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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Introduction

The Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) is divided into six parts plus attachments and annexes, as follows:

- Part 1 General Information: provides a general description of the requirement;
- Part 2 Offeror Instructions: provides the instructions applicable to the clauses and conditions of the RFSO;
- Part 3 Offer Preparation Instructions: provides Offerors with instructions on how to prepare their offer to address the evaluation criteria specified;
- Part 4 Evaluation Procedures and Basis of Selection: indicates how the evaluation will be conducted, the evaluation criteria which must be addressed in the offer, and the basis of selection;
- Part 5 Certifications and Additional Information: includes the certifications and additional information to be provided;
- Part 6 6A, Standing Offer, and 6B, Resulting Contract Clauses:

 6A, includes the Standing Offer containing the offer from the Offeror and the applicable clauses and conditions;

 6B, includes the clauses and conditions which will apply to any contract resulting from a call-up made pursuant to the Standing Offer.

The Annexes include the Requirement, the Basis of Payment, the Electronic Payment Instruments, and any other annexes.

1.2 Summary

- 1.2.1 For the rental of ATV's and Gator Style Mules, without operators, and ATV Trailers to supplement the DND fleet as required by the Department of National Defence Suffield, Wainwright, and Edmonton, located in Medicine Hat, Alberta, Denwood, Alberta, and Edmonton, Alberta. The period of Standing Offer is from January 1, 2017 to December 31, 2019.
- 1.2.2 The requirement is subject to the provisions of the World Trade Organization Agreement on Government Procurement (WTO-AGP), the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), and the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT).

1.3 Debriefings

Offerors may request a debriefing on the results of the request for standing offers process. Offerors should make the request to the Standing Offer Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the request for standing offers process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

PART 2 - OFFEROR INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) by number, date and title are set out in the [Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual](https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Offerors who submit an offer agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the RFSO and accept the clauses and conditions of the Standing Offer and resulting contract(s).

The [2006](#) (2016-04-04) Standard Instructions - Request for Standing Offers - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the RFSO.

2.2 Submission of Offers

Offers must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the Request for Standing Offers.

2.3 Enquiries - Request for Standing Offers

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Standing Offer Authority no later than 10 calendar days before the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Offerors should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the RFSO to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Offerors to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that Offerors do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Offerors. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Offerors may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

The Standing Offer and any contract resulting from the Standing Offer must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Alberta.

Offerors may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their offer, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Offerors.

PART 3 - OFFER PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Offer Preparation Instructions

Canada requests that Offerors provide their offer in separately bound sections as follows:

Prices must appear in the financial offer only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the offer.

Canada requests that Offerors follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their offer.

- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to that of the Request for Standing Offers.

Offerors must submit their financial offer in accordance with the Annex B, Basis of Payment. The total amount of Applicable Taxes must be shown separately.

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the offers.

4.1.2.1 The total aggregate bid price will be calculated by multiplying the firm unit price of each line item by the estimated usage per year.

The calculation will be applied to each year of pricing and all periods will be totalled to determine the total evaluated aggregated bid price.

4.2 Basis of Selection

An offer must comply with the requirements of the Request for Standing Offers to be declared responsive. The responsive offer with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for issuance of a standing offer.

PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Offerors must provide the required certifications and additional information to be issued a standing offer.

The certifications provided by Offerors to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare an offer non-responsive, will have the right to set-aside a standing offer, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Offeror is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly during the offer evaluation period, during the Standing Offer period, or during the contract period.

The Standing Offer Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Offeror's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Standing Offer Authority will render the offer non-responsive, result in the setting aside of the Standing Offer or constitute a default under the Contract.

5.1 Certifications Required with the Offer

REQUIREMENT

Regional Individual Standing Offer (RISO) for the rental of ATVs and Gator Style Mules, without operators, and ATV trailers to supplement the DND fleet as required by the Department of National Defence Suffield, Wainwright and Edmonton, located in Medicine Hat, Alberta, Denwood, Alberta, and Edmonton, Alberta in accordance with the terms and conditions stated herein. The period for making call-ups against the Standing Offer will be from January 1, 2017 to December 31, 2019.

Equipment:

- a. ATV: 350-500cc; 18-25 HP; 4, 6, and 8 wheeled drive
- b. Mule: Gator Style (Bench Seat), 4 x 4
- c. ATV Trailers:
 - i. Tub type (to be towed by an ATV): constructed of polyethylene, single axles.
 - ii. Tow behind type (can be towed by a truck or an ATV): road worthy including licensing and lights; three sizes, capable of transporting 2, 4, and 6 ATVs.

Vehicles must be no older than 3 years and must be well-maintained and in good running order. Fuel and fluid levels will be topped up by the Offeror at the beginning of the rental period. DND will top up fuel and fluid levels prior to return of the ATV units.

Minimum Call-up Requirement:

The Offeror must be able to provide a minimum of four (4) of each type of vehicle within 24 hours of receiving the call-up. The balance of the call-up vehicle must be provided within 5 business days of receiving the call-up.

Delivery:

Units shall be delivered, FOB destination including all delivery and off-loading charges, at the beginning of the rental period, and picked up at the end of the rental period, to/from the locations shown below, unless otherwise stated at the time of the call-up. For other delivery locations, any additional delivery costs will be negotiated at the time of the call-up. The geographic area of coverage for delivery is defined as facilities located within each Canadian Forces Base listed below plus a 25 km radius of the base:

Division of Responsibilities:

Upon delivery, the Project Authority and the Offeror will inspect equipment to check for any exiting damage, check fluid levels, etc. If the equipment is not deemed serviceable, the Project Authority will refuse the units.

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The Offeror is responsible for all maintenance and repair. In the event of faulty equipment/equipment breakdown during the rental period, the Offeror will replace the unit(s) within a time period agreed upon by the DND Project Authority and the Offeror.

At the time of the rental period, the Project Authority and the Offeror will perform an inspection to determine if any damage occurred during the rental period, and to check fluid levels, etc.

The Department of National Defence is responsible for damage incurred by DND personnel.
