

Question 2:

Page 16 of the RFSO states that CMHC will consider only the first three work samples provided for each stream. However, the math in the evaluation tables for the various English streams doesn't seem to add up. It specifies five potential points for each work sample (implying a total 15) but states that there are 30 potential points to be earned overall in the work samples sections. Our question: Should we submit six work samples for up to five points each or will each of three samples be evaluated for up to 10 points?

Response:

Only three work samples should be submitted for each stream. The evaluation points will be applied to the work samples as a group, rather than individually. Only 15 points are available overall in this part of the evaluation. The total points awarded for the "overall quality of work samples" will be multiplied by 30 (the "weight") to arrive at a score. The Offeror must achieve a score of at least 90 (the "upset score") to remain in the evaluation.

A further 15 points are available under the "samples match CMHC requirements" criteria, with a weight of 10.
