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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Statement of Requirement

The requirement is detailed under Article 6.2 of the resulting contract clauses.

1.2 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the *Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual* (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 10 calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Quebec

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

ANNEX A: STATEMENT OF REQUIREMENT

1.0 Object

The National Research Council of Canada (NRC) possesses a unique powder metallurgy platform dedicated to develop and support the Canadian industry. With this purchase, NRC would like to upgrade its park of powder processing equipment facilities by purchasing a larger rotary tube furnace unit to be able to produce sufficient amount of heat treated metallic powders for different industrial projects and facilitate technological transfer to the industry. This system will be used to perform heat or agglomeration treatments of different metallic/ceramic powder mixes that are aimed to be shaped by different powder metallurgy processing technologies.

The NRC wishes to purchase a rotating tube furnace capable of up-scaling successfully the processing of powders previously developed on a laboratory furnace unit. The wanted equipment must not be a prototype.

The work consists of the supply and delivery of the unit at the NRC address, with a detailed document of installation and use. NRC staff will perform the installation of the unit, but the sales and engineering departments of the supplier must be available during this installation for guidance and support through daytime direct phone calls and e-mails.

2.0 Constraints

The space available in our laboratories requires that the rotating tube furnace dimensions, including the mechanical and electrical components respect the maximum following dimensions:

Maximum length: 2000mm
Maximum width: 900mm
Maximum height: 1900mm

The maximum tube length permitted: 2500mm

3.0 Mandatory technical specifications:

- 3.1 Split type clam shell rotating tube furnace to enable faster cooling and easy operation;
- 3.2 Continuous operating temperature of the rotating tube furnace must be as high as 1200°C;
- 3.3 Heating zone length: 45" minimum (1150mm). Three heating zones minimum with one independent controller for each zone to ensure temperature uniformity;
- 3.4 1400C grade refractory lining minimum or equivalent;

3.5 Stainless steel tube having a minimum internal diameter of 8inch (200mm) that must be able to withstand a minimum load of 25kgs at a continuous operating temperature of 1100 deg. Celsius;

3.6 Vacuum and atmosphere sealing plates and rotating joining to allow furnace to be operated under vacuum (10^{-1} torr minimum) or under inert gas pressure up to 5 PSI for the stainless steel tube;

3.7 Ceramic plugs inserted in the tube to maintain the heat treated materials in the heating zone area during rotation;

3.8 Rotary device that can handle the weight of the stainless tube and a minimum of 25 kgs of material and that enables a variable speed up to 10 RPM minimum;

3.09 Tilting device that allows the furnace to be tilted on one side up to 15 degree min.

3.10 Thermocouples – One certified type K thermocouple or equivalent for each heating zone is required with one terminal block for each thermocouple to connect to customer's data logger system or computer to record furnace temperature profiles;

3.11. Programmable Controller, 20 segments program minimum;

3.12 Voltage – 208/240V – Three Phases. Power 25 to 30 KW;

3.13 Optional goods: The following items must be available to be purchased separately and at the same price given in Annex B until March 31, 2018:

3.13.1 Three or four mixing blades/bars that can be installed directly on the interior of the tube to enable homogeneous mixing of the material during rotation of the tube. The mixing blades/bars are to be made from the same type of stainless steel that the one used for the manufacture of the tube that must be able to withstand, as mentioned in 3.5, a minimum load of 25kgs at a continuous operating temperature of 1100 deg. Celsius. These mixing blades/bars must be able to be installed by the NRC and must have therefore a fixation system to be able to fix them on the tube. But they will be delivered alone and fixed on the tube by NRC;

3.13.2 Quartz tube with rotary flanges and sealing plates that allows a quick and easy change of tube by the operator; this item will be installed in the furnace by NRC;

3.13.3 Thermocouple with gas tight sealing fixed inside the stainless steel tube that allows direct temperature reading of the tube and recording during heat treatment for continuous rotating operation at 1100 deg. Celsius; this item will be fixed by the manufacturer on the stainless tube and further be installed in the furnace by NRC;

3.13.4 Oxygen sensor in the tube at the heat treated location that can record oxygen in inert gas and withstand 1200 deg. Celcius; this item will be installed in the furnace by NRC.

4.0 Deliverables:

4.1 The bidder must demonstrate that the proposed equipment, optional goods and parts of the control system are certified as per the Quebec electric code C22.10. The equipment must be CSA/ULC approved upon delivery.

4.2 Technical documentation: The rotating tube furnace must include at least one operating manual in English or French upon delivery of the unit. The equipment must be delivered with detailed documents describing the initial setup and the instructions to operate the furnace.

4.3 Machine start-up and personal training: The supplier must also provide daytime training and guidance at distance (ex: 8:00 to 16:00 for Montreal, phone and e-mail) usually required for start-up and normal operation of the rotating tube furnace (in English or French language).

4.4 The supplier must also provide daytime guidance at distance (in English or French language) if problems of operation are encountered or if furnace modifications are required to optimize our processes.

4.5 In case of parts breakage, replacement parts must be shipped quickly to NRC to prevent any delay in our operations and any prejudice in our industrial contracts. Replacements parts will be sent and received at NRC inside 5 working days when in stock.
