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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Introduction

The Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) is divided into seven parts plus attachments and annexes, as follows:

- Part 1 General Information: provides a general description of the requirement;
- Part 2 Offeror Instructions: provides the instructions applicable to the clauses and conditions of the RFSO;
- Part 3 Offer Preparation Instructions: provides Offerors with instructions on how to prepare their offer to address the evaluation criteria specified;
- Part 4 Evaluation Procedures and Basis of Selection: indicates how the evaluation will be conducted, the evaluation criteria which must be addressed in the offer, and the basis of selection;
- Part 5 Certifications and Additional Information: includes the certifications and additional information to be provided;
- Part 6 Security Requirements: includes specific requirements that must be addressed by Offerors; and
- Part 7 7A, Standing Offer, and 7B, Resulting Contract Clauses:
 - 7A, includes the Standing Offer containing the offer from the Offeror and the applicable clauses and conditions;
 - 7B, includes the clauses and conditions which will apply to any contract resulting from a call-up made pursuant to the Standing Offer.

The Annexes include the Statement of Work, the Basis of Payment and any other annexes

1.2 Summary

The Department of National Defence, for CFB Esquimalt Properties in Nanoose and Greater Nanaimo, CF Metre, Ranch Point and Nanaimo Military Camp have a requirement for a Regional Standing Offer for snow removal, sanding and salting. . Period of the Standing Offer is 5 years.

It is intended to issue 1 Standing Offer for \$200,000.00 to 1 supplier representing best value to the Crown.

The requirement is subject to the provisions of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), and the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT).

1.3 Security Requirements

There are security requirements associated with the requirement of the Standing Offer. For additional information, see Part 6 - Security Requirements, and Part 7 - Standing Offer and Resulting Contract Clauses. For more information on personnel and organization security screening or security clauses, Offerors should refer to the Industrial Security Program (ISP) of Public Works and Government Services Canada (<http://ssi-iss.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/index-eng.html>) website.

1.4 Debriefings

Offerors may request a debriefing on the results of the request for standing offers process. Offerors should make the request to the Standing Offer Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the request for standing offers process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

PART 2 - OFFEROR INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) by number, date and title are set out in the [Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual](https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Offerors who submit an offer agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the RFSO and accept the clauses and conditions of the Standing Offer and resulting contract(s).

The 2006 (2016-04-04) Standard Instructions - Request for Standing Offers - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the RFSO.

2.2 Submission of Offers

Offers must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the Request for Standing Offers.

2.3 Former Public Servant

Contracts awarded to former public servants (FPS) in receipt of a pension or of a lump sum payment must bear the closest public scrutiny, and reflect fairness in the spending of public funds. In order to comply with Treasury Board policies and directives on contracts awarded to FPS, offerors must provide the information required below before the issuance of a standing offer. If the answer to the questions and, as applicable the information required have not been received by the time the evaluation of offers is completed, Canada will inform the Offeror of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to comply with Canada's request and meet the requirement within the prescribed time frame will render the offer non-responsive.

Definitions

For the purposes of this clause,

"former public servant" is any former member of a department as defined in the [Financial Administration Act](#) R.S., 1985, c. F-11, a former member of the Canadian Armed Forces or a former member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. A former public servant may be:

- a. an individual;
- b. an individual who has incorporated;
- c. a partnership made of former public servants; or
- d. a sole proprietorship or entity where the affected individual has a controlling or major interest in the entity.

"lump sum payment period" means the period measured in weeks of salary, for which payment has been made to facilitate the transition to retirement or to other employment as a result of the implementation of various programs to reduce the size of the Public Service. The lump sum payment period does not include the period of severance pay, which is measured in a like manner.

"pension" means a pension or annual allowance paid under the [Public Service Superannuation Act](#) (PSSA), R.S., 1985, c. P-36, and any increases paid pursuant to the [Supplementary Retirement Benefits Act](#), R.S., 1985, c. S-24 as it affects the PSSA. It does not include pensions payable pursuant to the [Canadian Forces Superannuation Act](#), R.S., 1985, c. C-17, the [Defence Services Pension Continuation Act](#), 1970, c. D-3, the [Royal Canadian Mounted Police Pension Continuation Act](#), 1970, c. R-10, and the [Royal Canadian Mounted Police Superannuation Act](#), R.S., 1985, c. R-11, the [Members of Parliament Retiring Allowances Act](#), R.S. 1985, c. M-5, and that portion of pension payable to the [Canada Pension Plan Act](#), R.S., 1985, c. C-8.

