by facsimile or email to CSC will not be accepted.

3. Enquiries – Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 5 business days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all bidders may not be answered by Canada.

4. Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Alberta.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the bidders.

PART 3 - BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

1. Bid Preparation Instructions

CSC requests that bidders provide their bid in separately bound sections as follows:

Section I: Technical Bid: **three (3) hard copies**

Section II: Financial Bid: **one (1) hard copy**

Section III: Certifications: **one (1) hard copy**

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

Bidders are requested to submit their Financial Bid in an envelope separate from their technical proposal.

CSC requests that bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their bid:

- i. use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- ii. use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

In April 2006, Canada issued a policy directing federal departments and agencies to take the necessary steps to incorporate environmental considerations into the procurement process [Policy on Green Procurement](http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html) (<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html>). To assist Canada in reaching its objectives, bidders should:

- i. use 8.5 x 11 inch (206 mm x 279 mm) paper containing fibre certified as originating from a sustainably-managed forest and containing minimum 30% recycled content; and
- ii. use an environmentally-preferable format including black and white printing instead of colour printing, printing double sided/duplex, using staples or clips instead of cerlox, duo tangs or binders.

2. Section I: Technical Bid

In their technical bid, bidders should explain and demonstrate how they propose to meet the requirements and how they will carry out the work.

3. Section II: Financial Bid

Bidders must submit their financial bid in accordance with the Basis of Payment detailed in Annex B - Proposed Basis of Payment. The total amount of applicable taxes must be shown separately.

4. Section III: Certifications

PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

1. Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of CSC will evaluate the bids.

1.1 Technical Evaluation

1.1.1 Mandatory Technical Criteria

Proposals will be evaluated to determine if they meet all mandatory requirements outlined in **Annex C – Evaluation Criteria**. Proposals not meeting all mandatory criteria will be declared non-responsive and will be given no further consideration.

1.2 Financial Evaluation

SACC Manual Clause A0220T (2014-06-26), Evaluation of Price - Bid

Proposals containing a financial bid other than the one requested at **Article 3. Section II: Financial Bid** of **PART 3 – BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS** will be declared non-compliant.

2. Basis of Selection

A bid must comply with the requirements of the bid solicitation and meet all mandatory technical evaluation criteria to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for award of a contract.

PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS

Bidders must provide the required certifications and associated information to be awarded a contract.

The certifications provided by bidders to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Canada will declare a bid non-responsive or will declare a contractor in default of carrying out any of its obligations under the Contract if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidders' certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority may render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

1. Certifications Precedent to Contract Award

The certifications listed below should be completed and submitted with the bid, but may be submitted afterwards. If any of these required certifications is not completed and submitted as requested, the Contracting Authority will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to comply with the request of the Contracting Authority and to provide the certifications within the time frame provided will render the bid non-responsive.

1.1 Federal Contractors Program for Employment Equity - Bid Certification

Canada will have the right to declare a bid non-responsive if the Bidder, or any member of the Bidder if the Bidder is a Joint Venture, appears on the "[FCP Limited Eligibility to Bid](http://www.labour.gc.ca/eng/standards_equity/eq/emp/fcp/list/inelig.shtml)" list at the time of contract award.

1.2 Former Public Servant Certification

Contracts awarded to former public servants (FPS) in receipt of a pension or of a lump sum payment must bear the closest public scrutiny, and reflect fairness in the spending of public funds. In order to comply with Treasury Board policies and directives on contracts with FPS, bidders must provide the information required below before contract award. If the answers to the questions and, as applicable, the information required have not been received by the time the evaluation of bids is completed, Canada will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. - (c) a partnership made of former public servants; or
- (d) a sole proprietorship or entity where the affected individual has a controlling or major interest in the entity.

"lump sum payment period" means the period measured in weeks of salary, for which payment has been made to facilitate the transition to retirement or to other employment as a result of the implementation of various programs to reduce the size of the Public Service. The lump sum payment period does not include the period of severance pay, which is measured in a like manner.

"pension" means a pension or annual allowance paid under the *Public Service Superannuation Act* (PSSA), R.S., 1985, c. P-36, and any increases paid pursuant to the *Supplementary Retirement Benefits Act*, R.S., 1985, c. S-24 as it affects the PSSA. It does not include pensions payable pursuant to the *Canadian Forces Superannuation Act*, R.S., 1985, c. C-17, the *Defence Services Pension Continuation Act*, 1970, c. D-3, the *Royal Canadian Mounted Police Pension Continuation Act*, 1970, c. R-10, and the *Royal Canadian Mounted Police Superannuation Act*, R.S., 1985, c. R-11, the *Members of Parliament Retiring Allowances Act*, R.S., 1985, c. M-5, and that portion of pension payable to the *Canada Pension Plan Act*, R.S., 1985, c. C-8.

