## **PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION**

### **1.1 Requirement**

The requirement is detailed under Article 6.2 of the resulting contract clauses.

### **1.2 Debriefings**

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

### **1.3 Trade Agreements**

The requirement is subject to the provisions of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), and the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT).

## **PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS**

### **2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions**

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the *Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual* (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

### **2.2 Submission of Bids**

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

### **2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation**

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 10 calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

### **2.4 Applicable Laws**

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Quebec.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

Canada requests that Bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their bid:

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

To assist Canada in reaching its objectives, Bidders should:

- 2) use an environmentally-preferable format including black and white printing instead of colour printing, printing double sided/duplex, using staples or clips instead of cerlox, duotangs or binders.

In their technical bid, Bidders should explain and demonstrate how they propose to meet the requirements and how they will carry out the Work. Bidders should fill out the table of mandatory technical evaluation criteria at section **4.1.1.1 – Mandatory Technical Evaluation Criteria**. Bidders should also complete **Annex C – Addition Information on the Proposed Product**.

## PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

### 4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

#### 4.1.1 Technical Evaluation

##### 4.1.1.1 Mandatory Technical Evaluation Criteria

The bidder must include with its proposal the datasheets of the products offered. A "Datasheet" is defined as a technical document, for examples a brochure and/or technical literature and/or drawing and/or a test report. The document must provide detailed information on each performance requirement and/or specification.

Although the bidders must propose products that meet all the specifications described at section A.6 Deliverables of Annex A - Requirement, at the closure date, bids will be evaluated on the following technical requirements at section 4.1.1.1 – Mandatory Technical Evaluation Criteria.

The bidder should indicate, for each mandatory criteria, whether the proposed equipment complies or not by checking the relevant box. The bidder must clearly demonstrate how the proposed equipment complies to each mandatory technical evaluation criteria listed at section 4.1.1.1 – Mandatory Technical Evaluation Criteria. Simply stating that the criteria are met is not sufficient. Where it is necessary to refer to other documentation that is included in the proposal, bidders should include the precise location of the reference material including the title of the document, and the page and paragraph numbers. It is the bidder's responsibility to provide enough details to permit a complete evaluation.

Any proposal that does not clearly demonstrate compliance with each of the technical requirements listed in the "Mandatory Technical Evaluation Criteria" table (section 4.1.1.1) will be considered non-responsive.

#### **4.2 Basis of Selection – Mandatory Technical Criteria**

A bid must comply with the requirements of the bid solicitation and meet all mandatory technical evaluation criteria to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for award of a contract.

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## PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Bidders must provide the required certifications and additional information to be awarded a contract.

The certifications provided by Bidders to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority will render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

### 5.1 Certifications Required with the Bid

## **ANNEX A - REQUIREMENT**

### **A.1 Title**

Instrumented buoy for wave measurement

### **A.2 Introduction**

The Hydraulic Engineering (HE) Sector of the Coast Guard's Integrated Technical Services, Fisheries and Oceans Canada, must carry out the purchase and delivery of an instrumented buoy for wave measurement.

### **A.3 Background**

Waves can cause damage to coastal infrastructure, whether they are produced by the wind or by vessels. For any given sector, solid information on waves is helpful in properly designing new structures or better adapting damaged structures. The acquisition of a new instrumented buoy for wave measurement will allow waves to be studied in detail (frequency, amplitude, etc.).

So far, the HE sector has characterized waves using a wave staff or a pressure sensor. Though this generally produces good results, the wave staff can only be installed in shallow water and for very short periods. It also requires constant supervision. The pressure sensor measures levels well, but its fairly slow reaction time leads to a lack of precision in wave height measurements. Neither of these instruments can measure wave direction, either. An instrumented buoy for wave measurement is therefore the preferred option for effective wave characterization.

### **A.4 Objective**

The project's objective is to acquire an instrumented buoy for wave measurement in order to quantify the height and direction of waves caused by wind and vessels.

The HE sector wants to use the buoy for any navigable watercourse in Canada's federal jurisdiction.

### **A.5 Needs**

The Contractor shall provide a wave recording buoy according to the criteria listed in section A.6, "Deliverables." If software unique to the product is required for data collection and processing and the buoy's parameterization, the Contractor shall provide that software in compliance with the criteria listed in section A.6, "Deliverables." Finally, the Contractor shall offer technical support by email for a period of one year according to the criteria listed in section A.6, "Deliverables."

## A.6 Deliverables

The Contractor shall provide the following deliverables. The deliverables shall meet the minimum technical requirements listed below.

Deliverables and minimum technical requirements:
<b>1. Instrumented buoy for wave measurement</b>
1.1. Maximum diameter of buoy: 0.9 metres
1.2. Maximum weight of buoy (including batteries): 70 kg
1.3. Wave height measurement: Period of 1.5 to 30 seconds
1.4. Wave direction measurement: 0–360°
1.5. A flashing light shall be installed on the buoy.
1.6. The buoy shall be operational in both freshwater and salt water.
1.7. The buoy shall include an adjustable anchorage system that can be deployed at a depth of 4 to 60 metres.
1.8. The integrated battery's lifespan shall allow the buoy to remain operational in the field for a period of at least 1 month.
1.9. The data recording capacity shall be sufficient for a period of at least 3 months.
1.10. It shall be possible for Fisheries and Oceans Canada employees to deploy the buoy from a boat, and it shall not require the use of machinery (e.g. a winch).
1.11. Operating temperature: 2 to 30° C

<b>Deliverables and minimum technical requirements:</b>
<b>2. Software unique to the product (if necessary) for data processing and parameterization of the buoy</b>
2.1. The software shall allow the processing of collected data and the parameterization of the buoy.
2.2. The software shall be compatible with Windows 10.
<b>3. Accessories (if necessary)</b>
3.1. If data transfer material (example: a USB cable) is required to download the buoy's recorded data, the Contractor shall provide this material.
3.2. If separate data storage device (example: a memory card) is required for recording data, the Contractor shall supply this device. The data storage device shall meet criteria 1.9.
3.3. If the buoy runs on a rechargeable battery, the Contractor shall provide the battery charger.
3.4. If other accessories are required for a complete operational use of the buoy, the Contractor shall provide those.
<b>4. Technical support</b>
4.1. The Contractor shall provide technical support by email as necessary for a period of one year, in French and/or English. The Contractor must provide this technical support no later than two working days following a request.
4.2. The technical support offered shall cover a minimum of the following areas: calibration of the buoy, start-up of the buoy, buoy data collection and recovery, and problems encountered while using the buoy.