Former Public Servant in Receipt of a Pension

2.4 Enquiries - Request for Standing Offers

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Standing Offer Authority no later than 15 calendar days before the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Offerors should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the RFSO to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Offerors to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that Offerors do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Offerors. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Offerors may not be answered by Canada.

2.5 Applicable Laws

The Standing Offer and any contract resulting from the Standing Offer must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in British Columbia.

Offerors may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their offer, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Offerors.

PART 3 - OFFER PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Offer Preparation Instructions

Canada requests that Offerors provide their offer in separately bound sections as follows:

Section II: Financial Offer (1 hard copies)
Section III: Certifications (1 hard copies)

Prices must appear in the financial offer only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the offer.

Canada requests that Offerors follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their offer.

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to that of the Request for Standing Offers.

In April 2006, Canada issued a policy directing federal departments and agencies to take the necessary steps to incorporate environmental considerations into the procurement process [Policy on Green Procurement](http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html) (<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html>). To assist Canada in reaching its objectives, Offerors should:

- 1) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper containing fibre certified as originating from a sustainably-managed forest and containing minimum 30% recycled content; and
- 2) use an environmentally-preferable format including black and white printing instead of colour printing, printing double sided/duplex, using staples or clips instead of cerlox, duotangs or binders.

Section I: Technical Offer

In their technical offer, Offerors should explain and demonstrate how they propose to meet the requirements and how they will carry out the Work.

3.1.1 List of Proposed Subcontractors

If the bid includes the use of subcontractors, the Bidder agrees, upon request from the Contracting Authority, to provide a list of all subcontractors including a description of the things to be purchased, a description of the work to be performed and the location of the performance of that work. The list should not include the purchase of off-the-shelf items, software and such standard articles and materials as are ordinarily produced by manufacturers in the normal course of business, or the provision of such incidental services as might ordinarily be subcontracted in performing the Work.

Section II: Financial Offer

Offerors must submit their financial offer in accordance with the Annex B, Basis of Payment. The total amount of Applicable Taxes must be shown separately.

3.1.2 Electronic Payment of Invoices - Offer

If you are willing to accept payment of invoices by Electronic Payment Instruments, complete Annex "X" Electronic Payment Instruments, to identify which ones are accepted.

If Annex "D" Electronic Payment Instruments is not completed, it will be considered as if Electronic Payment Instruments are not being accepted for payment of invoices.

Acceptance of Electronic Payment Instruments will not be considered as an evaluation criterion.

Section III: Certifications

Offerors must submit the certifications and additional information required under Part 5.

PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Offers will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the Request for Standing Offers including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the offers.

4.2 Basis of Selection

An offer must comply with the requirements of the Request for Standing Offers to be declared responsive. The responsive offer with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for issuance of a standing offer.

PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Offerors must provide the required certifications and additional information to be issued a standing offer.

The certifications provided by Offerors to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare an offer non-responsive, will have the right to set-aside a standing offer, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Offeror is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly during the offer evaluation period, during the Standing Offer period, or during the contract period.

The Standing Offer Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Offeror's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Standing Offer Authority will render the offer non-responsive, result in the setting aside of the Standing Offer or constitute a default under the Contract.

5.1 Certifications Required with the Offer

Offerors must submit the following duly completed certifications as part of their offer.

5.1.1 Integrity Provisions - Declaration of Convicted Offences

5.2 Certifications Precedent to the Issuance of a Standing Offer and Additional Information

If any of these required certifications or additional information is not completed and submitted as requested, the Standing Offer Authority will inform the Offeror of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to provide the certifications or the additional information listed below within the time frame provided will render the offer non-responsive.

5.2.2 Federal Contractors Program for Employment Equity - Standing Offer Certification

Canadian Forces Base Esquimalt Properties in Greater Nanaimo to include CFMETR Nanoose Base, Nanaimo Military Camp, 600m Nanaimo Range and 4872 Fillinger Crescent.

Expenditure

Bidders understand and agree that any resultant Standing Offers usage is dependent on the weather, which can be unpredictable. While the expenditure is predicated on previous usage, increases or decreases to the required work and therefore the expenditure may be inevitable.

Codes, Standards and Regulations

It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to abide by all codes, standards and regulations which may govern and/or restrict the manner in which the contract is completed.

General Information

Public Works Government Services Canada (PWGSC) documents shall be read in conjunction with this specification and shall apply to and govern all phases of the work.

