Request for Information (RFI)

The Royal Canadian Navy (RCN) currently operates (12) *Halifax*-class ships and intends to operate them until their predicted end of life in approximately the 2032/36 timeframe. The intention is to establish long-term Work Period Contracts to provide maintenance support services to the modernized *Halifax*-class in order to maintain long term operational capability and seamless transition from the current Multi-ship contracts, while aligning support services with the future naval In-Service Support (ISS).

As the project progresses towards a formal Request for Proposal (RFP), this RFI will provide a continuous single point of official communication with industry. The project will use this RFI process for multiple purposes such as:

- a) Collaborating with industry on the Performance Work Statement, the Performance Requirements Specification, the procurement strategy, the Industrial and Technological Benefits and Value Proposition strategy, relational agreement, basis of payment and bid evaluation.
- b) Ensuring all interested participants receive the same information.
- c) Presenting the draft Pre-qualification process and soliciting comments and feedback.
- d) Presenting draft RFP documents to pre-qualified bidders and soliciting comments and feedback.

This initial RFI release is to:

- a) Request industry feedback on the draft Statement of Objectives and the draft Concept of Support.,. Note the Appendices and Attachments referenced in these draft documents will not be released with this initial RFI.
- b) Request industry feedback on the draft Industrial and Technological Benefits and Value Proposition (ITB/VP) approach.
- c) Request that industry provides answers to the questions listed in Annex 2 using an Excel template provided as an attachment to the RFI.

The information provided by industry may be used to support Canada's decision-making process such as finalizing requirements and determining the procurement strategy.

This RFI is not to be considered as a commitment to issue a subsequent solicitation or to award contract(s) for the work described herein.

Although the information collected may be provided as commercial-in-confidence (and, if identified as such, will be treated accordingly by Canada), Canada may use the information for budgetary purposes and to assist in drafting the Statement of Objectives, the Performance Work Statement, the Performance Requirements Specification, and the ITB/VP approach. 3. Background Information:

The Department of National Defence *Halifax*-class MODERNIZATION (HCM) Program is part of DND's overall Halifax Class Modernization project, whose objective is to ensure the continued operation of the Halifax Class for the remaining duration of its life and its relevance in the expected operational environment. As part of the Halifax Class modernization (HCM) Program, Two (2) multi-ship refit contracts (MSC) were issued which provided the vehicles for the implementation of a wide range of engineering change work, equipment installation, docking work and corrective maintenance activities required under the Frigate Equipment Life Extension project. The Multi-Ship contracts have provided flexibility to address a myriad of issues currently being found on the

Halifax-Class Frigates. The Royal Canadian Navy (RCN) currently operates (12) Halifax-class ships and intends to operate them until their predicted end of life in approximately the 2032/36 timeframe, however the current Multi-Ship contracts will expire in 2018.

4. Requirement:

- 4.1 The Department of National Defence has a requirement to establish two (2) long term, performance based contracts with an initial contract period of four (4) years with options to extend the contracts for a period of up to a total of ten (10) years (2018 to 2028). The options can be one year or multiple year extensions and will be based on contractor performance assessment. The intent of these long-term work period contracts is to provide maintenance support services to the modernized *Halifax*-class in order to maintain long term operational capability and seamless transition from the current Multi-ship contracts, while aligning support services with the naval In-Service Support (ISS).
- 4.2 It is anticipated that the establishment of long-term Work period contracts will facilitate long term planning for all stakeholders, enhance relationship building while evolving contracted services over the in-service life of the *Halifax*-class. It will also provide effective and efficient Ship level maintenance support while containing overall support costs while meeting the Royal Canadian Navy (RCN) readiness requirements, and obtain best value based on demonstrated performance and continuous improvement
- 4.3 In order to effectively support the ships on both coasts, there will be two separate Work Period Contracts East, and West (individually WPC-E & WPC-W) for implementing platform maintenance/sustainment work, implementing Engineering Changes (EC) and Materiel and Technical support services. Ships, and their associated work periods, may be repositioned between coasts to meet operational requirements. Work periods are defined as one of; Docking Work Periods (DWPs); Short Work Periods (SWP) or Engineering Change Work Periods (ECWPs).
- The *Halifax*-class maintenance concept will continue to divide maintenance services into three levels: First (1st) and Second (2nd) Level support will be the primary responsibility of RCN Ships Staff (SS) and FMFs, and Third (3rd) Level support will be primarily provided by the WPC Contractor and some by FMF. However, the WPC Contractor must have the capacity and capability to augment RCN Level One and Two support when requested, and conversely, FMF & SS may assist the WPC Contractor to conduct Level Three maintenance.
