PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Requirement

The Department of National Defence (DND) has a requirement for two (2), four-post vehicle lifts and as per Annex A - Requirement. The primary function of the Vehicle Lift is to allow heavy duty vehicles to be lifted off the ground to provide access to personnel inspect and perform maintenance.

1.2 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

1.3 Trade Agreements

The requirement is subject to the provisions of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), and the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT).

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the *Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual* (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The 2003 (2016-04-04) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 10 calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

PART 3 - BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Bid Preparation Instructions

Canada requests that Bidders provide their bid in separately bound sections as follows:

Section I: Financial Bid (1 hard copy)

Section II: Certifications (1 hard copy)

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

Canada requests that Bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their bid:

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

Bidders must submit their financial bid in accordance with the Basis of Payment. The total amount of Applicable Taxes must be shown separately.

- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

4.1.2 Financial Evaluation

To be responsive the Bidder must:

- 1) Provide a Firm Unit price for all items listed in Annex A – Basis of Payment.
- 2) Not alter the format of the Basis of Payment in Annex A.

The Bidder's Firm Unit Price will be multiplied by the quantity to calculate the extended firm Unit Pricing.

PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Bidders must provide the required certifications and additional information to be awarded a contract.

Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority will render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

5.1 Certifications Required with the Bid

Bidders must submit the following duly completed certifications as part of their bid.

ANNEX "A"

REQUIREMENT

1.0 OBJECTIVE

The Department of National Defence (DND) has a requirement for two (2) four-post vehicle lifts. This document is to outline the general and specific requirements for the purchase and installation.

2.0 BACKGROUND

The primary function of the Vehicle Lift is to allow heavy duty vehicles to be lifted off the ground to provide access to personnel inspect and perform maintenance.

3.0 CERTIFICATIONS

3.1 The Vehicle Lift must meet the following standards:

- 3.1.1 American National Standards Institute (ANSI);
- 3.1.2 Intertek ETL Listed; or
- 3.1.3 Automotive Lift Institute (ATI); and
- 3.1.4 Canadian Standards Association (CSA)

4.0 MINIMUM MANDATORY TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

4.1 DIMENSIONS

- 4.1.1 Overall length must be 350 inches to a maximum of 400 inches;
- 4.1.2 Overall width must be 144 inches to a maximum of 156 inches;
- 4.1.3 Length between posts must be 290 inches to a maximum of 320 inches;
- 4.1.4 Width between posts must be 130 inches to a maximum of 156 inches;
- 4.1.5 Height of posts including hydraulic cylinders must be 140 inches to a maximum of 180 inches;
- 4.1.6 Lift travel must be 66 inches to a maximum of 84 inches;
- 4.1.7 The runway dimensions must be a width of 24 inches to a maximum of 30 inches;
- 4.1.8 The runway must have an adjustable width between each ranging from 42 inches to 52 inches; and
- 4.1.9 The approach ramp length must be 40 inches to 60 inches.

4.2 DESIGN

- 4.2.1 Must be a four corner post;
- 4.2.2 Must be installed above ground with one hydraulic cylinder per corner;
- 4.2.3 Must have an automatic locking system integrated into each column;
- 4.2.4 Must have a single point air release;
- 4.2.5 Air supply must be incorporated into runways;
- 4.2.6 Approach ramp must double as wheel stops during lift operations;
- 4.2.7 Must have hydraulic synchronising;

- 4.2.8 Must be equipped with level sensors; and
- 4.2.9 Must include two (2) minimum 10,000 lbs to a maximum of 20,000 lbs air/hydraulic rolling bridge jacks with safety locks in the raised position.

4.3 CAPACITY

- 4.3.1 Must be capable of lifting a minimum of 20,000lbs to a maximum of 30,000 lbs.

4.4 ELECTRICAL POWER

- 4.4.1 Motors must be a minimum for 2HP, 1PH, 230V

5.0 DELIVERY REQUIREMENT

- 5.1 The delivery and installation must be completed no later than March 31, 2017.
- 5.2 Delivery and Installation to be performed located at CFB Trenton, Astra, ON.

6.0 INSTALLATION AND INSPECTION

- 6.1 The vehicle lift will be installed on the existing concrete floor by the contractor. The contractor is responsible for the installation and set of the lift so that it is ready to operate once the electrical connection has been completed by DND. The supplier must complete this installation work between 7:30 am to 3:30 pm EST on week days.

7.0 WARRANTY AND MAINTENANCE

- 7.1 The warranty will be twenty-four (24) months after installation and inspection of the equipment, or the length of the Contractor's or manufacturer standard warranty period, whichever is longer. All costs related to warranty work must be included in price, non-warranty maintenance and after sales service are to be charged separately.
- 7.2 Service/warranty and regular maintenance work must be performed within a 250km radius of the delivery point, by an authorised dealer and/or agent. The service must begin within 48 hours of notification. The authorised representative must have ready access to regular maintenance and service parts and be able to access all parts not normally stocked from an authorised parts dealer.

8.0 DOCUMENTATION

- 8.1 The Contractor must provide the following documentation in English:
 - 8.1.1 Operator's manual; two (2) paper copies and a electronic copy
 - 8.1.2 Warranty letter; and
 - 8.1.3 All inspection reports and certifications of all mechanical, physical and hydraulic systems.

9.0 TRAINING

- 9.1 Training must be delivered in English, by instructors certified on the operation of this particular equipment. The training in the operation of the unit must be to the level of knowledge, skills and ability that, when, applied will allow personnel to operate and maintain the unit safely and in the manner intended by the manufacturer. Any resource

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material required for this training, other than the Operators, Service/Parts manuals delivered as part of the unit must be provided to the trainees.

- 9.1.1 Minimum one (1) day operator training for up to ten (10) people;
- 9.1.2 Training must be completed no later than five (5) working days after the installation and on a mutually agreed upon date between the TA and the contractor