6.2 Limitation of Expenditure

1. Canada's total liability to the Contractor under the Contract must not exceed \$ _____.
Customs duties are included and Applicable Taxes are extra.

2. No increase in the total liability of Canada or in the price of the Work resulting from any design changes, modifications or interpretations of the Work, will be authorized or paid to the Contractor unless these design changes, modifications or interpretations have been approved, in writing, by the Contracting Authority before their incorporation into the Work. The Contractor must not perform any work or provide any service that would result in Canada's total liability being exceeded before obtaining the written approval of the Contracting Authority. The Contractor must notify the Contracting Authority in writing as to the adequacy of this sum:
 - a. when it is 75 percent committed, or
 - b. four (4) months before the contract expiry date, or
 - c. as soon as the Contractor considers that the contract funds provided are inadequate for the completion of the Work, whichever comes first.

3. If the notification is for inadequate contract funds, the Contractor must provide to the Contracting Authority a written estimate for the additional funds required. Provision of such information by the Contractor does not increase Canada's liability.

- c) the Work delivered has been accepted by Canada.

6.5 Travel and Living Expenses

There are no travel and living expenses associated with the Contract.

7. Invoicing Instructions

- a) The Contractor must submit invoices in accordance with the section entitled "Invoice Submission" of the general conditions. Invoices cannot be submitted until all work identified in the invoice is completed.
- b) Invoices must be distributed as follows:
 - i. One (1) copy must be forwarded to the Project Authority identified under the section entitled "Authorities" of the Contract.

8. Certifications

8.1 Certification of Compliance

The continuous compliance with the certifications provided by the Contractor in its bid and the ongoing cooperation in providing associated information are conditions of the Contract. Certifications are subject to verification by Canada during the entire period of the Contract. If the Contractor does not comply with any certification, fails to provide the associated information, or it is determined that any certification made by the Contractor in its bid is untrue, whether made knowingly or unknowingly, Canada has the right, pursuant to the default provision of the Contract, to terminate the Contract for default.

9. Applicable Laws

The Contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Alberta.

10. Priority of Documents

If there is a discrepancy between the wording of any documents that appear on the list, the wording of the document that first appears on the list has priority over the wording of any document that subsequently appears on the list.

- (a) the Articles of Agreement;
- (b) the General Conditions 2010C (2015-09-03), General Conditions – Services (Medium Complexity);
- (c) Annex A, Statement of Work;
- (d) Annex B, Basis of Payment;
- (e) the Contractor's bid dated _____ (to be inserted at contract award)

11. Termination on Thirty Days Notice

11.1 Canada reserves the right to terminate the Contract at any time in whole or in part by giving thirty (30) calendar days written notice to the Contractor.

11.2 In the event of such termination, Canada will only pay for costs incurred for services rendered and accepted by Canada up to the date of the termination. Despite any other provision of the Contract, there will be no other costs that will be paid to the Contractor as a result of the termination.

12. Insurance

The Contractor is responsible for deciding if insurance coverage is necessary to fulfill its obligation under the Contract and to ensure compliance with any applicable law. Any insurance acquired or maintained by the Contractor is at its own expense and for its own benefit and protection. It does not release the Contractor from or reduce its liability under the Contract.

13. Ownership Control

Where the Contractor will have access to any and all personal and confidential information belonging to Canada, CSC staff or inmates for the performance of the work, the following will apply:

- (a) The Contractor warrants that it is not under ownership control of any non-resident entity (ie. Individual, partnership, joint venture, corporation, limited liability company, parent company, affiliate or other).
- (b) The Contractor shall advise the Minister of any change in ownership control for the duration of the contract.
- (c) The Contractor acknowledges that the Minister has relied on this warranty in entering into this Contract and that, in the event of breach of such warranty, or in the event that the Contractor's ownership control becomes under a non-resident entity, the Minister shall have the right to treat this Contract as being in default and terminate the contract accordingly.
- (d) For the purposes of this clause, a non-resident entity is any individual, partnership, joint venture, corporation, limited liability company, parent company, affiliate or other residing outside of Canada.

14. Closure of Government Facilities

14.1 Contractor personnel are employees of the Contractor and are paid by the Contractor on the basis of services rendered. Where the Contractor or the Contractor's employees are providing services on government premises pursuant to this Contract and the said premises become non accessible due to

evacuation or closure of government facilities, and consequently no Work is being performed as a result of the closure, Canada will not be liable for payment to the Contractor for the period of closure.

