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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Requirement

Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada (AAFC) has a requirement for the provision of Philips GreenPower Light Emitting Diode (LED) Toplighting fixtures that have identical characteristics to fixtures currently in use supporting the Greenhouse Research Program at the Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada, Harrow Research and Development Centre. AAFC is using limited tendering procedures, as allowed under the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) Article 1016.2 (b) and (d) and the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT) Article 506, paragraph 12.(a) and 12.(b), to meet the requirement.

Delivery is required by 2016-01-31.

The requirement is detailed under Article 6.2 of the resulting contract clauses.

1.2 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

1.3 Trade Agreements

The requirement is subject to the provisions of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) and the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT).

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the *Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual* (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The 2003 (2016-04-04) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

Subsection 5.4 of 2003, Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, is amended as follows:

2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than seven (7) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders

PART 3 - BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Bid Preparation Instructions

Canada requests that Bidders provide their bid in separately bound sections as follows:

Section I: Financial Bid (1 hard copy)

Section II: Certifications (1 hard copy)

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

Canada requests that Bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their bid:

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

In April 2006, Canada issued a policy directing federal departments and agencies to take the necessary steps to incorporate environmental considerations into the procurement process [Policy on Green Procurement](http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html) (<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html>). To assist Canada in reaching its objectives, Bidders should:

- 1) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper containing fibre certified as originating from a sustainably-managed forest and containing minimum 30% recycled content; and
- 2) use an environmentally-preferable format including black and white printing instead of colour printing, printing double sided/duplex, using staples or clips instead of cerlox, duotangs or binders.

Section I: Financial Bid

Bidders must submit their financial bid in accordance with the Basis of Payment. The total amount of Applicable Taxes must be shown separately.

Section II: Certifications

PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

4.1.1 Financial Evaluation

4.1.1.1 Mandatory Financial Criteria

Any bid which fails to meet the following mandatory requirements will be deemed non-responsive and will receive no further consideration:

- a) Bids must not contain any alteration to Annex "B" - Basis of Payment, other than the addition of the Bidder's firm unit pricing for the Items. Bidders must provide unit pricing for all Items.
- b) Bids must not contain any condition or qualification placed upon the bid.
- c) Pricing must be firm in Canadian currency, excluding applicable taxes, and must not be indexed or tied to an escalation factor.

4.1.1.2 Financial Evaluation

For each Item, the Bidder's Unit Price will be multiplied by the Quantity to calculate the Extended Price. The sum of the Extended Price of all Items will be the Bidder's Evaluated Price.

The price of the bid will be evaluated in Canadian dollars, Applicable Taxes excluded, Delivered Duty Paid, Canadian customs duties and excise taxes included.

4.2 Basis of Selection

A bid must comply with all requirements of the bid solicitation to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest Evaluated Price will be recommended for award of a contract.

PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Bidders must provide the required certifications and additional information to be awarded a contract.

The certifications provided by Bidders to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority will render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

5.1 Certifications Required with the Bid

Bidders must submit the following duly completed certifications as part of their bid.

5.1.1 Integrity Provisions - Declaration of Convicted Offences

In accordance with the *Ineligibility and Suspension Policy* (<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ci-if/politique-policy-eng.html>), the Bidder must provide with its bid the required documentation, as applicable, to be given further consideration in the procurement process.

5.2 Certifications Precedent to Contract Award and Additional Information

The certifications and additional information listed below should be submitted with the bid, but may be submitted afterwards. If any of these required certifications or additional information is not completed and submitted as requested, the Contracting Authority will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to provide the certifications or the additional information listed below within the time frame provided will render the bid non-responsive.

5.2.1 Integrity Provisions – Required Documentation

5.2.2 Federal Contractors Program for Employment Equity - Bid Certification

6.6 Payment

6.6.1 Basis of Payment

6.7 Invoicing Instructions

2. Technical Specifications

The Philips GreenPower LED Toplighting fixtures must meet the following Technical Specifications in order to match characteristics of fixtures currently used by the Greenhouse Research Program at the Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada, Harrow Research and Development Centre, Harrow ON.

2.1 Quantity of Fixtures and Type

2.1.1 Supply of 36 fixtures - Deep Red/Blue - Low Blue - GPL Toplighting DR/LB Order code 303818 9290 009 79906. Voltage 200 – 400 Volts, Power Assumption 215 Watts, Output 550 micromoles per second.

2.1.2 Supply of 21 fixtures - Deep Red/Blue-Low Blue-Wide Beam - GPL Toplighting DR/B LB Order code 303834 9290 009 80006. Voltage 200 – 400 Volts, Power Assumption 215 Watts, Output 520 micromoles per second.

2.1.3 Supply of 40 fixtures - Deep Red/Blue-High Blue - GPL Toplighting DR/B HB Order code 303859 9290 009 80206. Voltage 200 – 400 Volts, Power Assumption 200 Watts, Output 520 micromoles per second.

2.2 All fixtures must have photosynthetically active radiation (PAR) efficiency of greater than or equal to 2.4 micromoles per watt second or 2.4 micromoles per joule.
