#### **Amendment 1**

This amendment is issued to answer questions from potential bidders and to make administrative corrections and additions to the work and specifications.

# A. QUESTIONS

- Q1. We took a look at the rock excavation and disposal sites along the Highway 1 Corridor yesterday afternoon and made an observation that we would like to notify you about. While examining the Sherbrooke Creek rock excavation site, we observed what appeared to be a couple of existing loaded drill holes that may still be live. Can Parks Canada confirm that there are no live holes left by others. Attached are a few pictures from what appear to be live holes.
- A1. The yellow line protruding from the hole is part of the Non-El system. This is a tube that carries a small continuous explosive charge inside a plastic sheathing. There were no reported misfires during the 2015 construction season. The borehole and plastic tube were inspected and the tube was found to be empty and no explosives were found in the hole. Our consultant and the Blaster of Record believe there is not a risk to the public with these observations.
- **Q2**. Who will be responsible for grinding and chipping of the grubbing material within the right-of-way at all the excavation and deposit sites?
- **A2**. The Contractor for this project will be responsible.
- **Q3**. Who will be responsible for grinding and chipping of trees and stumps currently stockpiled at Mount Vaux Storage Site?
- A3. There is no requirement to grind and chip the trees or stumps currently stockpiled at the Mount Vaux Storage Site under this contract.
- Q4. Existing material stockpiles at the Mount Vaux Storage Site and AB/BC Boarder Storage Site are not spaced and segregated per Section 31 23 00 of the Project Specifications. Who will be responsible to adjust the existing stockpiles so that they meet the requirements in Specification Section 31 23 000?
- A4. There is no requirement to segregate the existing material stockpiles at the Mount Vaux Storage Site and AB/BC Border Storage Site under this contract.
- Q5. What is the completion date of tree clearing and tree removal for the excavation and deposit sites?
- **A5**. The estimated completion date for the tree clearing and removal is May 16, 2016.
- **Q6**. Has Parks Canada accepted all work completed to date at Sherbrooke Creek rock excavation site, or is the low bidder responsible for remedial work at that site?
- **A6**. The Contractor should be prepared to undertake remediation work at any location on Sherbrooke Rock Slope as prescribed by the Departmental Representative.
- Q7. Are the fill volumes at both the roadside deposit sites and storage sites as specified on 'Project Overview Map' still current? We request confirmation that all the fill volumes as listed on 'Project Overview Map' can be utilized for storage as part of this work.
- A7. We confirm that the fill volumes at the roadside deposit sites and storage sites as specified on the 'Project Overview Map' are still current and can be utilized for storage as part of this work.
- **Q8.** What is the size and location of culverts that make up the 103M quantity in pay item 11?

.2 Traffic delay times shall be measured and continuously monitored by the Contractor whenever traffic flow is affected by construction activities. Delay time shall be the maximum time elapsed as measured from the back of the approach queue to the resume speed sign.
