For example, to respond to some of the requirements in section 6 (i.e. security requirements, contacts, etc.), should we put it in the technical offer as it is not related to rates or should we have another document for the standing offer?	You may submit it in the technical offer as it is not related to rates.

All other terms and conditions remain unchanged.