The Contractor shall conform to all safety regulations and requirements.

Where the word "engineer" appears in these specifications, it shall mean the Base Construction Engineering Officer or his authorized representative.

General Scope of Work

The work under any resulting Standing Offer is outlined and comprises the furnishing of all labour, materials, and equipment required for **Snow Removal, Sanding & Salting** of roads and parking lots as outlined. All areas of CFB Esquimalt within the Nanaimo - Nanoose Detachment area are included. The work in this Standing Offer will be done on an as and when required basis for the period of the Standing Offer.

Work Included

Work covered in this Standing Offer includes but is not necessarily confined to the following:

- Snow clearing of gravelled and paved roads
- Snow clearing of parking lots
- Snow clearing of the approaches to wharves and jetties
- Snow clearing of wharves and jetties
- Supply of dump trucks, operators and labourers to sand and/or salt roads as required

Commencement Notification

During inclement weather, the Engineer shall not be required to give the Contractor notice in advance for ordering equipment to the sites to remove snow.

Under normal conditions, a reasonable advance notice shall be given the Contractor when possible. The Engineer shall give the Contractor written confirmation for each callout.

The Contractor or his operators shall notify the Engineer of their times of starting and finishing each job allotted and materials used. While it is not intended to use Overtime, in the event that it becomes necessary, Overtime charges shall only be permitted if approved and ordered by the Site Authority. The Supplier is signifying his willingness to perform the work on a twenty-four (24) hour day, seven (7) day per

week basis by his submission or a returned Request. Under emergency conditions the Contractor will be expected to respond to a callout within a two (2) hour period.

Local Regulations and Ground Rules

The successful Contractor shall comply with all security regulations and any other ground rules applicable in each area. The Contractor will, when required, also submit a list of names of workers employed on the job, including all sub-trades.

Permits

The Contractor shall obtain all permits applicable to this project, pay all fees therefore, and comply with all Provincial, Municipal, and other legal regulations and by-laws applicable to the work.

Cleanup, Damages, and Coordination

On completion, all roads and aprons shall be left in first class condition to the entire satisfaction of the Engineer.

The Contractor shall be solely responsible for repairing any and all damage he inflicts on any National Defence Canada facility, structure, or utility during the course of his operation.

The Contractor shall be responsible for the satisfactory completion of the work required and shall be solely responsible for the coordination of the work of all sub-contractors, if any. The Contractor alone shall be responsible for defining the exact scope of work of his various sub-contractors and for obtaining the approval of the Engineer for the use of any sub-contractors on this Standing Offer.

Related Drawings

The Engineer holds one set of plans of the area covered in his contract. Viewing of these drawings prior to submission of tender may be arranged via optional site visit.

Materials and Equipment

Equipment "makes" are typical; all pieces of equipment are to be "acceptable" to the Engineer. All equipment used in the contract shall be in "A-1" condition and capable of working continuously as required.

All equipment used shall be adequate in size and capacity to carry out the work as the quantity and condition of snow warrants.

Types of Equipment in Suppliers Inventory for use in the work

- 2 – Bobcats
- 2 – Single axle, 4 wheel drive plow trucks with sand spreader
- 1 – tandem dump truck with heavy equipment trailer
- 1 – 5 ton flat deck for equipment transport

Method of Work

The contractor shall remove snow and apply sand/salt as and when required in those areas designated on the site plans and/or directed by the Engineer.

An "on site" location will be determined for dumping of snow as required.

At the termination of each callout, the Contractor will be required to submit time slips on a daily basis covering all equipment and these slips shall be countersigned by the Engineer.

Method of Measurement for Payment & Hours of Work

Work shall be normally carried out during the regular work hours (0800 to 1600 hrs daily). However, weather may require work to take place other than regular working hours (Overtime).

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Call Out Charges are applicable once for each call out. It is the charges for travel to the site to carry out the work from the locations of the Suppliers location. Travel charges to the site of the work is permitted. However, if the Supplier is already in the area doing other work, no Travel Time charges shall be considered. If the Supplier is already engaged in a closer location, only those charges from that location shall be acceptable.

Hourly rates are based on an all-inclusive fixed amount per hour including the operator/s and the equipment for actual working time on site.

Fuel and operators are to be provided by the Contractor. Equipment on 16 or 24 hour period must have sufficient drivers for each eight (8) hour shift. Overtime rates shall be permitted if work is required outside regular working hours and must be approved and accepted by the Site Authority, in advance.