14.2 Contractors working at CSC sites should be aware that they may be faced with delay or refusal of entry to certain areas at certain times even if prior arrangements for access may have been made. Contractors are advised to call in advance of travel to ensure that planned access is still available.

15. Tuberculosis Testing

15.1 It is a condition of this contract that the Contractor or any employees of the Contractor who require entry into a Correctional Service of Canada Institution to fulfill the conditions of the contract may, at the sole discretion of the Warden, be required to provide proof of and results of a recent tuberculin test for the purpose of determining their TB infection status.

15.2 Failure to provide proof of and results of a tuberculin test may result in the termination of the contract.

15.3 All costs related to such testing will be at the sole expense of the Contractor.

16. Compliance with CSC Policies

16.1 The Contractor agrees that its officers, servants, agents and subcontractors will comply with all regulations and policies in force at the site where the work covered by this contract is to be performed.

16.2 Unless otherwise provided in the contract, the Contractor shall obtain all permits and hold all certificates and licenses required for the performance of the Work.

16.3 Details on existing CSC policies can be found at: www.csc-scc.gc.ca or any other CSC web page designated for such purpose.

17. Health and Labour Conditions

17.1 In this section, "Public Entity" means the municipal, provincial or federal government body authorized to enforce any laws concerning health and labour applicable to the performance of the Work or any part thereof.

17.2 The Contractor shall comply with all laws concerning health and labour conditions applicable to the performance of the Work or part thereof and shall also require compliance of same by all its subcontractors when applicable.

17.3 The Contractor upon any request for information or inspection dealing with the Work by an authorized representative of a Public Entity shall forthwith notify the Project Authority or Her Majesty.

17.4 Evidence of compliance with laws applicable to the performance of the Work or part thereof by either the Contractor or its subcontractor shall be furnished by the Contractor to the Project Authority or Her Majesty at such time as the Project Authority or Her Majesty may reasonably request."

18. Identification Protocol Responsibilities

The Contractor must ensure that the Contractor and each of its agents, representatives or subcontractors (referred to as Contractor Representatives for the purposes of this clause) comply with the following self-identification requirements:

- 18.1 During the performance of any Work at a Government of Canada site, the Contractor and each Contractor Representative must be clearly identified as such at all times;

20. Contract Administration

The parties understand that the Procurement Ombudsman appointed pursuant to Subsection 22.1(1) of the *Department of Public Works and Government Services Act* will review a complaint filed by the contractor respecting administration of this contract if the requirements of Subsection 22.2(1) of the *Department of Public Works and Government Services Act* and Sections 15 and 16 of the *Procurement Ombudsman Regulations* have been met, and the interpretation and the application of the terms and conditions and the scope of work of this contract are not in dispute. 21. Privacy

- 21.1 The Contractor acknowledges that Canada is bound by the Privacy Act, R.S.C. 1985, c. P-21, with respect to the protection of personal information as defined in that Act. The Contractor shall keep private and confidential any such personal information collected, created or handled by the Contractor under the Contract, and shall not use, copy, disclose, dispose of or destroy such personal information except in accordance with this clause and the delivery provisions of the Contract.
- 21.2 All such personal information is the property of Canada, and the Contractor shall have no right in or to that information. ANNEX A – Statement of Work

Vocational Training – Professional Pet Stylist/Dog Grooming Certification Edmonton Institution For Women

The Correctional Service Canada has a requirement to provide training programs and services that will empower inmates to re enter the workforce following their release from prison, in keeping with the philosophy of creating choices to empower the women to make responsible choices upon their release.

1.1 Background:

The Edmonton Institution for Women (EIFW) is a Multi-Level Security Institution located in Edmonton Alberta. The Institution houses approximately 167 women offenders; with the largest percentage of aboriginal ancestry. In order to have sense of control over their lives, women offenders need viable options which allow them to make meaningful choices. These choices must relate to their needs and must make sense in terms of their capacities and efforts to successfully reintegrate. By doing so, this leads to increased self-esteem, employability and empowerment.

1.2 Objectives:

To facilitate successful rehabilitation of women offenders and to increase their opportunities for early release, viable employment and successful reintegration into society it is necessary to design and deliver vocational training programs with specific content for women. Community organizations and individuals are best equipped to design and implement such vocational training programs. The contract will be for one session with the option of up to three more sessions.

1.3 Tasks:

- a. The Contractor will deliver licensed Professional Pet Stylist / Dog Groomer training program to federally sentenced women at the Edmonton Institution for Women based on a minimum shift defined as 3.75 hours up to a maximum of 7.5 hours daily, a minimum of 5 days per week as determined by the contractor and the project authority. The contractor will be required to work days from 0800 to 1600 as required. Each training session is to be delivered over a period of 12 weeks (minimum) to a 16 week (maximum), totaling a maximum of 480 hours for the course. Scheduled hours of program are agreed upon with the Contractor and the Project Authority.
- b. The Contractor must plan, coordinate and facilitate training to women offenders related to certification as a Professional Pet Stylist/Dog Groomer. The course will be specifically designed to take students who have little or no experience and provide the skills necessary to become a certified Professional Pet Stylist.
- c. The Contractor must provide a kit to each participant and enough business knowledge to gain entry to this trade as an independent small business or as an employee at any respected pet grooming outlet/business.
- d. The Contractor must provide support to individuals and groups on issues that impact their ability to gain employment in the trade as a Professional Pet Stylist/Dog Groomer, gain further experience and develop as a business provider.
- e. The Contractor must perform security duties by conducting daily checks of all equipment required for training sessions.
- f. The Contractor must establish and maintain a positive and healthy environment with offenders. This requires open and frank dialogue with offenders on progress, attitudes, behaviors, and engaging in pro-social behaviors and participation.

- g. The Contractor must maintain inventory of all equipment in the area required for the training sessions.
- h. The Contractor will be responsible for monitoring all offender participation and interaction with staff who facilitate the vocational training program and the documentation of issues or concerns.

1.4 Deliverables:

Correctional Service of Canada, Edmonton Institution for Women **will provide:**

- 1. Selection of participants.
- 2. Training facilities including classroom and all required large equipment such as Booster Baths, hydraulic or grooming tables, dryers, kennels, shampoos.
- 3. Lockable storage space for contractor's equipment required for the training will be provided for the duration of the training session if required.

The dogs that will be groomed will be provided by the community or the contractor. Arrangements to ensure there are dogs available and present at the institution as necessary, will be made by the Contractor. Dogs will be kenneled prior to and following the grooming session. Delivery and pick up to and from the site is the responsibility of the pet owner or the contractor, if the dog was provided by them. In the event that a dog is abandoned by the owner, the project authority will contact animal foster, rescue or humane organizations for pick up. Food, medications and other special requirements are the responsibility of the owner. The dogs must be leashed or kenneled at all times, other than portions of the grooming session in the secure space.

The dogs must meet the mandatory requirements: proof of up to date immunizations and Veterinary health check. Documentation may be requested by project authority prior to entrance of the institution.

- a. The Contractor must meet with the project authority at the end of each week to discuss the progress of each offender.
- b. The Contractor must ensure that graduates are confident as a finishing groomer and able to obtain full time employment as a Professional Pet Stylist / Dog Groomer.
- c. The Contractor must ensure that the graduates have a working knowledge of Canadian Kennel Club classifications (i.e. pure bred dogs and breed clips, including various specialized techniques), canine anatomy, common parasites, handling techniques and pet first aid.
- d. The Contractor must ensure that the students become members of the Canadian Professional Pet Stylists (www.canpropetstylists.com) organization upon enrollment.
- e. The Contractor will give students as much hands on practical experience as possible in order to be a confident, successful groomer.
- f. The Contractor must ensure all Graduates are certified as a Professional Pet Stylist, certified in canine first aid and are members of the Canadian Professional Pet Stylists with a level 1 (CCST) Canadian Canine Stylist Certification.
- g. The Contractor must ensure Graduates are fully prepared to obtain full time employment as a full time, entry level, finishing groomer anywhere in the industry (i.e. established grooming shops, pet stores, veterinarian practices, doggy day care, boarding kennels, etc.); or can confidently start their own business with an ability to provide quality work and excellent customer service.

Course elements will include:

- Equipment (options, maintenance etc.)
- Basic canine handling and behavior
- Groom shop safety
- CKC classification of pure breed dogs
- Most common cross breeds
- Canine first aide
- Common parasites
- Basic canine anatomy including skin and hair
- Salon basics – cleaning and organization
- Salon safety – including equipment use
- Grooming product information – what to use, why and when
- Bathing, drying, nail trimming and ear cleaning
- Common pet grooming styles
- Pattern setting for breed standard grooming
- Scissoring/Clipping technique
- Client/ groomer communication
- Record keeping
- Graduation options
